ANNUAL FOUR COUNTY RALLY A HUGE SUCCESS

Odd Fellows and Rebekahs turned out in full force in Tamaqua this past November as Schuylkill County hosted the Annual Four County Rally. There were approximately 66 Rebekahs and 85 Odd Fellows for the afternoon. A total of 95 enjoyed the family style banquet prepared by the local Elks Lodge.

The Rebekah Degree was opened by Hester Rebekah Lodge #29, Tamaqua and the Degree was conferred by the Centre County Degree Team. Six candidates received their Degree: Inez Larichuita, Kathy Murphy and Melissa Turner of Hester #29; Warren Windham and Lori St. George of Lady Paoli #136; and Pearl Enck of Lady Sutter #435 (Lititz).

The Odd Fellow Degrees were opened by Harmony Lodge #86, Tamaqua and the three Degrees were conferred by the Delaware Valley Degree Team which is composed of members from various Lodges. #135 MEMORIAL SERVICE AND HOLIDAY PARTY

On Saturday evening, December 1, 2001, Perseverance Encampment held its annual memorial service to honor the members of the Encampment who had passed away during the year. A single carnation is placed in a vase by the Bible as each deceased Patriarch's name is read. This year, three Patriarchs were remembered – Roscoe Berger, Sam L. Klugheit and George Schaefer – and the group paused for a moment of silence to recognize those who perished in the September 11th attack on the United States. On Sunday, December 2nd, the Eastern PA Chapter hosted the





P.O.F. DAYS GONE BY

75 YEARS AGO

(January 1927)

BLACK LICK LODGE No. 1088 BURNED OUT (Nanty Glo, Cambria Cty.) One of the worst blazes in the history of the town burned Miner's Hall, one of the oldest and largest buildings in town. Also consumed in the fire was the Methodist Church and a home which neighbored the building. The Hall was owned by the United Mine Workers Lodge, but the top floor was the home of the local Odd Fellow and Rebekah Lodges. Everything was lost.

CHARLEROI No. 1030 saved many lodges money and assisted local authorities in the capture of a imposter. A man, whose real name was J.W. Marstein of Michigan, showed up at lodge appealing for assistance. The brothers – not quite sure – offered him a nights lodging and meal until they could check into things. The man insisted he had no time and had to catch a bus to Pittsburgh. Some brothers followed in the shadow, while another fetched a policeman. There at the bus stop he was arrested and after being searched was in possession of \$60.00 and a large number of official certificates and emblems of high office. He later reported that he purchased them from a Chicago wholesale house. He had already appealed and received money from the lodges in Monessen and

BECKY'S BACKYARD

- 1. Fire Safety: Change the batteries in your smoke detector each time you turn your clocks forward to daylight saving time. Be sure to use a long-life alkaline battery.
- 2. Keep Those Receipts: Hold on to repair receipts and warranty information for major appliances. If buying a house, get all records on appliances from the previous owners to determine if warranties are still in effect.
- 3. To quickly separate eggs, break them into a small funnel. The whites will slip through, and the yolks won't.
- 4. Keep finger sandwiches from drying out by placing them in a container lined with a damp towel and wax paper. Separate sandwich layers with wax paper, and cover with another layer of wax paper and a damp towel; refrigerate.
- 5. When food boils over in the oven, sprinkle the burned surface with salt. This will stop smoke and odor from forming and make the spot easier to clean. Rubbing damp salt on dishes in which food has been baked will help remove brown spots.
- 6. To loosen bacon slices before cooking them, roll the package of bacon into a tube before opening. This will relax the slices and keep them from sticking together.
- 7. Cookie dough makes a great piecrust and there's no rolling necessary. Simply press dough into pan, and refrigerate it before baking.
