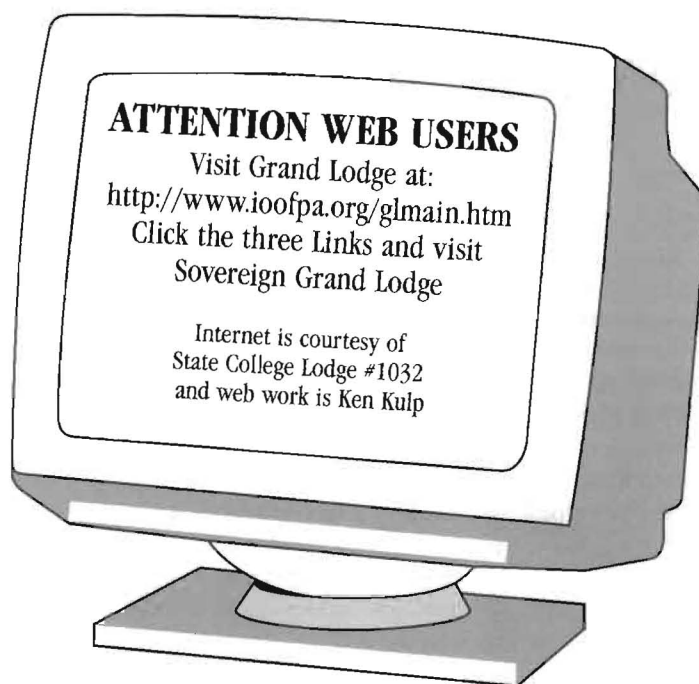

Five-year-old Ulises M. Diaz awoke Christmas morning to find few presents under the family tree, and his mother told him that Santa must have missed their Reading home.

In truth, Elizabeth Cintron bought her two children, Ulises and Edward Llera, 15, what she could afford.

But Ulises, a kindergartner at 12th and Marion Elementary School, was heartbroken because he didn't receive the one gift he had asked for — a remote-controlled NASCAR model race car.

Santa may have missed Ulises' house, but his tale of disappointment didn't sky by the school bus driver Robert B. Zeiber of Muhlenberg Township, and his wife, Dorothy, when they heard Ulises talking with other children on a Berks County Intermediate Unit bus.

Dorothy, a retired nurse, works as an aide on the bus, which carries children with physical disabilities. Ulises has cerebral palsy.

"All the kids were sitting there saying what they got for Christmas," Robert Zeiber recalled Friday. "And he (Ulises) said he didn't get anything. He said, 'Santa missed my home.' He said he was going to leave the tree up until Santa arrived."

The Zeibers decided they had to do something.

"I asked his mother if she would mind if I got him something to put under the tree for when he woke up Saturday (today)," Robert Zeiber said.

Then Zeiber, who for the past decade has made a habit of portraying Santa Claus for friends and family, gave the idea some more thought.

He decided that a personal visit from an apologetic Santa would be a more fitting remedy.

So instead of taking his red suit to the dry cleaners as he had planned, Zeiber decided to put it on one more time this season and make a special visit to Ulises' home.

Ulises' eyes grew wide as he peered out the front door of his home in the 200 block of Greenwich Street Friday night and saw the red-suited, bearded man approaching.

"Ho, ho," Santa bellowed. "I'm sorry I missed you. I'm making up for it tonight."

Santa and his wife carried two large bags of presents they had bought for Ulises. The bags also included gifts for Ulises' older brother and mother.
