Season's Greetings

BECKY'S BACKYARD

- 1. Remembering your "Pin" number. Write it out as a fictitious telephone number using your own area code as the first three digits of your own number and then your PIN number. No one else will know and you will have it with you. Don't write your pin on the cards.
- 2. Extra car key: To save the inconvenience of being locked out of your vehicle, consider this. Put an extra key on a loose-leaf binder ring and attach the ring to -- (for a man) your trouser belt keeper, (for a lady) to your bra strap.
- 3. A recycle use of window shades is to line kitchen cabinet drawers and shelves with them as they are durable and scrubbable.

- 4. Bay leaves keep weevils away. Put several bay leaves in a small cheese-cloth bag. Tape them to the inside of the flour container. No weevils in the flour! However, this will not get rid of existing weevils.
