MS BIKE RIDE



Martin Rides for the Seventh Year Over One Thousand Miles This Year

Robert (Bob) Martin will ride again in the MS Escape to the Lake again this year. Somewhere between Linesville and Conneautville he will have reached one thousand miles for the MS. That is one third of the way across our continent in fourteen days. Now that is pedaling!

He rides for MS because he has a mission. That mission is to help find a cure for that dreaded disease. It is a disease of the central nervous system. Symptoms may vary from mild to severe, loss of vision, loss of use of limbs, paralysis. It strikes most young people, 20-40 years of age. Advances in research and treatment have been made. You can help. In western Pennsylvania, there are 4700 individuals with MS.

The challenge for Bob is 150 miles of sweat in two days, smiles from grateful individuals with MS, and the satisfaction of raising money to help fight this debilitating disease. Over 1500 riders participate each year. They ride from Cranberry Twp. near Pittsburgh, to Conneaut, Ohio. This year it will be June 8 & 9, with stops Zelienople, Portersville, Moraine State Park, Stoneboro, Cochranton, Meadville, Harmonsburg, Conneautville, Albion, and finish in Conneaut, Ohio.

To assist in fund raising a wooden carving of an Elk has been donated. Chances are available for \$1.00. This was made by George Wilson of Sandy Lake Lodge #573.

Any donation as an individual or lodge will be accepted. If you know of an individual with MS and wish to have their name on Bob's shirt, a donation of \$10.00 will do it. The shirt has on the front, the Odd Fellows name and the back will have "Riding For" and then the names. Memorial names may also be included.

We thank you for the support in the past and for your continued support this year. I cannot guarantee a picture of Bob for each contributor, but a picture will be sent to the Odd Fellow-Rebekah Magazine of Pennsylvania. Watch for it.

The money given is divided as follows: 40% for research, 38% for local programs, 14% fund raising, 6% reserves, 2% administration.

This month I will discuss Lupus. This is a systemic autoimmune disease where the body's normal immune system (the system that normally protects us from disease and infection) turns and harms the body's own healthy cells and tissues. The proper name is Systemic lupus erythematosus, but is most often referred to as "lupus" or SLE. Women are more likely to develop lupus than men and some ethnic groups, such as African-Americans and Hispanic-Americans, are more likely to develop it. Although it still may be a fatal disease, improvements in therapy have led to a significant increase in life expectancy in the last 50 years. The disease will usually present gradually and its symptoms of muscle and/or joint achiness and fatigue occur in many conditions making it difficult to recognize. When the onset is rapid, the symptoms are dramatic

Bev Quade Sanborn, Minnesota and severe and may include painful irritation of the heart and lung coverings, scarring rashes, destruction of blood cells and kidney damage. Because the symptoms and disease course can vary so widely in lupus, individualized, tailor-made treatment programs are essential for each person. Lupus sometimes runs in families and that may provide important clues in the genetic research that is being done. Researchers have determined that this complex disease may involve many genes that must occur in particular combinations to affect the properties and responsiveness of the immune system.
