Sister Bonita "Bonny" (Givens) Morningstar, 69, James Creek, was initiated into Red Rose Rebekah Lodge #586, Middletown on November 1, 1963. She attained the rank of Past Noble Grand and after receiving her Assembly Degree went on to serve the Rebekah Assembly as District Deputy President, Rebekah Assembly Conductor and finally as President from 1993 to 1994. She also served Sovereign Grand Lodge as membership Chairman of Region 8.

She was currently serving as Co-chairman of the 2001 Annual Session to be held in Grantville.

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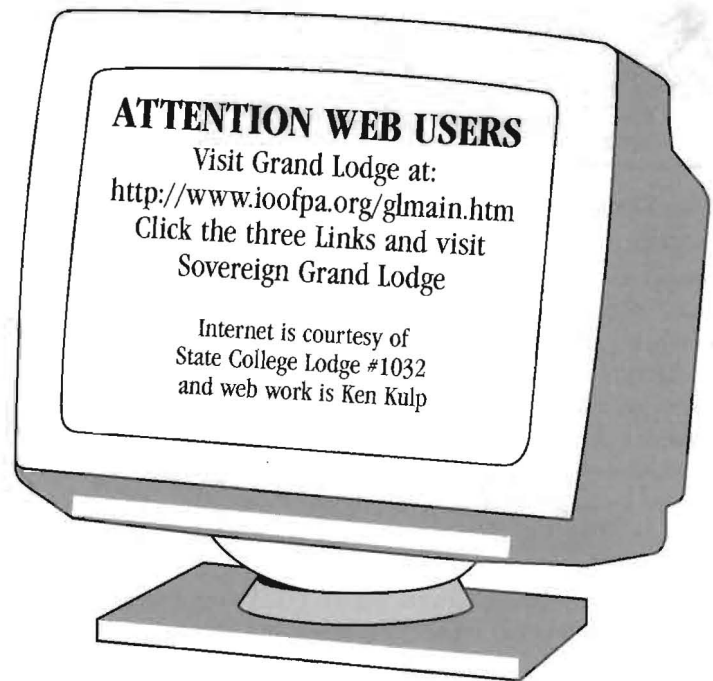

men Lodges.

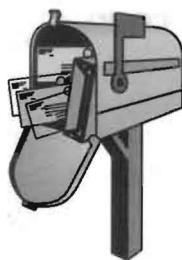
By a majority vote we have stated that we do not and

The members of Boyertown Lodge #708 to strongly oppose the
admittance of women to an Odd Fellow Lodge for a number of
reasons. However, the main reason is the Sovereign Grand Lodge
failed to inform the grass roots membership that this step was
being considered and would come up for a vote.

A review of the I.O.O.F. News for the year shows no article about
this matter. Only several letters to the editor and a reference by
Sovereign Grand Master Conley Call in his message concerning a
Canadian women's action. Nor did Sovereign Grand Lodge War-
den Harry Lohman, make any mention of the coming vote when he
addressed the subordinate lodge representatives at their annual
session.



Sovereign Grand issues Proclamations and Directives which are
sent to every subordinate lodge. With a stop of this magnitude
being considered, why didn't Sovereign Grand Lodge inform every
subordinate lodge, or at least the jurisdictional lodge?

Furthermore, if Sovereign Grand Lodge is concerned about
equal rights for women, why don't they give Rebekahs equal
representation in Sovereign Grand Lodge? Presently, they have
taxation without representation.

Chocolate Chip Banana Bread

1 1/3 c. Mashed ripe Bananas	1/2 tsp. Vanilla
3/4 c. Sugar	3 Eggs
1/4 c. Milk	2 2/3 c. Bisquick
3 Tbsp. Vegetable oil	1/2 c. Chocolate Chips

Preheat oven to 350. Combine bananas, sugar, milk, oil, vanilla, and eggs. Stir in Bisquick and chocolate chips. Pour into a greased 9" x 5" x 3" loaf pan. Bake 50-60 minutes. Cool 10 minutes. Remove from pan.

P.O.F. DAYS GONE BY

75 YEARS AGO

(June 1926)

MEMBERSHIP REPORT FROM SESSION – Members 9/30/24 - 196,891 / initiated 8,841 / admitted by card 1,828 / reinstated 513. (How do you like those figures!)

TRIUNE #307 – Thirty-seven Lodges reported a membership of 500 or over. The greatest gain in individual Lodges was Triune #307 reporting an increase by initiation of 124 for a gain of 32%.

NEW REBEKAH LODGE – On May 9th Red Rose Rebekah Lodge #586, Middletown was instituted by Vice-President Belle Heidenrich. The Lodge chartered with forty-nine members.

REGINA REBEKAH #230 – Held a very interesting session May 10th. They admitted twenty women and two men for a grand total of 22 into the Lodge. Representatives were there from Girardville, Mt. Carmel (Lucy Webb Reb. Lodge), Shamokin, Ashland, Trevorton, and Elysburg. Following the Degree a supper was served in the banquet room. It was way after midnight when the affair came to a close.

INTELLIGENT DEGREE PRESENTATION – The degree lessons in our Order that especially lend themselves to illustration are based upon an Old Scripture story and a parable from the New, and any intelligent arrangement must include some knowledge of the times in which they occurred, their customs, manner of dress, etc.; at least enough to avoid the introduction of absurdities.

For example: We saw a genuine donkey introduced in a most elaborately presented degree and while bearing the wounded man toward the inn, the donkey yielded to a call of nature not anticipated in the work. Amid roars of boisterous laughter from the spectators, and the probability is that they remember nothing else of that presentation of the degree.
