Well, that day did finally arrive as promised, and the first magazine – although small – did make it to the printers, and yes I realize there were several mistakes.

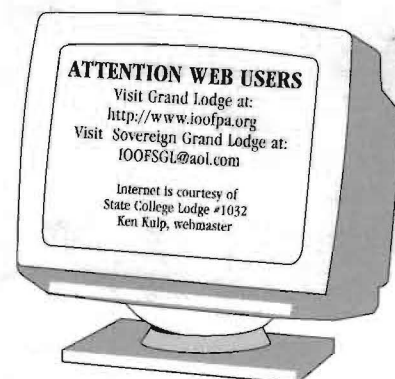

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COUNTY'S ONLY IOOF LODGE, AUXILIARY CONTINUE TO SERVE

The Mount Hor Independent Order of Odd Fellows (IOOF) No. 736 Lodge, Cassville, continues to be actively involved in a number of community-based activities, reports lodge secretary William L. Ramsey.

Recently, the lodge members welcomed a number of high-ranking IOOF officials to a membership seminar held in the former one-room Cassville school which now houses the Mount Hor Lodge.

The state IOOF leaders, many of whom came to Cassville from Middletown, shared ideas with local lodge officials and enjoyed a covered dish luncheon with members and guests. Members of the Lady Evelyn Rebekah Lodge No. 22, the ladies auxiliary to the Cassville fraternity, also participated.

"We enjoyed having the IOOF officials visit our lodge," explained Ramsey, owner/operator of Ramsey's Chain Saw Shop, Calvin. "We learned a lot from the leaders and they went away with a good understanding about some of the things we are involved in our community."

Noting that the IOOF and its ladies auxiliary continue to assist "people in need," Ramsey pointed to a number of projects and activities the local lodge supports. Some examples are eye research, youth programs, International Youth Exchange program, youth camps and recreational facilities, "Summer Music in the Park," United Nations Pilgrimage for Youth, assistance to the worthy telethons (the Arthritis Foundation and the Odd Fellow/Rebekah Child Care program in which the IOOF works with Social Services Programs), foster parents, day care and other services.

Other community-based activities in which the IOOF assists are the World Hunger and Disaster Fund, Geriatric Care and Homes for Seniors program, Arthritis Foundation and Health Care agencies and the Living Legacy Program which includes planting trees, shrubs and flower gardens in public areas and on government lands. The purpose of the involvement is to show the membership's concern for the world's environmental problems.

Proud of its "Partners in Community Service," Cassville lodge members and the "Rebekahs" are "opening doors through communication and participation," explained Ramsey. "We are striving to make our community a better place in which to live."

Another example of an important IOOF activity is Odd Fellows and Rebekahs Visual Research Foundation that focuses on a "Vision for Sight" program. Created by the Sovereign Grand Lodge of the IOOF in 1956, the legislation made possible the Odd Fellows World Eye Bank and Visual Research Foundation that continues today.

One of the major components of the program is the presentation

of the Hugh J. Bradley Distinguished Service Award that recognizes outstanding dedication and efforts in the preservation of sight. The award is given as a tribute to the memory of Hugh J. Bradley, PSGM, and first chairman of the Odd Fellows World Eye Bank and Visual Research Foundation.

"It was through his foresight and work that the order was able to establish a research chair at the Wilmer Eye Institute at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland," said Ramsey.

The Cassville lodge is also involved in a number of local activities, including the highly popular Cassville Oktoberfest, community Easter Egg Hunt, distribution of candy during Halloween, assistance with a local youth dance at the annual Oktoberfest, to mention only a few activities.

At the recent lodge session, local IOOF and Rebekah members shared information about their activities and pledged their continued involvement in future IOOF activities.

Today, the Cassville lodge is the only surviving IOOF lodge in Huntingdon County. Ramsey said that at one time there were no less than a dozen lodges in the county.

In more recent year, the local lodge and Rebekah membership were responsible for the completion of a major building improvement project at the lodge which included a 14-ft. by 38-ft. addition for a dining room and other activities. Ramsey pointed out the building has been made available to the Trough Creek Elementary School for the classes' "Odyssey of the Mind" activities.

The local lodge members, "Rebekahs" and their guests recently enjoyed their annual pig roast at the home of Scott Parks at Hares Valley.

Referred to as "one of the oldest fraternities in the world," with a worldwide membership, the IOOF movement dates back to earliest time. The Cassville lodge was given its charter Oct. 5, 1870.

Since then, the membership has continued in the tradition of their forefathers to "provide aid, assistance and comfort" to their members and their families and others in need while remaining extremely active in the community.
