

REFLECTIONS

An Autobiographical Glimpse of My Life In the I.O.O.F. Orphanage in Sunbury, Pennsylvania

The following story has been submitted by Brother Bob Betzer of Lewisburg who was raised in the Support Home. The article was written by one of his childhood buddies who grew up at the Home with him. Bob felt the article best described life in an Odd Fellows Opphanage. Due to the size of the article and wonderful pictures submitted, we will be breaking it up over the next several months. I hope you enjoy the history.

PART 1

I was born in the small town of Trevorton, Pennsylvania on October 19, 1918. My father was Samuel Norman Leffler, my mother was Edna L. Batman. My father worked in the North

Franklin Colliery, which was a coal company a couple miles south of the town. My mother was just a homemaker. I was the third son born, the first born son died in infancy, shortly after I was born. The second son born was my brother Donald V. Leffler.

When I was four months old, my father became ill at work and was brought home in an ambulance. A doctor attended to him, but in those days the medical profession was not very good at diagnosing his illness. As it turned out, my father died within three days. The doctor told my mother he died of a burst bowel.



It is my opinion that he died from appendix rupture. Not much was known in those days about this condition.

For the next three years, my mother went to work in a silk mill and managed to keep our family up keep. In those days, there was no welfare like there is at the present. My father was a member of a service organization called the I.O.O.F., which is called the Independent Order of Oddfellows. This organization supported an Orphanage in

Sunbury, Pennsylvania, which happened to be about 11 miles from Trevorton.

After three years of working and trying to make a decent living, my mother, along with advice from family and friends, decided to put my brother and I in this Orphanage.


I was just three years old and my brother was five years old. This happened on the 14th of May in the year 1922. I can just imagine the agony my mothers went through in making this decision, but I think in the long run it was the best thing to do under the circumstances. Many stories have been written about Orphanages, but I can only talk about my own experiences.

The orthanage was a large complex of buildings joined together. One side was for the girls, the other side was for the boys, and the center was for the administrators. These main buildings were for children eight years old and older. Across the road was what had been a large farm house before the Odd Fellows took it over. This building was known as the annex. This is where children three years old and up to eight years old were housed. I can vaguely remem-

ber the day I was taken there. I remember sitting on the floor crying my eyes out. I can't remember getting much sympathy from the house mother (we called them care-takers).

It is our pleasure and honor to be invited to enjoy opening day with these amazing young people.

Green Tomatoes Parmesan

3 medium green tomatoes, sliced 1/4 inch thick

1/4 cup cornmeal

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon dried oregano

1 egg, beaten

Salt

1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

3/4 teaspoon garlic salt

1/4 teaspoon pepper

1/4 cup vegetable oil

Lightly sprinkle tomatoes with salt; drain on paper towels for 30-60 minutes. Meanwhile, combine commeal, Parmesan, flour, garlic salt, oregano, and pepper in a shallow plate. Dip each tomato slice into egg, then into commeal mixture. In a medium skillet, heat oil over medium - high heat. Fry tomatoes, a few at a time, for two minutes per side or until brown. Drain on a paper towel-lined wire rack. Serve immediately. Yield: 4-6 servings.

Ham and Cheese Crescent Roll-Up

1 can (8 oz.) can Pillsbury refrigerated crescent rolls 4 thin slices Cheddar cheese (4 oz.) each cut into 4 strips 8 thin slices cooked ham (8 oz.)

1. Heat oven to 350. Separate dough into 8 triangles. Place 1 piece of ham on each triangle; place 2 strips of cheese down center of ham. Fold in edges of ham to match shape of dough triangle. 2. Roll up each crescent, ending at a tip of the triangle. Place with tips down on ungreased cookie sheet. 3. Bake 15 to 19 minutes or until golden brown. Immediately remove from cookie sheet. Serve

Orange Sauce for Angel Food Cake

2 cups water 1 pkg. (3.4 oz.) instant vanilla pudding mix 3/4 cup orange juice concentrate 1 cup shipped topping 1 prepared angel food cake, sliced

In a mixing bowl, combine water, orange juice concentrate, and pudding. Beat on low until mixed; beat on high for 2 minutes. Whisk in whipped topping. Spoon over cake slices. Store leftovers in the refrigerator. Yield: 4 cups sauce.
