

BECKY'S BACKYARD

- 1. Use vinegar as a cutting agent for drilling holes in metal. It really extends the life of drill bits.
- Remove sticky price tags from glass by spraying with WD-40. It works well.
- 3. To stop throw rugs from slipping around underfoot, glue some nonskid rubber strips for your bathtub to the underside of the rugs.
- 4. Prepare your snow shovel for winter with a coat of floor wax. The wax helps prevent the scoop from rusting and also makes the snow slide off without sticking.

There have been many verbal remarks, but this will happen because no one is putting anything in writing.

Many years ago when Betty Moates was President of the I.A.R.A., she addressed our Grand Body at Session with remarks saying the young couples want change. I have heard since various SGM's make the same remarks. I wrote to Sister Betty back then and since to the various Sov. Grand Masters asking them if they ever spoke to the "young" members to see if this is what they want. To this day I never received any replies. I felt as a member in my early 30's I could voice my views. We need change, much change, but not by destroying our structure or taking away from our Ritual. Over the years so much has been taken, there soon will be nothing left. I have spoke to many members my age, like myself all are fascinated with the ancient works. In this busy world we are in today it is nice to go to a meeting that is not as quite "fast pace" and be reminded of the morals our ancestors were taught through this order. Where we need the change is in our attitudes. Most of the Lodges are dying because they don't really want members. They are content with their little group doing their own thing. The problem is their "little group" starts dying off and there is soon no one left to keep it going. We must be open to new members, we must listen to them, we must get involved in our communities, we must have activities. Changing our structure is not going to help.

I apologize for taking so much space in the magazine, and I thank you for listening, but I feel we need more written views and less verbal. I realize there are some happy for this change and I respect them for that, but I still don't think this organization is ready for it. Everyone thinks because we have entered into a new millennium, we have to change everything. It still is just another year. Readers I hope to hear from you.

I joined the Odd Fellows in 1959. From '59 to '70 I held all the jobs in the Lodge except Noble Grand. That job came in 1996-98 when I served two years in our new facility.

In 1992 when my working career was winding down, I increased my activity in the Lodge. This coincided with a problem that faced the Lodge. A local business man tried to "steal" the property downtown. We stopped the threat and started a building program that resulted in our Lodge Hall at Windmere Park, State College. We decided to keep both properties. The old Lodge Hall was converted into Apartments and the Brothers asked me to manage the Windmere Hall. I joined the Rebekahs with my wife in 1998 shortly after Lady Emily moved to Windmere Hall. I have been doing most the publicity for the two Lodges ever since. I am now Secretary for #1032 and our Hall Association. I am a member of Encampment #72 and have been proposed at Ridgley Canton #8.

In 1998, the first year I was elected Representative, the Lodge urged me to speak at Session promoting communications (e-mail and web site) for Grand Lodge. They would put up the money if I would put up the time to develop a communications center and a web page for the Grand Lodge. The result is operating now, "www.ioofpa.org"

At my urging the Lodge is now sending three to four Brothers to the Session each year.

I have a book that I purchased over the years, with the history of our order, etc. It tells us that the United States unanimously severed its connection with the Manchester Unity, in the Year 1842.

In 1842 the Grand Lodge of the United States unanimously severed its connection with the Manchester Unity, "and in view of the fact that the Unity had altered the ancient landmarks, violated the principles and changed the work of the Order, and attempted to invade our chartered rights, the Grand Lodge of the United States declared itself the only fountain and depository of Independent Odd-Fellowship on the globe."

"The Manchester Unity, in accordance with its frequent threats, subsequently attempted to establish Lodges in this Country, but failed. Our National Grand Lodge attempted establishing Lodges in Great Britain, but failed also."

In 1843 or 1844 a movement commenced to change the basis of representation in Grand Lodges and Grand Encampments, which representation had become very unwieldy.

"The election of Grand Officers being held in grand bodies, few beside the nearest resident Past Grands and Past Chief Patriarchs could participate therein. All this absolute power became more and more grievous as the order increased, until a general demand was made for a limited representation by annual elections in the subordinate, and for the election of Grand Officers by voting in the subordinates. Such a great change was naturally resisted as an invasion of vested rights, and dangerous to the stability of the institution."

From 1847 to 1851 the agitation of this question caused a prolonged storm, which threatened permanently to divide the brotherhood. At length, however, a satisfactory adjustment of difficulties was made.

In 1851 Schuyler Colfax, of Indiana, "reported the Degree of Rebekah, for the wives of Scarlet Degree members."

In 1852 the "London Order of Odd-Fellows" (England), numbering 233,000 members, proposed a union with the Order in America, which was declined.

In 1853, Grand Lodges of Odd Fellowship existed in all the States and some of the Territories.

The annual celebration of the anniversary of Odd Fellowship (April 26, 1819) commenced in 1859.

In 1863 the Order was prospering in the Sandwich Islands and "in danger of dying out" in Vermont.

In 1867 the Grand Lodge of the United States decidedly refused to make alterations in its Ritual or <u>secret work</u>.

It was claimed the Odd-Fellowship has "molded into a kindred likeness of benevolence not a few institutions nearly as powerful for good as itself."

During the Centennial Year, 1876, the Grand Lodge met in Philadelphia.

"PENNSYLVANIA LODGE BURNED OUT"

Fire, which started on the first floor, occuped as a candy store, totally destroyed the building and all the property of Pennsylvania Lodge No. 1, except the rituals and record books. The hall was situated at 3919 Lancaster Avenue, and was used by a number of organizations. Some of the historical relics lost by Pennsylvania Lodge can never be duplicated. The old charter, which was 104 years old, is out of print in the Sov. Grand Lodge and an entirely new form is now in use. The charters of Equal Rights Lodge No. 464, and West Philadelphia No. 572, were also destroyed, as was an apron worn by the first Grand Master of Pennsylvania and one formerly worn by John Upton, the founder of the Lodge. Regalia and paraphernalia of the Lodge was badly damaged by smoke and water, but the extent is not known at this writing. Several pictures of historical events during the past hundred years were also destroyed. An application has been made for a new charter and the meetings of the Lodge will be held in temporary quarters at present.
