Well, for most our installations are over, a new year has begun, and there have been major changes in our world since we last spoke.

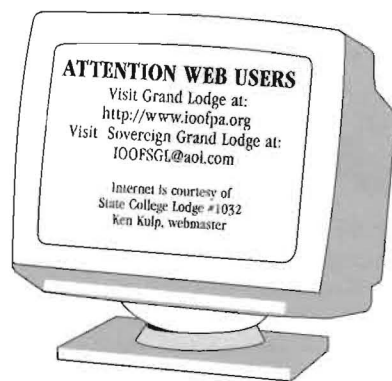

Dear Friends and Supporters,

C.S. Lewis once wrote, "Grace substitutes a full, childlike and delighted acceptance of our need, a joy in total dependence." As I look back on the past few months, the time in preparation for my missions trip to Peru and the time actually spent on the trip, I realize the truth of this statement. Now that it is over, I can look back and thank God for His grace that brings us through times nothing else could.

I prepared for the trip with an eager expectation as I thought back on the amazing eye-opening things I experienced in Mexico last year. However, as I soon realized, you can never think that you know what God will do. When we arrived in Peru, we had no translator, which was a situation we were not prepared for. I am not quite fluent in Spanish, but I can converse, so I was suddenly thrown into a job I had never expected. As this job was added to my role as a leader of nine teenagers, I was suddenly feeling stretched in ways I never felt possible. One night, as I was praying, I said to God, "Lord, I just feel like something has got to break." I knew at that point that the Lord had brought me there to break me . . . my pride, my self-reliance, and my lack of faith. I soon saw even more of the plan. After about a week of being there, I became very ill. I had to spend a few days in bed, which was a grave disappointment to me. I found myself asking God why He had taken me so far only to be so ill that I couldn't do anything. I had gone there to change lives. But, God has taken me there to change me. As I became frustrated because I didn't know how to translate "paint brush," or as I cried to God to heal me, or as I struggled with the words to say to a teen crying on my shoulder, I found myself relying on God more and more. I learned that His grace is truly sufficient to cover our weakness. As I learned this and asked Him to work despite my physical and emotional state, I saw Him do amazing things.

I felt that my main ministry was to the teens on my team. As I worked by their side, I was able to form relationships with them. I soon found them coming to me, talking about things that were on their minds, and asking me to pray with them. What a blessing this was to me! Another opportunity that was an enormous blessing to me was working with the children at the orphanage we stayed at. These children had come from terrible situations – extreme poverty, sexual and physical abuse, and the loss of their parents. Yet, they were the most inspirational people I have ever come in contact with. One morning, I woke up, and walked into the bathroom and a little girl was standing at the sink singing a song that translates, "I have melodies in my heart." That night, I talked with my mother on the phone and I said, "Mom, these kids have taught me more than I could ever teach them." How blessed I was to see lives that were completely transformed because of Christ's love. These children had nothing on earth, but they learned every day about the Father they have in Heaven and they would tell you about His great love and mercy with their words and their every action. They were some of the most loving and giving people I have ever met.

We also ministered at churches, as well as drug rehabilitation centers, which was an awesome experience. These people taught me how to rely on God. Their entire worlds had been shattered by terrible drug addictions, but they were putting them back together by relying on the grace and mercy of Jesus.

Another way we ministered was by working at the orphanage. I was humbled as I worked beside the native workers. They were giving their entire lives to help the children . . . what an inspiration!

So, I would like to conclude this letter by thanking all of you that supported me in prayer or financially. I cannot thank you all

enough. I've learned incredible lessons, and hopefully passed some lessons on to others. I pray that this letter has shared some insight with each of you. I pray that you would know the incredible grace of Jesus Christ, and that it would become real in your life. As C.S. Lewis wrote, there really is a great joy that comes fully trusting God's grace to pull you through.

ARMISTICE DAY – What is said to be the first parade demonstration of Odd Fellows in Coatesville since 1882 drew an entire division composed of 120 members.

PAST GRAND'S ASSOC. OF LACKAWANNA COUNTY prepare for Christmas at the Sunbury Orphanage. They will be erecting a tree and are planning to load it with enough useful gifts that a "dray" will be required to take them to the Home.

25 YEARS AGO (November 1976)
