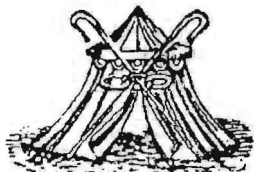

The year 1927 marks the 175th Anniversary of the institution of the Encampment Branch of Odd Fellowship. The Encampment branch is distinctly an American institution. The Encampment Degrees were first conferred in the Grand Lodge of Maryland, afterward the Grand Lodge of the United States, and authorized as a separate branch of the Order in 1827.



The Golden Rule Degree was the first degree conferred by the Grand Lodge of MD and was known as the "Superior Degree," then the "Mazarine Blue De-

SPRING CLEANING

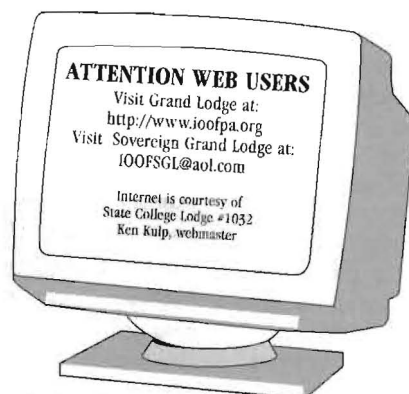
*It seems each year about this time

gree, now known as the Royal Purple was added and finally the Patriarchal. These were known as the "sublime degrees" and were very different from today's degrees.

In 1827 when the Grand Lodge of the United States authorized these "sublime degrees," Encampment No. 1 was instituted in Baltimore, Maryland on July 6, 1827 with 18 members. Later in 1832, the name was changed to Jerusalem Encampment No. 1. The first Grand Encampment was instituted in Maryland under a charter dated September 5, 1831.

Prior to 1827, the degrees were part of the subordinate lodge and a requirement to gain admittance to Grand Lodge. Upon notification from Grand Sire Wildey on June 9, 1828, and further petition of ten Patriarchs, Encampment No. 1 in Pennsylvania was chartered December 20, 1828. On June 16, 1829 at a meeting of the Grand Lodge, a motion was passed to reconsider the motion in 1828, and a charter was granted to form the Grand Encampment of PA.

The Grand Encampment officially opened June 17, 1829 at the Hall on the NW corner of Chestnut and Seventh Sts. for the purpose of electing officers. This meeting was conducted by Grand Sire Wildey. Elected as your charter officers were: *Isaac Brown, Grand Patriarch; James McMullen, Grand High Priest; Andrew Anderson, Grand Senior Warden; Thomas Small, Scribe; John Postill, Grand Treasurer; and Lawrence O'Connor, Grand Junior Warden.* Thus the beginning of Patriarchal Odd Fellowship in Pennsylvania.

By 1847 the Grand Encampment grew to 62 Encampments composed of 226 members. The first ordered subordinate Encamp-

ment was Philadelphia No. 1. A Special note was that a committee appointed especially to procure a frame to hold the Grand Encampment Charter, presented this in 1840 along with a bill for \$4.50.

HAS YOUR LODGE RECEIVED THEIR LAW SUPPLEMENTS!!!

In the first week of January notices were sent to all Lodges that the supplements for Grand Lodge and Sovereign Grand Lodge were available. To date there are still a lot of Lodges that did not order any or only ordered one. I remind you the Grand Lodge and Sovereign Grand Lodge books go together. One is not good without the other, many times in Grand Lodge law you are referred to a section from the Sovereign Grand law.

We all took an obligation to abide by the laws of the Sovereign Grand Lodge and the Grand Lodge, well how can you abide by something you don't have? The ways our laws are changing it is very important to keep them updated and have both.

So if you don't have them, lost your order forms, PLEASE contact Grand Lodge and have them sent.

And finally, if you did send for them, PLEASE put them in your books. Many Grand Lodge Officers have noticed when visiting, the books sitting on the desk and the updates accumulating in envelopes.

There are 28 million Americans affected by the disease. Fractures from osteoporosis generally occur later in life, but there are things we should be doing throughout our lives to prevent or minimize the likelihood of getting osteoporosis . . . a balanced diet; the right amount of Calcium and Vitamin D; a health lifestyle (stop smoking, minimize alcohol intake) and plenty of exercise – weight-bearing exercise, such as walking, helps prevent or slow bone loss and keeping your joints limber helps your balance so you are not as likely to fall. If you think of your youth through age 30 as the time to "bank" bone mass, the more you've prepared and "have in the bank" as you reach middle age, the better off you are as age begins to deplete your bone mineral. The more bone demineralization you experience, the more susceptible you are to fractures. As I mentioned, Calcium is an important dietary supplement and the amount you need to supplement increases with age. Check with your doctor to find out the proper amount to take. Vitamin D is also important as it helps you absorb the Calcium. Vitamin D production occurs naturally in your body with exposure to the sun. Additional supplements may be needed in the wintertime or for those who are elderly, frail or disabled and unable to get outside. Again, your physician can help you determine what the proper amount is for you. Your physician can also order a DEXA scan to determine the state of your bone health. These tests are painless and take about ten minutes to perform. There are new treatment methods available today that help those who develop osteoporosis. Talk to your physician for more information. Remember, your physician is your guide to what you need.
