before Grandma Moses, Frank Sinatra and Bing Crosby and cup size bras. Girls wore Peter Pan collars and deep cleavage was something butchers did. Designer jeans were scheming girls named Jean or Jeanne, and having a meaningful relation meant getting along with our cousins.

We thought fast food was what you ate during Lent, and Outer Space was the balcony of the Rialto Theater or the back of the Riviera Theater. We arrived here before house husbande gay rights, computer dating, dual careers a commuter marriages. We were before day-care centers, baby sitters, group therapy and nursing homes. We never heard of FM radio, tape decks, electronic typewriters, artificial hearts, word processors, yogurt, guys wearing earrings and girls with nose rings. For us time-sharing meant togetherness . . . not condominiums. A chip meant a piece of wood, Hardware meant hardware, and software wasn't even a word.

Back then, "Made in Japan" meant junk and the term "making out" referred to how you did on your exam. Pizzas, McDonald's and instant coffees were unheard of. We hit the scene when there were 5 cent and 10 cent stores where you bought things for five and ten cents and did most of our Christmas shopping. Sanders or Wilsons sold ice cream cones for a nickel or a dime. For one nickel you could ride a street car, buy a pack of chewing gum, make a phone call, buy a Pepsi or enough stamps to mail one letter and two postcards. You could buy a Chevy for about \$600 . . . but who could afford one? A pity too, because gasoline was 11 cents a gallon!

In our day cigarette smoking was fashionable, Grass was for mowing, COKE was a cold drink and POT was something you cooked in. ROCK MUSIC was a Grandmas lullaby and aids were helpers in the Principal's Office.

We knew what CCC and NRA meant and if anyone had asked us to explain CIA, NAT UFO, NFL, SATS, JFK, BMW, or IUD, we

would have said alphabet soup.

We were certainly not before the difference between the sexes was discovered, but we were surely here before the sex change. We made do with what we had and with whom we married. and we were the last generation so dumb as to think you needed a husband to have a baby!

No wonder we are so confused and there is such a generation gap today. But, WE SUR-VIVED!! What better reason to celebrate each day, and fight to keep ODD FELLOWS AND REBEKAHS alive for ALL TIME.


Past IARA President, Barbara Corfield is at home recuperating from major surgery.

3) In August took place in our build-

ing a cultural and social gathering with the attendance of 2 Odd Fellows and 3 Rebekahs lodges. All the brothers and sisters participated with great enthusiasm during a forum after the exhibition of an interesting tape video about ancient civilizations.

6) On November 22, Rebekah Lodge "Esperanza Ner 13" celebrated its twentieth anniversary of their institution. The D.D.S.G.M. collected an amount of money to contribute to this event and attended their meeting delivering a speech congratulating them for the work done during their existence and asking to continue their noble labor giving help in benefit to the community.

7) An important social gathering took place on November 29 with the participation of all the lodges. The purpose was to integrate Odd Fellows and Rebekahs in this promotion of our ideals of friendship and solidarity and compromise them in the future growing of the Order in Chile.

8) During December all the lodges were involved in the Christmas Program for the schools and Old Ages Homes in which they cooperate along the years.

January and February are summer recess, so our activities were reduced because of the natural absence of our members.





Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Myrna Magnuson, nine grandchildren, nine great-grand-


children and one sister, Edith Otto.
