If you are not, you should not consider yourself a good member. You are cheating the Lodge, your Grand Lodge or Rebekah Assembly and your fellow Odd Fellows and Rebekahs. We have heard just about every excuse possible on why this is OK to pay less, but all in all these are just excuses a person uses to ease their own mind for cheating.


Many feel our Lodge is loaded with money – why not use that to defray the costs. You realize if your predecessors felt that way, what would you have today? Some say we have fund raisers to compensate our dues. Fund Raisers are legally for charitable donations and defraying Lodge expenses. Per Capita and Dues are not expenses, they are each members' responsibility. You took an oath – is this what your word is good for?

I am sorry if I seem harsh, but just coming out of working with reports and seeing what has come in with dues and seeing so many lodges surrendering their charters because they are broke and can't pay per capita, well no wonder when you are only paying \$10.00 a year.

## 75 YEARS AGO

(February 1927)

GRAND MASTER'S LODGE BURNED OUT – Fire destroyed Oil City Lodge #589, the home lodge of Grand Master John Mark on January 14th. New fixtures were being installed by a local electrician and it appears the fire was caused by some uncovered wires. When firemen arrived the whole west portion of the handsome lodge room was a blazing inferno. Damage to the paraphernalia room, club rooms was principally from smoke and water. The lower floors received extensive water damage. The original charter from 1866 was destroyed. Architect's plans have already been submitted to the lodge to re-build.

LOUIS KOSSUTH WHITE – first president of the Wayside Inn at Grove City passed away at the age of 74.

COLONY OF ODD FELLOWS AND REBEKAHS – Members of the Order in Arkansas are forming an extensive resort colony on a tract of 22,000 acres, with sites for 4,000 cottages. Ownership will be limited to Odd Fellows and Rebekahs.

ODD FELLOWS ASSOC. of the third district in Chester County held a very large and enthusiastic meeting at Hebron Lodge #437. A supper was served by the Ladies Aid Society of the Cochranville Methodist Church. DDGM McCreary presented the Association with a check for \$50.00 for the parade prize in the Sesqui parade in September.

75 RECEIVE GRAND LODGE DEGREE at Cambrian Lodge #58 in Carbondale.

CLOVER LODGE #348 visits Robertson Lodge of New Brighton with a delegate of 45 plus the Degree Team whom conferred the second degree at the Lodge.

SHIPPENSBURG ODD FELLOWS TEMPLE – The town of Shippensburg will be among the many cities and towns in Pennsylvania to have an Odd Fellows Temple. The building is expected to be dedicated February 22nd. The first floor will consist of social rooms, ball room, kitchen and dining room. The second floor totally for lodge purposes has an arched ceiling and the latest method of indirect lighting.

The Philadelphia Lodges have been warned to be on the alert for a former member of Lake Shore Lodge 178, Erie. He has an official receipt. He is not soliciting, but visiting after being expelled for conduct unbecoming an Odd Fellow.

We must remember that our youth of today are our Rebekahs and Odd Fellows, and our leaders of tomorrow and there is help available to educate them from our Home Boards, our Grand Lodge and Rebekah Assembly and through our Sovereign Grand Lodge. As parents and grandparents in this order, check this out. Our two week tour to the United Nations in New York and the friendship and learning this gives to these young people who are fortunate enough to be chosen to go on one of these tours.

On Saturday there were no stairs to climb to Santa, and Alex smiled broadly as Jack L. Wolf, a friend of the Zeibers, asked her whether she had been bad or good.

With his clean-shaven face and absence of the requisite belly, out of costume Wolf didn't even bear a passing resemblance to the jolly man from the North Pole.

Once in his red suit, though, Wolf was a natural, welcoming every child with a personalized greeting, eliciting shy smiles and bursts of laughter from the children as they sat on his knee.

Bingo player Jean C. Allen said the donations will hopefully become a tradition.

"This is the first time we did something like this, but I don't think it will be the last," Allen said.




