PLUM CAKE

2 C Self Rising Flour, sifted
2 C Sugar
1 C Cooking Oil
1 Tsp. Cloves
1 Tsp. Cinnamon
1 Tsp. Vanilla
2 Jars Plum Baby Food
3 Eggs

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TIME TO GO!

Odd Fellows and Rebekahs are people on the move! Back and forth and around the state we go – to meetings, rallies, sessions and conclaves. And time and distance often require us to stay in a hotel.

So picture this: It's early in the morning, and you're just getting up, when suddenly, the morning's peace is shattered by the shrill ringing of the fire alarm bell! What do you do? You're told to evacuate the building, but your room is a long way above ground level. Even worse, your arthritic knees and stiff joints are rebelling against the thought of walking down, and possibly, back up, all those steps. What do you do?

Many of us face this dilemma the year that Session was held in Wilkes-Barre, PA. When the alarm went off, early that morning, many of us left the building as quickly as possible. Many, but not all of us. Some people chose to stay put and no amount of coaxing could persuade them to leave. After all, who say any flames?

Oh, how lucky can you get? The fire was in an air conditioner on the roof and the smoke blew in the open hall windows, and set off the smoke alarms.

Why lucky? Because five other big hotels, scattered across the country, had fires that year; each with considerable loss of life! When the insurance company investigated the reason for so many lives lost, they made two astonishing discoveries. First, in every case, none of the victims had made any effort to leave the building. Even more astonishing, in each case the fire was nowhere near their part of the hotel! How then, did all these people die?

The answer lies in what is called "smoke inhalation." Most plastics and man-made fibers found in carpets, curtains, bed linens, clothing, etc., emit poisonous gases when burning. In the cases just mentioned, these "silent killers" drifted throughout the entire hotel by means of the ventilating system. (All hotels have ventilating systems.) Dead was quiet, but thorough.

These findings should serve as a wake-up call the next time any of us hear a fire alarm bell. If tempted to "wait and see," remember, "waiting is dangerous." Instead, think to yourself, "time to go" and evacuate for safety and your life!

The 2003 Tour has been completed and we are pleased to report that 346 delegates, 20 Bus Tour Leaders and 6 New York Staff participated in the 54th Annual Pilgrimage. We welcomed delegates from 5 European countries and 48 jurisdictions from across North America. We would especially thank Walker Lodge in Philadelphia for their continuing support and the Jurisdictions of Ontario, Massachusetts and District of Columbia for sponsorships of meals, tours and lodging during the 2003 Tour. We would also thank the many members and Lodges for their donations toward meals and lodgings for this Tour.

This coming year, the 55th Annual Tour, will be one of renewal and teamwork. I look forward to working with the jurisdictions to make this Program a project in which we can take great pride and one that the young delegates will consider a highlight of their life. It is our goal to increase the number of delegates by having at least one delegate from every North American jurisdiction and to expand the representation from our European jurisdictions. Your contributions, large or small will allow us to expand this Program as one of the best educational experiences for young people in our respective areas.

BECKY'S BACKYARD

1. When warming individual items in the microwave, try placing them in a paper coffee filter. It's great for doughnuts, rolls and pastries. You can eat the treat right out of the filter, and have no dishes to wash.
2. When making stuffed cabbage rolls, cook the whole head of cored cabbage in the microwave for about 15 minutes. The cabbage leaves will be cooked and ready to roll up when you're done preparing the meat mixture.
3. To drain the fat after browning ground beef, remove the pan from the heat and use a spatula to push the meat to one side. Carefully tip the empty side of the pan over, allowing the fat to drain from the meat. Then use a turkey baster to remove the fat from the pan.
4. For a speedy surprise, add 1/2 cup of broken sugar frosted cornflakes to your dough when making oatmeal cookies. It adds an unexpected crunch.
5. To keep peanut butter and jelly sandwiches from getting soggy, spread peanut butter on both slices of bread and then spread on the jelly. Peanut butter doesn't allow the jelly soak through to the bread.
