

MANOR SHOWS OFF RENOVATIONS

\$4 million project features 25-bed Alzheimer's Unit

In its quest to continue its high standard of care and keep up with the changes in the healthcare field, Orchard Manor recently completed a \$4 million construction and renovation project that began in May.

The staff at the Pine Township facility celebrated at an open house Friday, where tours, a string quartet from Slippery Rock University and refreshments were available for

visitors to enjoy.

"(The project) has been on the agenda for the last 10 years to try to meet the market demand for services," said Diane Robinson, administrator. "I would say the actual planning was three years, with a full year spent meeting with other facilities and staff members."

The result is a 25-bed Alzheimer's/dementia unit called Sunshine Way, 14-bed personal care unit, expanded solariums on each unit and new nurse manager offices. New lighting was installed in resident rooms and in the hallways, and the four bathing rooms were completely refurbished.

Designed by Ligo Architects, Slippery Rock, it was the first renovation project since Orchard Manor opened in

1976.

Along with professional designers, Robinson said she felt it was important to get input from the nursing home staff.

"We had an employee meeting, and just about everyone had an opportunity to submit what they thought should be done," Robinson said. "The people who knew the home best knew what changes we needed, and just about every one of them was addressed.

One of the suggestions for Sunshine Way came from a conversation Robinson had with the maintenance director. He visited another nursing facility and didn't like the feel of the institutional hallway that abruptly ended.

Robinson went home and sketched out the idea of a round room.

"I thought if it was all glass, the people could wander all they want in a safe environment and look out the windows," Robinson said. The way the room is designed, Alzheimer's patients, who are known to wander, can walk down the hallway and continue around the room to proceed back up the hall.

It was one of the mid-project changes that Robinson presented to the architect.

"They were very respectful of all the changes. He said, 'OK, let me see what I can do," Robinson said. Even after construction started on the round room, Robinson asked for further changes to extend the eight-foot ceiling.

"It's beautiful," she said. "The room is very simple. We have to remember we're not decorating for staff or family. It's for Alzheimer's residents. This is a group that likes to walk, so there's not a lot of clutter."

Safety was important, so the unit has locked cupboards and blinds without cords.

Because it can be very confusing for Alzheimer's patients to leave the facility, family is welcome to join their loved one for dinner. Dining is in a family-like atmosphere.

The decor features three-dimensional artwork that stimulates the sense of touch — a textured straw hat, denim clothing, a ladybug — with the hope it will evoke happy memories.

Along with the special surroundings, Sunshine Way has a higher staff to patient ratio to meet the patients' extra needs. The staff was specially trained for working with Alzheimer's patients.

During the building phase, the contractor, Uhl Construction from Allison Park, took great time and expense to partition off the construction areas to keep noise and dust

levels to a minimum.

The Pennsylvania Department of Health conducted numerous inspections during construction, as did Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare, Mercer County Area Agency on Aging and OSHA.

"The safety, welfare and comfort of our residents remained our number one priority and was never compro-

mised," Robinson said.


Sunshine Way opened in July and is now about half full. The personal care residence opened last week, and Orchard Manor staff members are going through a lengthy waiting list to fill the beds.
