Our meetings were followed by interesting social sessions with a new committee each month. These committees did an outstanding job. They provided lots of goodies and pretty table decorations and lots and lots of fun.

We are pleased with the progress being made in making our Lodge hall more attractive. The Odd Fellows have installed new kitchen cupboards and paneling; installed a new screen door on the front door and put in a new ceiling in the hall where you enter the building, painted the hall and painted the steps. These renovations have been great improvements.

The Odd Fellows are planning to serve the local Shrine Club a chicken Bar-B-Q in the next few weeks. They have been active in serving the community and will continue to do so.

Sister Jane Schmeig has served the past two years as District Deputy President and we are most proud of her. Sisters from Wysox served as her installing staff and expressed their esteem for her recently when they presented her with a District Deputy Jewel. During our spring banquet I presented all Past Noble Grands with a small token given when each were honored for their service.

I felt that our accomplishments should be recognized and therefore, I have prepared this small article for publication to thank all and extend appreciation for their untiring efforts which brought about our progress and success.

FROM THE DESK OF THE GRAND SECRETARY

By the time that this article comes to you the Annual Sovereign Grand Lodge Sessions in Winnipeg will be past and will be recorded in the History of the Sovereign Grand Lodge. And, as we here in Pennsylvania begin another year in our Lodges, it should be the responsibility of every Odd Fellow and Rebekah to pitch in and do our share in building the Membership and the Order in Pennsylvania.

One of the first things that every Odd Fellow and Rebekah Lodge should do is to review the By-Laws of their respective Lodges, and take steps to update them. A number of the Lodges in this Jurisdiction are working under By-Laws that are so out of date that it isn't even funny.

One of the first things that we should do under By-Laws is to make sure that we are charging enough Dues in order to guarantee that our Lodges have sufficient funds with which to operate the Lodge in a satisfactory manner for the benefit of all members. Don't forget that the Sovereign Grand Lodge mandated a few years ago that the minimum dues for the Rebekahs are \$8.00 per year, and for the Odd Fellows it is \$10.00 per year. Then, all Taxes and Assessments as levied by the Rebekah Assembly and the Grand Lodge should be charged in addition to the above mentioned dues. This is the only way that a lot of our Lodges can operate in a proper and respective manner.

I know that we are going to hear that old alibi that the members are on a fixed or limited income, and, that they cannot afford to pay any more money in dues. This excuse is getting rather stale and rusty. There is nothing in the laws of this Order that requires any member to pay their dues in one lump sum. You can pay whatever amount that you can afford on a weekly, semi monthly, monthly, quarterly, or whatever way it is best for the individual to pay. If the dues plus the Taxes in an Odd Fellow or Rebekah Lodge would be \$20.00 per year, on a weekly basis this would cost each member approximately forty cents (\$.40) per week. There may be some extreme cases, but, the average Odd Fellow and Rebekah could very easily afford 40c per week and not be hurting. Let's not quibble about a few cents, but let's pitch in, and put the dignity and respect that our Lodges and our Order so justly deserve, back into all of the Lodges in our respective areas.

I would also like to remind the Lodge Secretaries of both the Odd Fellow and Rebekah Lodges, when filing their Annual Reports, do not list a member on the Non-Contributing List of your Lodge who is a Resident of either one of our Homes for the Aged in Pennsylvania, namely Orchard

Manor in Grove City or the Odd Fellows Home in Middletown. The Laws strictly state that when a member becomes a Resident of a Home of the Order, that the Lodge is obligated to keep that member in good standing in the Lodge. That does not exempt the Lodge from paying the Per Capita Taxes on that member, nor the Home Tax.

Also, do not put any member on the Non-Contributing List of your Lodge that has not been a member of the Order for forty (40) years or more. This is getting to be a bad habit, and eventually it is going to cost every member who does pay dues more money than you are presently paying. It would be a good idea for every Lodge and every member to pick up the Blue Book of the Grand Lodge, or the Green Book of the Rebekah Assembly and read just what the proper procedures are for placing a member on the Non-Contributing List.





That's what publicity is all about: doing something and letting the world know about it.

Good publicity is essential for the success of a Lodge and its individual members. It's necessary for maintaining a strong membership, increasing opportunities for members, expanding their membership capabilities, and appreciation of the Lodge and its members.

Good publicity doesn't happen by itself. It's the result of careful planning and

work. It requires the support of every Lodge Member.

Your Lodge's publicity program begins with your meetings. A well planned, well organized meeting provides a solid foundation for good publicity. What your members see, hear, and feel about the meeting will determine their response to your Lodge and its members.

This personal publicity is only the beginning. To really get your Lodge known throughout your community you must reach the public through the various media serving your community. You must reach the public through newspapers, radio, and even television.

As a non-profit organization, your Lodge has an excellent opportunity to obtain publicity through the various media in your community.

In the coming issues, I will be writing on these guidelines.

(4) Follow up.

SCANDINAVIAN SCENE By Vilmer Rasmussen, Denmark

Ivar Dahlgren, Grand Master of Sweden (1955-1970) passed away April 3. 1983. Bro. Dahlgren was active in the International Council and served a period as Special Deputy Sovereign Grand Master for

Europe.

The Order may be established soon on the Faroe Islands, between England and Iceland, according to Erik Fisher, DDGM in the Odd Fellow Bladet. Four men have plans on going to Denmark for their initiation and others are going to the other Scandinavian countries for their initiations. When they have the required 15 members, they will petition for the establishment of a lodge.

Teresa Rebekah Lodge No. 65 was instituted in Oslo, Norway, on February 5, 1983. It was sponsored by Urania Lodge No. 2, Oslo. Erik Evjen, Grand Sire of Norway, in his talk to the 130 Brothers and Sisters at the Institution drew parallels to the great work of Mother Teresa, the Nobel

Prize winner.

Norvegia Lodge No. 1 was instituted in Oslo, Norway, on February 8, 1908, by Petrus Beyer, the Grand Sire of Denmark. He had also instituted Noreg Lodge at Stavenger in 1898 but it was disbanded in 1903 and Odd Fellowship was not reestablished in Stavenger until 1918. Norway became an independent jurisdiction in 1920 and now has an Odd Fellow membership of 10,000 with 4,723 in the Encamp-

ment branch.

The Grand Lodge of Denmark has prepared a folder "The Gift of Sight" and has distributed it to all the lodges with a plea of boost the sale of the benevolent stamps, designed and printed in Denmark for the benefit of their Eye Disease Research program.

The Humanitarian Foundation in Odense, Denmark, recently made its second distribution of funds. Ole Olson, chairman, officiated at the presentation of cheques for \$3,000 each to the research work for Sclerosis and Rheumatism.


