

BECKY'S BACKYARD

- 1. Undo bandage glue: Use baby oil! It smells good, and usually loosens the adhesive and softens up the glue that's left behind. Just rub some on the bandage or leftover "stuff" and give it a little time to work. S-L-O-W-L-Y and gently lift off the bandage or tape.
- 2. Elastic makes trash bag fit: If the bags are too large they tend to pull down. Cut a piece of 1/4 inch elastic to a length that would fit tightly around the outside rim of the container. Let the extra length of the trash bag hang over the outside. Stretch the elastic over the "hang over". What a difference that has made.
- 3. Dish Towels have lost absorbency: To bring towels back to life wash them and rinse them by adding 1 cup of white household vinegar to the rinse water. You may need to repeat this several times, but you'll be surprised at how soft and absorbent your towels will become.
- 4. Airtight bag saves soap scouring pad: After you use a soap- filled scouring pad, rinse it off and put it in a resealable, airtight bag. When you use it again it won't be rusty.
- 5. Pierce the end of an egg with a pin, and it will not break when placed in boiling water.
- 6. A few drops of vinegar will keep poached eggs from running all over the pan.
- 7. To keep egg whites from disintegrating while poach ing, put 1 tsp. vinegar in water.
- 8. Lettuce and celery storage: They keep longer if you store them in the refrigerator in paper bags instead of cellophane ones. Do not remove the outside leaves of either until ready to use.
- 9. Lettuce will not rust as quickly if you place a paper towel or napkin in the storage container.

COMMUNICATION — MORE THAN WORDS

hen we think of communicating, we think of a verbal exchange. In most settings we most often meet face-to-face. The words we speak or hear, are a small part of communication. Experts believe that at least 70% of what is communicated is done without words.

Nonverbal communication includes body language, facial expressions and gestures. These are many times more powerful and more revealing than the words spoken. What do you "say" nonverbally? Here are a few tips to help improve on nonverbal communications.

- How close you stand to someone when you are talking to them is important. Typically, a distance of 18 24" is comfortable.
- Making eye contact with a customer acknowledges that you see and are paying attention.
- Remaining silent while the customer is talking is basic courtesy.
- Open gestures, smiling, and widening your arms, tell the customer you are comfortable.
- The rule of thumb for touching is "less is best" in most work situations

ODD FELLOWS HOME



ODD FELLOWS HALL

Location: 9 S. Main St., Shrewsbury.

Originally: Home of the Mount Vernon Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, chartered in Shrewbury in 1846.

Built: in 1853 by the lodge.

History: The lodge hall, a three story, gable-roofed, white-painted brick building in the Greek Revival style, was the largest in town and was an example of the strength and stability of the lodge, which had 42 members by 1886. The lodge was very philanthropic and paid large amounts in benefits to its members.

Members met weekly in the hall and following the meeting members spent time socializing. The lodge continued into the 1930s when it was dissolved due to declining membership.

The third floor of the building was used for several years by the Order of the Eastern Star, and organization for women and relatives of Masons. Other groups such as the Struggler's Club, the Eight Invincible Eagles and even the Klu Klux Klan met in the hall at one time.

The building also housed a number of small businesses, including a confectionery and eigar store and a restaurant. Eventually, it was turned into apartments.

Revival: The hall was restored in 1990 by the Keller-Brown Odd Fellows Group and is now professional offices for Keller-Brown Insurance Services. It is on the National Register of Historic Places as the finest example of Greek Revival architecture in sourth-central Pennsylvania.
