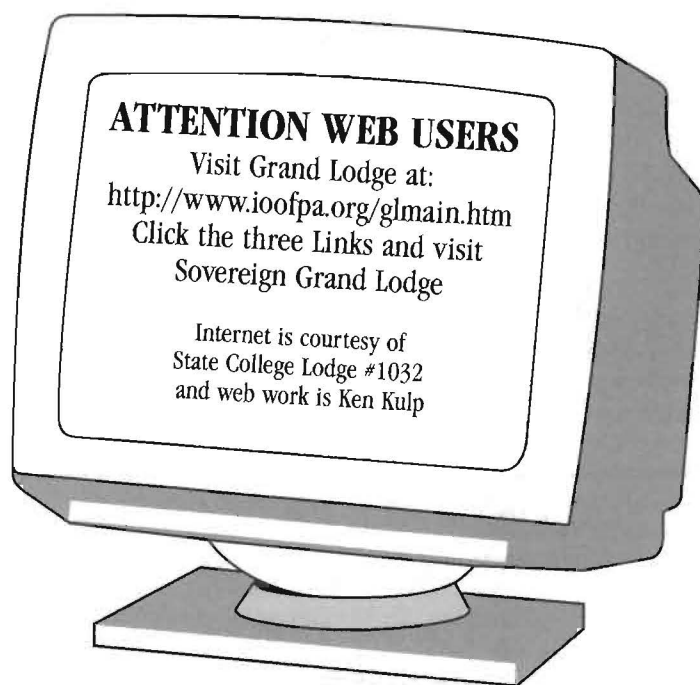

On Tuesday, February 13, 2001, at a regular scheduled meeting, the members of Connoquenessing Lodge #278, a motion was made, seconded and unanimously passed to support the Pennsylvania Grand Lodge decision until such time as more information is available on this issue.

There are many spoken and printed words that are misleading our membership in Pennsylvania about admitting females in our Lodges.

Whether we personally approve of it or not, "Bill #12" deleting the word "male" from Chpt. 4, Sec. 2, Par A(1), Pge. 9 of the SGL code of law was passed at SGL Sessions last August and became LAW as of January 1, 2001. The count was 93 to 40 in favor. All three of PA delegates voted NO. As of that date any lodge in any Jurisdiction, including PA can accept applications from and admit females to their Lodge by initiation and degrees. Some Jurisdictions all ready have done it.

I feel our Grand Lodge Officers should help the lodges in PA make the transition smooth and easy as possible, and stop issuing Directives that are meaningless. All of us who are PNG took an oath to "support, maintain and abide by the laws of the Sovereign Grand Lodge and the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania."

I have talked to many Sovereign Grand Officers, in the many years I have attended SGL Sessions, on this matter when other Bills were presented, and were either defeated or withdrawn. We all felt that some day it would happen!

WALKER #306 TAKES SWEDEN BY STORM!!

On Monday March 12, 2001 Walker's Degree Team departed from Philadelphia International Airport for Sweden at 8:55 P.M. We arrived at London Heathrow International Airport on Tuesday, 8:50 A.M. We had a layover of 1-1/2 hours and we departed for Sweden at 10:25 A.M. We arrived at Sweden's Arlanda International Airport at 1:55 P.M. We were greeted by our hosts Clarence Whilberg and Torgney Stahl. We left for Stockholm by bus and our tour guides highlighted the points of interest and provided us with a thumbnail history of Stockholm.

Sweden traces its roots back to 8000 BC. In 1500 BC the Germanic of Southern Tribes developed trading links with the European lands to the South. In 750 AD the Swedish people engaged in a revolution and at this time adopted the name for their country (Sverige). Sweden has had numerous events shape their country including their entrance into the European Union.

We arrived at the Hotel Birger Jarl, which was our home for the next five days. The hotel was outstanding in their service to us in the way they attended us with a buffet breakfast and in their services throughout the entire stay.

Wednesday, March 14, 2001 we were taken on a sightseeing tour (Double-Deck Bus), which included a visit to the Wasa Museum, which houses a world famous Swedish ship that met with most unusual set of circumstances. Wednesday evening was our first visit to a Swedish Lodge meeting. We met at Lodge #65 Stockholm where they performed the second degree for their new Brothers. We had a fantastic dinner as guests of our Swedish Lodge Brothers.

Thursday, March 15th we were conducted on a tour of the Stockholm Odd Fellow House. This is a building dedicated to Odd Fellowship. There are four Lodge Halls and a private dining room that any hotel would be proud to offer. The Lodge Hall boasts of their own full-time chef. The rest of the day and evening were set aside for our personal shopping and sight seeing.

Friday, March 16th was a guided bus tour to the cities of Stragnas, Sala, and Vasteras. We visited a beautiful Episcopalian Cathedral built around 1600 and also Lodge Halls in Stragnas and Sala. The evening was a visit to John Olof Wallin Lodge #134, Vasteras. We attended a Lodge meeting and saw their performance of the third degree.

Saturday, March 17th was the highlight of our visit to Sweden. Walker Lodge 3306 performed the first, second and third degree not once, but twice the say day. Our first presentation was before 225 Swedish Lodge members. When we broke for lunch after the first degree we were congratulated by every member present and they shook our hands individually. We performed all the degree again in the afternoon and again received individual congratula-

tions. The audience count in the afternoon numbered more than 250 new faces. In Europe applause is not offered as freely as in our country. The applause we received was in the form of a cadence. This appraisal is not given lightly, but is only presented for outstanding performance. The Swedish Lodge presented us with a dinner in their Grand Dining Hall. The food was excellent and their service was outstanding. We were intermingled with our Swedish Brothers and their wives as we were seated for dinner. Their acceptance of us was something we will remember for a long while.

Sunday, March 18th was our day of departure. We boarded the buses at 4:30 A.M. Our flight departed at 7:05 A.M. We arrived at Heathrow, London at 8:50 A.M. Our last leg of the journey was departure from Heathrow at 11:30 A.M. and arrived at Philadelphia at 2:40 P.M.

May the Brothers and their families on both sides of the Atlantic long remember Walker's trip.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Brother Sweeney has had the opportunity to enlighten you on the wonderful experience we had in Sweden. However, I would like to add to that by explaining Odd Fellowship in Sweden. What amazed me is how we are one Fraternity, but can be so different in so many ways. I had the greatest opportunity to exchange Lodge "Customs and Protocol" with the Grand Sire and Grand Secretary. What I learned makes me wonder how Odd Fellowship would survive here if we followed the same path.

To start, all Brothers attend meetings in black tails and white tie. If they dress socially for a function, they all have matching suites and ties. Upon questioning this, it was explained that at all times everyone must be dressed alike, because as the degrees teach us, "as Odd Fellows, no matter how high or low, we all meet on the same level in the Lodge room," thus, the dress code. No one stands out higher than anyone else. For the Rebekah, attendance to a meeting requires a long black formal. Their formal's are not all alike, but are the same shade of black, not like our white here which tends to be white, off white, or yellow.

We did not actually confer the degrees on their brothers, because in Sweden it is not possible to get your degrees in one day. You must wait one year between each degree. We were reminded, a degree is a lesson, you need time to understand that lesson, and witness it

again, before you can receive the next degree. Rebekahs also have three degrees and must wait between also. They have one more elective chair than we do, the Conductor, and from what we saw, he is the one who gets the work out. In all the Lodge meetings we had the opportunity to attend, the conductor performed an outstanding job and all by heart. If elected to this position, you serve four years, before you are eligible to be elected to the chair of Vice Grand. The Vice Grand and Noble Grands are elected for two years. Thus, you automatically don't move up, there is opposition on all chairs. And you are elected on your performance and experience, not because its your turn. By the time you are elected to Noble Grand, you have had at least six years under your belt and fully understand the responsibility you have accepted.

The Rebekahs are governed by the Grand Lodge, however, no man becomes a Rebekah. The only one who may attend a Rebekah meeting is the Grand Sire, and basically the only time that happens is when something is terribly wrong. As I said they are governed by the Grand Lodge, which means they report and pay all to the Grand Lodge. However, they do have a Rebekah Council, which is basically like our three top elected Rebekah Assembly Officers. However, they have more power than ours. They can grant dispensations, and they report the condition of subordinate Lodges to the Grand Lodge.

You won't find 20 Past Grand Sires in Sweden. In fact there are only three living. When elected to that position, you serve four years, and most time are elected for several more terms. The current Past Grand Sire finished a short term this past June, ten years, his predecessor served for twenty-five. Can you imagine serving as Grand Master for 25 years? Remember Sweden is a little longer than Pennsylvania is wide and the Grand Lodge over there has

charge of 30,000 members.

In speaking about the time of waiting between degrees, I forgot to mention you pay \$100.00 to receive each degree, and we complain about paying \$27.00 for all four. Their average dues amounts to \$75.00 per year in our money, again we complain about \$40.

As for Brother Heffner, Strausser, Haussler and myself, we were fortunate to be able to represent Pennsylvania and were treated in a way that we have never experienced. At all three meetings we never had the opportunity to witness the opening ceremony. We were placed in a lounge with the Swedish dignitaries and "entertained" until it was time to be presented before the lodge. We were all conducted like Kings into the Lodge rooms, escorted by the Scene Bearers and lead by the Conductor, were accorded the Honors and seated. At no time did anyone speak.

You must remember Sweden does not fall under Sovereign Grand Lodge law, therefore some things are different. Their regalia/jewels are much different. I felt they were nicer than ours, yet the Swedish Brothers seemed to like ours more. They wear collars, no jewels, as for the officers of the Lodge it is collars or sashes. Their jewels and regalia are made in Sweden, not furnished by SGL. Their three links are all straight across, not curved like ours. If you don't believe me ask any of the Brothers on the trip to show you their tie, the links are on that. We still haven't decided if exchanging ties is a Swedish Custom or just practice done after an evening of "Skolling." Also their first and second degree is the same as ours, but the third degree was written by a Swedish Author. It teaches the lesson of Truth, however all together different than our way.

It was amazing to see the respect for leadership in that country and in the Lodge. In every building, you will see a picture of the King and Queen, mostly lighted too. The first toast at every dinner is to the King and Queen. You don't find pictures of Bill and Hillary in our buildings and you rarely here a toast to them. As explained to me, they get angry at their leaders on a state and lodge level too,

however, they feel regardless of their action, they are still the leaders and deserve the respect as such.

Finally, the Lodge Building themselves. First every Lodge has one more additional chair than we do, it is the Grand Controller. His responsibility is to sit on the balcony with the Musician and control the lighting for a meeting. The ceilings were the talk of our Brothers, in fact, I think down the road the stars will shine at Walker Hall. You see, every Lodge Hall has a ceiling that is lit during the closing ceremony. All the lights are shut down except the all seeing eye above the Noble Grand's station. Then the ceiling lights up to resemble the constellations. Every ceiling is different, because as explained, an astrologer would be able to tell

you when exactly the Lodge was "inaugurated" (instituted), because the stars are lined up the way they were the night the Lodge was "inaugurated." Also on the walls around the top of the room, you will find many Swedish words, when I asked, I was told it is the four commandments, visit the sick, relieve the distressed, bury the dead and educate the orphans. It is placed there as a constant reminder.

The Main Lodge House as Brother Sweeney explained is a palace. The Dining Hall was formerly a Courtyard for parking the carriages. This was closed in and made into the Dining Room. The beautiful door at the entrance, was once the main gate to the Courtyard. In addition to the four Lodge Rooms which by the way are going at all times with different Lodges meeting, there is a Special Room for the candidates to wait in and a Special room to receive your Grand Lodge Degree in.

I could go on and probably have missed some things, but I felt it would be nice to help explain some of the differences in our World-wide fraternity.

As Brother Sweeney said "SKOL"
