Ruth McClintic, a member of Tussey Rebekah Lodge #66, Boalsburg, celebrated her 100th birthday on Sunday, January 5, 2003 at the Mt. Nittany High Rise apartments in State College with family and friends attending.

She was born on January 2, 1903 on a farm in Centre Hill, PA, Centre County, the daughter of Bruce and Effie Ripka. She was the oldest of six children and has a sister and a brother still living.

Ruth married Roy McClintic on September 1, 1923 and together they celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. Her husband died in 1984. They had two children, a son who is deceased and a daughter, Margaret Mattern, living in the State College area.

The family moved to State College in 1936. Ruth joined Lady State Rebekah Lodge #322 in State College on April 25, 1946 and later joined Tussey Rebekah Lodge #66, Boalsburg, of which she is still a member and has always been a very faithful Rebekah.

Ruth was employed in private households; cooked at a fraternity during World War II for servicemen; and was with the State College Area School District in the cafeteria for over 20 years. She was the treasurer for St. John's Methodist Church in State College for 42-1/2 years and "never lost a penny."

She belonged to many women's organizations, was an avid fan of auto racecar driver, Dale Earnhart, Sr.; a fan of Pittsburgh Pirates baseball team, and Penn State and State College High School football teams. She enjoys puzzle books, crocheting, sewing, embroidery work and socializing with people. She is a very caring and loving person.

Commended Students placed among the top five percent of more than one million students who entered the 2003 competition by taking the 2001 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test.

ODD FELLOWS RECOGNIZE MEMBERS FOR YEARS OF SERVICE

On February 15, 2003, an awards banquet was held at Charlie's Pub and Grille to honor four members for their outstanding service. All four received a beautiful plaque designed with a blue scroll on wood with gold lettering. William Moore, current Noble Grand of the International Order of Odd Fellows Hopkins Lodge #87 in Bristol, signed each plaque.

The award for his outstanding service as treasurer went to Maurice Wildman. In recognition for his many years of service as Secretary the award was presented to Richard Winslow. Both of these men have been active members since 1935. The next award went to Walter Garretson for his many years of outstanding service, which began in 1929. The last award was presented to Milton Miller, a past Noble Grand, for his untiring efforts to further the Odd Fellows. Mrs. Miller joined in 1959. Dave Bradstock did a splendid job as toastmaster for the evening.

The Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Hopkins Lodge #87, began in Bristol 160 years ago. Their purpose is to improve and celebrate the character of mankind while striving to make the world a better place in which to live.

The emblem of the Odd Fellows is three links in red, white and blue. These three links symbolize the chain that binds the members that a fraternity is strongest when joined together. Each link has a letter. The first is white with the letter "F" for 'Friendship,' the strongest bond of fraternity that teaches good will and harmony. A blue link is in the middle holding an "L." This represents love, the basis for all life's ambitions, service to others and to family. The last link is red holding a "T." This represents truth, the standard by which we value people and the together and illustrates foundation of our society.

The Odd Fellows or Oddfellows are second only to the Free Masons as a long-established and reasonably healthy fraternal organization. The date the organization was founded is unclear but it is presumed to be sometime prior to 1745 in England when the first recorded Lodge of Odd Fellows, "Loyal Aristarchus Number 9," was founded. This lodge met at various London taverns, including the Oakley Arms in Southwark, the Globe in Hatton Garden and the Boar's Head in Smithfield. Dues were a penny a meeting. King George IV, while Prince of Wales, was unceremoniously admitted one night and became a member around 1780. This is the first authentic reference to the society of Odd Fellows by

name. In America, Thomas Wildey created the Washington Lodge, Number 1, on April 26, 1819. During the succeeding decades the organization quickly grew throughout the United States. Today the worldwide membership counts over 1,200,000. Their main purpose is providing financial assistance to students beyond high school. It also recognizes individuals with an Outstanding Person Award for service to humanity.

Most of the current members of the Bristol Lodge originally came from Bristol; however, now they live in Edgely, Fairless Hills, Bristol Township, Levittown, Langhorne and Yardley as well as Bristol. There are 38 active members who range in age from 49 to 93. The breakdown is as follows: 1 age 49; 5 in their 60s; 16 in their 70s; 12 in their 80s and 3 over 90 years old.

The Odd Fellows sponsor a scholarship at Bristol High School and offer donations to the Police Department and various charities; such as, the Arthritis Foundation and Alzheimer's Research. Their international women's auxiliary is called the "Rebekah Assemblies."

Current officers are Noble Grand, William W. Moore; vice Grand David Bradstock; Secretary, Livio J. Ruggieri; Financial Secretary, Walter Guy James; and Treasurer, James Reed.
