ORCHARD MANOR PLANS ALZHEIMER'S UNIT

When Florence O'Patchen resident of Orchard Manor and president of the Residents' Council, inquired about having flowers outside her window, her request was honored, times 80. The maintenance department quickly made flower boxes and installed them on every Resident's window, as well as on the windows which cover two full walls in the dining room. Diane Robinson, NHA, Administrator, states that, "the idea was perfect with the expansion/renovation project Orchard Manor is undertaking. While many residents will enjoy watching the activity and progress outside with the bulldozers and other equipment as our Alzheimer/Dementia Wing and Personal Care Units are built, residents will also see the beautiful flowers growing outside their windows." The window box plan also coincided with National Nursing Home Week when all staff received a plant labeled "Orchard Manor is Growing," followed by an employee meeting during which the details of the project were unveiled to staff members.

Ligo Architects of Slippery Rock designed Orchard Manor's project around the home's commitment to Resident care and the homey atmosphere the nursing home is known for. The renovation of one wing into an Alzheimer/Dementia unit is top priority, and is scheduled to open within the next few months. The unit will offer state of the art Nursing and Therapeutic care to Residents with Alzheimer's disease and other forms of Dementia. Local chapters of the Alzheimer's Association will assist in training staff members and establishing programs to enhance each resident's quality of life.

Phase II of the project, which will carry over into 2003, involves



the creation of personal care/assisted living. Again, Lee Ligo created the addition to be as home-like as possible with the goal being to enable those seeking personal care to undergo a smooth transition into their new home. Orchard Manor's personal care will provide spacious private and semi-private rooms with Dining, Lounge and garden areas separate from the Skilled Nursing Facility. Orchard Manor's Board of Directors has planned and worked on the project for ten years to create a continuum of care that facilitates every aspect of an individual's transition from independent to assisted living, to skilled care. Administrator Robinson states that, "the slow and steady pace of the project has enabled each and every decision to be made based on what is best for our Residents, which is typical of our Home, and is what has enabled us to earn our reputation in the community as a trusted caregiver and employer. The excitement of the long-awaited project is shared by the Residents and their families, staff and Board of Directors, as everyone watches with anticipation the flowers and our home grow."

TOURNAMENT RULES

1. All bowlers must be members in good standing of the Independent Order of Oddfellows or Rebekahs, or their spouses. Members must present a valid dues card at check-in. Any violation of this rule shall invalidate your entry, and no refunds will be given after times are scheduled.
2. All bowlers must use their highest final 2001-2002 ABC/WIBC/YABA sanctioned average (minimum 21 games). If their current season average, as of December 31, 2002, is ten or more pins higher, the current average must be used. Those without an average from 2001-2002 or the current season will be assigned an average of 150 for men and 140 for women. Team captains should verify all averages with the local association secretary. Handicap is 80% based on a 210 scratch.
3. All bowlers with established memberships in the ABC/WIBC, prior to participation in this tournament, will be provided with high score protection. All others may, at their option, purchase an affiliate membership card prior to bowling, as per ABC/WIBC rules.
4. Bowlers entering Doubles and Singles must bowl in both events. No one may participate in any event more than once.
5. 100% of the money in the prize fund will be paid out to the participants in that event. At least one prize per ten entries will be paid out in team, doubles and singles; at least one prize per twenty entries will be paid out in all-events.
6. Failure to use a correct average shall disqualify the score if the submitted average is lower than the correct average, resulting in more handicap. Prize winnings shall be based on the submitted average if it is higher than the correct average. Corrections in average are permitted up to the completion of the first game of a series. Tournament management reserves the right to re-rate any entrant prior to bowling. If the entrant refuses the re-rate, entry fees will be refunded.
7. ABC/WIBC Rule 319d (Reporting Prior Prize Winnings) and ABC/WIBC Rule 319e (Average Adjustment for Entry) are waived.
8. Entrants should check in thirty (30) minutes prior to their scheduled shift. Tardy bowlers will receive a score of zero (0) for all frames missed.

GOOD JOB!

Congratulation - Good job! I received my Penna. Odd Fellow and Rebekah Magazine on October 16 and have read it cover to cover. Being a Rebekah for fifty-five years, reading about their activities or seeing a familiar face provides lots of reminiscing.

In January 1947, I joined Abigail Lodge #210 in Lebanon, served in all the Chairs and was Treasurer when we consolidated in 1996 with Susannah Lodge #247 in Harrisburg.

I was District Deputy for six Rebekah Assembly Presidents, was on our Rebekah Home Board from '57 to '74 when our Sisters were given permanent residence, due to the flooding in Harrisburg, were transferred to the Odd Fellow Home in Middletown. I served on the Rebekah Assembly finance committee for nine presidents.

During the late '90s, I developed health problems. Being a widow, my daughter Linda encouraged me to move and be closer to her here in California. She had a home built for me in Nipomo, only ten minutes away from her in Arroyo Grande!

I kept my membership with Susannah Lodge but became an Associate member of Acme Rebekah Lodge #198 in Santa Maria. They too have problems getting members to attend meetings. Several of the ladies have joined the mens lodge to give them support as they own the building.
