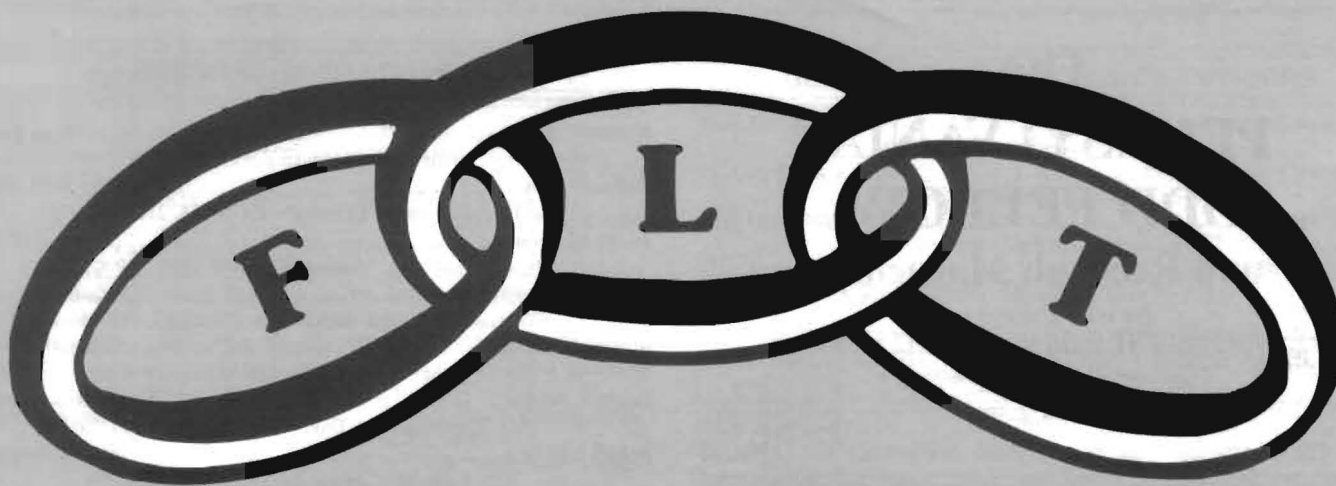

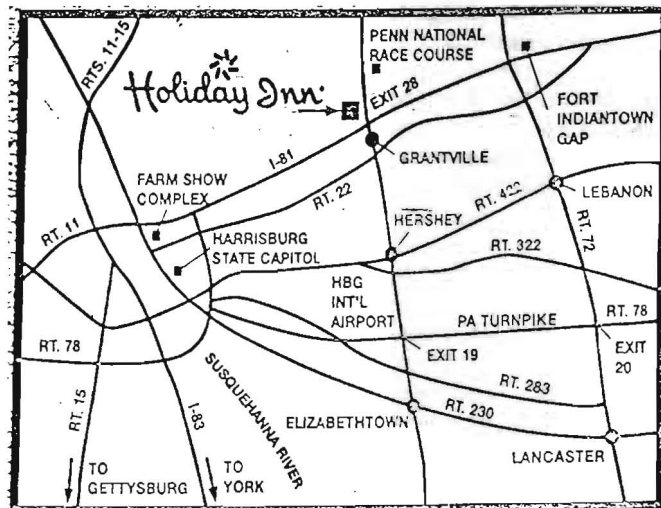

NEWBURG ODD FELLOWS LODGE MARKS 140 YEARS

Odd. The word itself implies strange, different, even unusual. But for thousands of men all over the United States, Canada and 17 other nations, being an Odd Fellow is quite an honor.

The Independent Order of Odd Fellows is a fraternal organization that was started in 17th Century England. The organizations got its start in the Americas in Baltimore, Md., in 1819.

Newburg's IOOF Lodge was instituted on May 17, 1860. The lodge hall on Main Street is the original meeting place of the Newburg Odd Fellows and is still in great shape today.

The 137-year-old building is just one of many original structures in Newburg and has several uses. Newburg Borough Council holds its monthly meetings in the lower level and election suppers are held there as well. The upstairs is solely for the use of Odd Fellows and Rebekah meetings.

From the unusually large skeleton key that opens the door of the meeting hall to the ornate furniture and original costumes and secretaries' books that date back to lodge's beginnings, it's evident that members of the organization are proud of their heritage and go the extra mile to keep everything well-maintained.

The Odd Fellows are very active in the community, especially with Newburg's annual Memorial Day festivities. In addition, lodge members also support Newburg-Hopewell Fire Co., local scouting organizations and many nationally recognized organizations such as the National Arthritis Foundation and the World Eye Bank.

The Odd Fellows also provide scholarships for local individuals and sponsor students each year who take part in the organization's United Nations Educational Tour. Lodge members also promote and take part in bus trips to popular attractions such as Washington, D.C., Baltimore, Pittsburgh and Lancaster.

The Newburg Lodge is made up of men from three former Odd Fellows organizations. At one time, Shippensburg, Newville and Waynesboro each had their own lodges. When their membership

ranks declined, they merged with the Newburg Lodge.

The four lodges have been successfully meeting as one lodge for many years. At the present time, Newburg's IOOF Lodge has approximately 40 members, three-fourths of whom are active.

The Odd Fellows are a "Three Link Fraternity" based on the motto, "Friendship, Love and Truth." The group's objective is "to improve and elevate the character of man."

Membership is based on the Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man. Members do charitable work on various projects in the community and through the organization's teachings and ceremonies, they seek to fulfill their objective and to help make the world a better place in which to live.

Some people have the misconception that Odd Fellowship is some kind of religion. This is not true. Odd Fellowship requires that no man or woman may become an Odd Fellow; or Rebekah unless he or she believes in a Supreme Being, the Creator and Preserver of the Universe, and is loyal to his or her country.

Any man or woman of good character, whose life and acts have been worthy and honorable, is eligible for membership. It is required that a member in good standing recommends the candidate as worthy of sharing the duties and enjoying the privileges of Odd Fellowship. Odd Fellowship strictly forbids any interference with one's religious beliefs or political opinions, either directly or indirectly. It requires acknowledgment of God and complete obedience of civil laws.

Odd Fellowship encompasses the entire family. Although meetings are held separately, their principles are the same.

The men meet as Odd Fellow Lodges. The women's lodge is known as the Rebekahs. The Rebekahs hold their own meetings and work with the Odd Fellows in all projects. Currently, the Newburg Rebekahs, sponsor the town's Election Supper and Community Yard Sale Day.

The Rebekah Degree was written by Schuyler Colfax, vice president of the United States from 1868 to 1873. It is based on the

teachings of the Bible.

The Dessie Priscilla Rebekah Lodge No. 100 of Newburg was instituted on Saturday, June 3, 1961 at Hopewell-Newburg Elementary School. The lodge chose Dessie Priscilla as its name in honor of Dessie Priscilla Rebok, a lifetime resident of Newburg who was well known for her millinery shop. There are currently 19 members of the Rebekahs in Newburg.

Both the Rebekahs and the Odd Fellows welcome and encourage new members to become involved in the organization.

"Over the years, our numbers have decreased and that's sad," says Ken Coleman, Odd Fellows secretary. "We need to have new members in order to carry on. If our organization were to disband, a lot of artifacts as well as parts of Newburg history would be lost."

Coleman hopes some of Newburg's young adults will take an interest in the Odd Fellows Lodge and help to keep the tradition alive.

Odd Fellows Officers include: Noble Grand, Ron Martin; Vice Grand, Curt Cramer; Secretary, Ken Coleman; and Treasurer, Glenn Minick, Rebekah Officers include: Noble Grand, Dorothy Harris; Vice Grand, Aggy Chamberlin; Treasurer, Lavina Coleman; Financial Secretary, Marie Kendig; and Secretary, Glenda Cramer.

On Monday, Feb. 14, lodge members and their families are invited to attend a Sweetheart Dinner in their honor at New Hope Center starting at 7 p.m.

Ron Martin will prepare a roast beef dinner and there will be entertainment.
