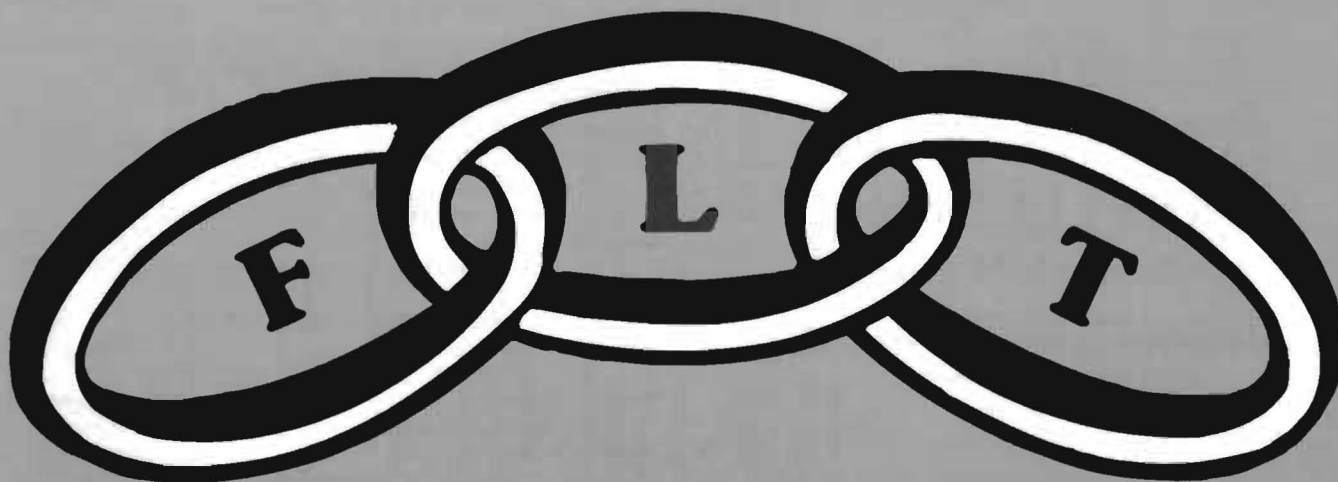

BECKY'S BACKYARD

1. Ballpoint ink stains can be removed from most fabrics by sponging with methylated spirits. Always rinse thoroughly.
2. Blood: soak as soon as possible in salted water. Soak in a pre-wash solution and always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
3. If you suspect silver fish sprinkle boric acid and sugar around the area.
4. With the warm weather come the mosquitos. You can stop the itch by applying a paste of bi-carb of soda and water. Other remedies are – an aspirin dissolved in a teaspoon of water, methylated spirits. Even a raw onion rubbed on the bite will relieve the itch.
5. Eggs: For baking, it's best to use medium to large eggs. Extra large eggs may cause cakes to fall when cooled. Brown and white shelled eggs are of the same quality.
6. Fresh Eggs: To determine whether an egg is fresh without breaking the shell, immerse the egg in a pan of cool salted water. If it sinks to the bottom, it is fresh. If it rises to the surface, throw it away. Fresh eggs are rough and chalky in appearance. Old eggs are smooth and shiny.
7. Fruit Stains: Fruit stains on a table linen disappear if powdered starch is applied at once left on the stain for a few hours before laundering.
8. Hamburgers in a hurry: Poke a hole in their centers when shaping. The center will cook quickly and when the hamburgers are done, the holes are gone.
9. To keep cookies crisp, place crushed tissue paper in the bottom of cookie jar.
