A LOOK INTO 2000

To start off the new millennium, the I.O.O.F. Jurisdictional Committee selected the next state-wide project to help those with arthritis. As you are all aware we presented the microscope to the Department of Rheumatology at Hershey Medical Center, located in the Arthritis Foundation Central Chapter's area, for research into a cure for arthritis at the 1999 Unified Session.

We considered several project suggestions and have decided to fund sessions of the **People with Arthritis Can Exercise (PACE) Program** for the Western Chapter. This program and the acronym (PACE) were established by the National Arthritis Foundation and are used across the country as the name for the land exercise program. This exercise program uses gentle activities to help increase joint flexibility and range of motion and to help maintain muscle strength. The classes are usually one hour long, are conducted one to three times a week and the series usually lasts eight weeks. The size of the class is limited to 10 to 20 people to allow

the instructor to closely supervise the activities and evaluate the participants. The first installment of the PA I.O.O.F. Jurisdictional Arthritis Committee's grant will be used to conduct the **People with Arthritis Can Exercise** program series at three High-rise residences in the Pittsburgh area – Kelly Street High-rise in Homewood Brushton, Pressley High-rise on the North side of Pittsburgh and Gualtieri Manor in the Beechview area. The Odd Fellows and Rebekahs will be listed as a sponsor in the brochures and promotional material for the programs.

The Committee felt this program will benefit those with arthritis and would also promote Odd Fellowship as the promotional material is distributed. We will be looking to our membership for support as we launch our fundraising for this project commitment.

The Arthritis Foundation Chapters have educational programs running throughout the year. If you have any questions, please contact the Chapters directly.

BECKY'S BACKYARD

- To remove wrinkles from plastic flannel type tablecloth, put the tablecloth in the dryer (on a low-heat setting) with a couple of damp towels. Check the tablecloth frequently until all the wrinkles are gone. Let the tablecloth lie flat to cool to avoid more wrinkles. You can also remove wrinkles by ironing (on a warm setting) with a steam iron on the flannel side – do not iron the vinyl side!
- Ladies, do you have difficulty remembering the color makeup you buy! Remove the sticker from the bottle or tube that includes the brand and color and stick it to a mirror in your cosmetics bag; or put the stickers on an index card and put it in your wallet.
- 3. When the metal spout on the dishwasher-detergent box is hard to open, place a small bobby pin over the spout as a handle to put the spout open.
- 4. To clean up broken glass! After picking up the big pieces, vacuum the area and then take wide, silver tape and pat the whole area. Press hard on the tape. After pick up all your can and you see something sparkle, use the tape procedure again. Very soon you will have a glass free carpet or area where the glass was broken.
- 5. To remove odor from a refrigerator, place a bowl of catbox filler in it and close the door for a couple of days. This also works in a musty clothes closet.
- 6. Keep copies of wallet contents. Make copies of everything in your wallet to make it easier to replace all items if the wallet is lost or stolen. When traveling put them in the bottom of your suitcase, or somewhere other than your purse. You have a record of what papers are to be replaced, plane tickets, credit cards, etc.


