75 YEARS AGO

(May 1928) CHARLEROI

The new 60,000 Lodge home of Charleroi Lodge No. 1030 was used as a meeting place by the lodge for the first time on April 5, with a suitable observance of the occasion and the ceremony of installation, members and visitors numbering 150 being in attendance, among them being John Crawford, the oldest member of the lodge present. Following installation, speeches were made by the District Deputy Grand Master and members of his staff and others.

The lodge is planning a big demonstration when the hall is dedicated, which is expected to be some time in May, although at time of writing the date has not been set. Among the features for this occasion will be a parade and gala events.

Work on the new building was begun on September 28, 1927, and was completed last month. The building is a three story

business block, containing eight apartments, the lodge rooms, social rooms and ante-rooms.
