175TH ANNIVERSARY GRAND LODGE OF PENNSYLVANIA

Charter for a Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania was applied for on June 6, 1823, and it was granted in a short time thereafter.

Grand Master Thomas Wildey on his return trip from Boston instituted the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania on June 27, 1823 in Philadelphia.

Thomas Small – Deputy Grand Master Benjamin Richardson – Grand Warden Benjamin Daffin – Grand Secretary Joseph Richardson – Grand Treasurer

At the present time in Pennsylvania we have 152 Odd Fellow Lodges in Pennsylvania, 109 Rebekah Lodges, and there is a membership of 5,287 Odd Fellows and 2,827 Rebekahs.

The Grand Lodge and Rebekah Assembly Offices were located in Philadelphia until 1958 when it was moved to Front Street in Harrisburg. After the flood in 1972 the Office was moved to Middletown in 1979 where it is situated on the Odd Fellow Home Property.

Our Sovereign Grand Treasurer, Bro. Bob Wick, has suffered a serious stroke, and, has only recently returned home from long months in the hospital, Nursing Home and Rehabilitation. The stroke has affected the use of his right hand and leg, and, has left him with a speaking impairment, but has not affected his thinking.

I have not known a man more dedicated to Odd Fellowship, than Bob Wick. He has spent his entire life in serving the Order. Bob and Darlene operated the Odd Fellows Children's Home of Illinois from 1967 until retirement in 1993, and, Bob has served as Grand Secretary of Illinois since 1976, and, honorably as our Sovereign Grand Treasurer since 1988.

The difficulty in communicating is very frustrating, and, painful. There is something which we, as fraternal family can do, to ease the situation. We have ordered Bob a small piece of equipment called an Alpha Talker II, with which he can point to objects on the screen, and, the machine speaks the words for him. This is the first step in providing our friend with the ability to again communicate with his wife, Darlene, family and friends. In the future, if his needs allow, we can furnish a small computer, through which he could communicate via the internet with friends around the world of Odd Fellowship. This will, I believe, improve the quality of Bob's life.

The Church will make an accounting to The Sovereign Grand Lodge, and, will notify Bob and Darlene of those who contributed.

EYE WITNESS NEWS!

If we had not been there, we would not have believed our ears and eyes.

First, we would like to explain that this year there were many delegates serving for the

first time, I think that is great!

Second, we would like to know why the Green Book Committee could present article changes to the lodges of Pennsylvania in advance but could not present emergency legislation changes, they had planned for session, to the lodges as well. We do not feel it was fair to the lodges to have delegates make such important decisions for their lodges, especially new delegates that maybe did not understand exactly what was going on. We are referring to the salary structure for the Assembly Secretary. Many lodges were surprised and shocked to find this was done in the way it was done. We were very disappointed with he Assembly Board and the Green Book Committee. We feel a decision like this should have been presented to the lodges before Session so that the lodges could instruct their delegates in their decisions in this matter.

Another question we have is how can the Grand Lodge give their secretary an apartment and not have him pay taxes on the money allotted for that apartment when the Rebekah Assembly can't find a way to do this for their secretary?

After this past session we are ashamed to say that we are Rebekahs and we feel if we have many more sessions like the one we just had, the cause of loss of membership will not be the cost of membership but the so called sister and brotherly

LOVE we are supposed to demonstrate among ourselves. There was no love demonstrated in the session we had this year.

We wonder if this board is trying to keep out the younger people to handle the job of secretary so that our sisters whom are retired can have this job. After all the retired sisters are the only ones that can afford to work at the ridiculously low rate, only because she has a second salary coming in such as her social security and possibly a pension to boot. Our feelings are that Sister Susan Dreibelbis was elected to serve as our secretary and therefore the Rebekah Assembly should have been looking for ways to entice the younger secretaries to stay. Common sense only tells us that a younger secretary is apt to do a better job only because she has a sharper mind. We do not have anything against an older secretary but past experiences prove things were not being done correctly if done at all. As we get older, we tend to become more forgetful and consequently do not get all the jobs done correctly. We are all curious to see just who does fill this chair of Secretary of the Rebekah Assembly. We feel that sister Susan Dreibelbis was treated unjustly and we were in total shock watching this happen the way it did. We know that if there would have been more experienced delegates and the Lodges would have been informed ahead of time there would have been a motion for a 7% increase for the secretary and a change would have been made in our laws to read that the secretary will receive her

apartment without any further cost to her.

Another thing that has been brought to our attention at session was the fact that the Journal for 1997 has not even been presented to the printer, here it is a year late and the lodges are expected to purchase this journal, a journal that is absolutely useless to the lodges. Lady Colfax does not intend to purchase this journal and suggests that the Rebekah Assembly Board get a count of the books which will be purchased before ordering to try to save some of the money that will be wasted in this matter. We know a lot

of lodges feel the same way. We also want to know how someone on the Green Book Committee can also serve on the Finance Committee, how can a Parliamentarian also serve on the Finance Committee. These people have their jobs to do at session, and we feel next session will be a real circus if nothing is being done about this now. We know it is not fair for a President to have to look for all these committee chairs to be filled as did our President this year, however there has to be sisters out there who are capable of filling these chairs. Before you know it, session will be run l just a handful of people and not the Delegates session. We feel there has been a great dis-service to this order and someone better wise up before it is too late.


