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From the Desk of the Grand Secretary

Dear Readers,

Here we are at the beginning of Summer – has your Lodge made plans? Also we are at Session month – will you and your Lodge have a voice?

There is one thing I would like to mention that is becoming an increasing problem here at the office and one that will be addressed in the near future. There are entirely too many Lodges (Odd Fellow and Rebekah) submitting checks with only one signature. I remind you it is a law of Sovereign Grand Lodge that all checks have TWO SIGNATURES. This is nothing new – it was mandated several years ago and many notices were given out by Grand Lodge reminding you of the fact. This was done to protect you and the Lodge against any improper activity. It appears what is happening that many lodges cannot get enough together to hold meetings. They are paying bills with three or four deciding to make donations and a check is being written. If you don't have a quorum for a meeting you cannot legally pay any bill. If you cannot get a quorum for several meetings, you have more serious problems. Some of the Lodges I know are set up for two signers at the banks but are only using one signer. Many banks are now charging a penalty if your check comes through with one signature. PLEASE use more caution and don't be angry if Grand Lodge pursues this, remember you could be the one bringing it on.

Also by now many are aware I have given my resignation as Grand Secretary for health and personal reasons. Therefore one of the first items on the agenda will be to fill the vacancy for Installations, Wednesday, June 12th. The term of office will run from 2002 to 2004. I ask for all Brothers to consider this position. If you are interested and would like to know what is involved please contact either myself, the Grand Master or any elected officer of the Grand Lodge. I am sure any would be happy to answer any questions you may have and also place your nomination.

In closing I extend my personal "Happy Father's Day" to all fathers in this Jurisdiction and look forward to seeing many of you at Session.

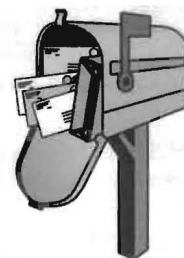

On Sunday, April 13, 2002 the 128th Annual Corporation Meeting of the Odd Fellows Home of Pennsylvania was held at the Home in Middletown. Twenty Odd Fellow Representatives, three Encampment Representatives, and Sixteen Rebekah Representatives attended the meeting in the Chapel.

President Leon S. Stamm presided over the meeting and after opening remarks and introductions, submitted the following Annual Report for 2001 to the Representatives.

Representatives and Members of the Eastern Home District

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

It is my privilege to present to you the Annual Report of the Odd Fellows Home of Pennsylvania for the year ended December 31, 2001. The Home has once again completed an outstanding year of operation.

You have before you in this booklet the Home's financial statements. The Home's Certified Public Accountant has completed its annual audit of the Home's financial affairs. The auditor

reviewed the results of the audit with the Board of Directors during the regular Board meeting on March 12, 2002. I am pleased to inform you that the Home continues to be in an excellent financial position. The current assets far exceed the Home's current liabilities. The Home generated substantial revenue during 2001 while continuing to control expenses. The financial statements reflect the Home's continued growth and prosperity.

Our nursing division and Personal Care Division continue to provide the highest level of service to those who are entrusted to our care. The census in the Nursing Division remains high and we have once again increased our census in Personal Care. Independent Living continues to be completely occupied and there is a waiting list of others who want to move in to an Independent Living apartment when space becomes available. We continue to maintain and upgrade the physical plant and equipment as necessary without incurring debt.

David Bell has completed his first year as the Home's Administrator. Brother David Mills completed his affiliation with the Home as Chief Executive Officer in September. The day-to-day

779 REPRESENTATIVES TO GRAND LODGE WERE REGISTERED AT CONNEAUT LAKE, it was noted this was the smallest amount in several years. Per Capita was set at 12 cents per term.
