man had to spend all his time flat on his back. The men talked for hours on end. They spoke of their wives and families, their homes, their jobs, their involvement in the military, where they had been on vacation.

As the man by the window described all this in exquisite detail, the man on the

One warm afternoon the man by the window described a parade passing by. Although the other man couldn't hear it, he could see it with descriptive words. Days and weeks passed. One morning, the day nurse arrived to bring water for their baths, only to find the lifeless body of the man by the window, who had died peacefully in his sleep. She was saddened and called the hospital attendants to take the body away. As soon as it seemed appropriate, the other man asked if he could be moved to the bed by the window. The nurse was happy to make the switch, and after making sure he was comfortable, she left him alone.

Three men of Berks County recently closed an open chapter in their life. All of their educations were cut short by World War II.

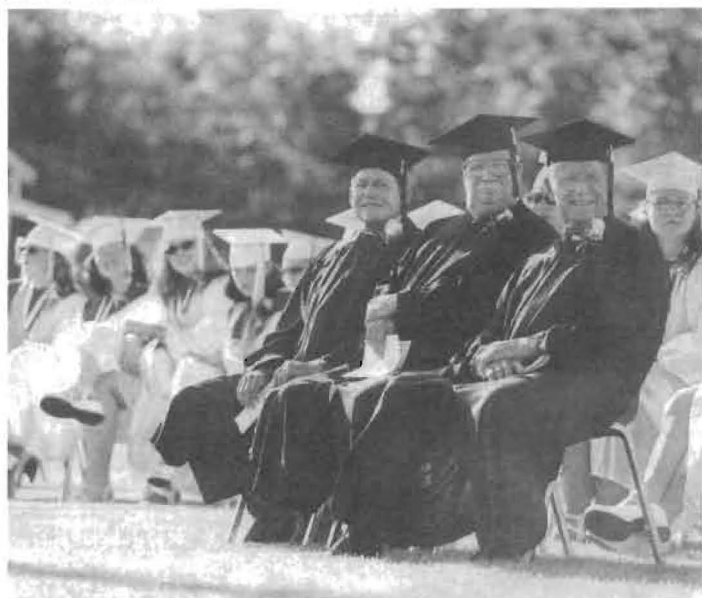
OPERATION PROGRAM – a program that awards honorary diplomas to WWII veterans who left high school for the war was started by Massachusetts Department of V.A. Andrea Hartman, 17, a junior at Hamburg High School, learned of the program through her church, discussed it with school officials. Hartman and Danielle Frye, 17, spotted an article in "The Hamburg Item" for a reunion of the Class of '45. The article mentioned that two people at the reunion did not graduate because they went to war. The students posted a notice in the "Hawkeye" – the district newsletter. Another veteran answered the ad, this is where we come into the picture.

Richard "Bud" Berkley, 75, Hamburg was initiated into Symmetry Lodge #103, Hamburg on February 27, 1947. Brother Bud became a Past Grand of that Lodge and also a Past Chief Patriarch of Earl R. Leiby encampment #106. He now holds membership in Leesport Lodge #141 through consolidation. He is an active member of the Royal Purple Degree Team and can be seen yearly performing at the Bushkill Rally. His father, the late Joseph F. Beckley, was composer of our official "Three Link March."

Brother Beckley and his wife Malinda have two children and two grandsons. His education was finishing ninth grade at Hamburg until he enlisted in the Navy in 1943. He went to Japan in 1945, China in 1946 and was discharged in 1946. You can see it didn't take him long until the following year he began his travel on the road of Odd Fellowship.

Brother Beckley worked as a pattern maker for 41 years, retiring in 1987.

As part of the Operation Recognition the High School awarded them honorary diplomas during the high school commencement exercises.

Brother Beckley was quoted in the *Reading Eagle* as saying, "Even though it doesn't mean anything toward my advancement, it's something that, in a way, I earned but never got." The men joined the service when they were 17. They needed their parents' permission to enlist. It did not matter to them that they were very young and had not finished school. Their friends and family were fighting the enemy. They wanted to join them. For these men, their responsibility to the country was more important than academics. "The people of today do not know how serious it was at the time" Beckley said. "All of a sudden, we didn't have a Navy. The Navy was wiped out at Pearl Harbor. I was very much concerned." They traded their books for guns. Instead of practicing the jitterbug, they learned to dodge bullets and trained for battle.

These men, along with many others, are what we owe today's freedom to.

After months of holding basket bingos, conducting raffles, and soliciting contributions, the Mahanoy Lodge 551 and Idella Rebekah Lodge 58 team's effort to beat the Dalmatia Kiwanis Club came to an abrupt end.

The team's captain has issued a challenge to the Kiwanians to stimulate more interest in the local American Cancer Society's Relay For Life. The object of the challenge was to raise the most funds for the Relay – the winning team would be provided with a nice dinner hosted by the losing team. The winners (Dalmatia Kiwanis) brought in over \$12,100 and the losers (Odd Fellows/Rebekahs) over \$10,700.
