NEWS FROM MT. HOR LODGE #736

What has Mt. Hor been up to lately? I hear this question all the time when we visit other lodges. Since work has slowed for the winter I finally have time to drop a few lines and tell everyone that Mt. Hor has been busy as usual.

First, on Aug. 8th, we had our first visit from the Grand Master in many years. Grand Master Schlott ventured out into the backwoods of Central Pa. We had our regular lodge meeting then Grand Master gave a small talk on our order while ending the pleasant night over a hot meal. Grand Master Schlott and his family decided to spend the night at brother Jack Keller's house so as to attend our annual pig roast the next day. Myself and brother Rodney Ramsey started the pig around 7:00 A.M. It came out of the roaster about 1:30 P.M. We had fresh sweet corn, all kinds of covered dishes, homemade barbeque sauce and all kinds of dessert. A moon bounce was rented for the kids and must say that they had a blast in it. A few adults (including myself) ventured in it to be quickly reminded of how out of shape we really were. The afternoon was spent socializing with each other. Grand Master Schlott was heard saying that this was what Odd Fellowship was all about and it is. Late afternoon we decided to break out the horseshoes. After teams were made and the playing began the brothers realized we had a real pro in our ranks. The president of the Rebekah Assembly started cleaning house. Tammy Schlott can play a mean game of horseshoes. She won every game but the last. It started pouring rain and the final game was called because of inclement weather. Mt. Hor really enjoyed the Grand Master and his family's visit. They commented on how we have to travel at least thirty minutes to a grocery store and forty-five minutes to a WALMART. In fine fashion, we installed all of our districts offices with only a few mistakes (learning experiences) in just a few short weeks.

Last, we were installed on Oct. 24, by Waterfall Lodge. To answer the next question that I always hear. What has Mr. Hor got coming up in the future? Lots of fun and charitable events for the year ahead. I'm sure you'll hear about them in future issues. Mt. Hor wishes all the lodges a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

A recent decision of the Uniontown committee in charge of arrangements for the annual meeting of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania in that city June 3-6 was that a parade is to be held and lodges from all parts of the state are to be invited to participate. Pittsburgh Canton will lead the parade, which will be under the direction of J.H. Asendorf, who has been chosen grand marshal. Brothers J.J. McCann, O.C. Brown, I.C. Sutton, William Fox and C.W. Wyatt have been selected as aides.

Other arrangements already completed included a contract for decorating which was given to a firm that in 1928 decorated for Uniontown's various conventions. Contracts have also been made for the convention badges.

The convention committee is comprised of representatives from all lodges in Fayette County. Carl H. Persun is general chairman.

HARRISON GRAHAM IN NEW LOCATION

Harrison Graham Encampment No. 116, will be located in Rochester, Pa., from January 1, and will meet in the I.O.O.F. Building on the second and fourth Friday of each month. 












BOYERTOWN LODGE #708 CELEBRATES 100 YEARS

The initial step in forming Boyertown Lodge #708 I.O.O.F. was taken on November 12, 1903 when 20 men journeyed to Douglassville where they were initiated into the order by Monocacy Lodge #441. Then on the afternoon of December 19, 1903, the first lodge meeting in Boyertown was held in Grim's Hall located on South Reading Avenue opposite the town hall.

District Deputy Grand Master C.H. Hine of the third district of Berks County, by proclamation of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, presided at the meeting for the purpose of instituting Boyertown Lodge #708. Hines was assisted by members of the following lodges: Monocacy Lodge #441, Sinking Spring Lodge #660, Griesemersville Lodge #1109, Manatawny Lodge #214, Madison Lodge #466, Mt. Penn Lodge #518 and Birdsboro Lodge #514.

At this meeting, the lodge charter was presented to the 24 charter members of Boyertown Lodge #708. During the afternoon



session of the first meeting the officers were nominated, elected and installed. Eighteen applications for membership were received at this afternoon session.

During the evening session of this first meet-

ing, two more applications were accepted and the Mt. Penn degree team conferred degrees on 15 new members. It was at this meeting that Tuesday evening was selected as the regular meeting night, and it has remained as such to the present time. Boyertown Lodge #708 continued to grow during the following years until its first major setback, as did all of Boyertown in 1908, with the Opera House fire. Eleven lodge members and seven wives of lodge members died in the fire. From its 24 charter members the lodge grew to a total of 368 members in 1928.

Since then a lot of Odd Fellows have come and gone, the town of Boyertown has changed but Boyertown Lodge #708 still remains. The Lodge and its members are still serving the community and its people. On Saturday, November 22, 2003, the lodge and its members celebrated its 100th birthday with a banquet for more than 80 people.

Following the banquet, Noble Grand Ronald Gerhart presented Brothers Alton Schmoyer and Roy Kindig, each with a plaque for outstanding service above and beyond their duty to the lodge. This



was followed by a program that included the Mayor of Boyertown, Mary Ann Deery, who presented Noble Grand Ron Gerhart with a



proclamation for 100 years of service to the community. Next the Honorable Dennis Leh, Representative to the State of PA and the Honorable Michael O'Pake, PA State Senator, each presented Noble Grand Ron Gerhart with a proclamation for their service to the community for the past 100 years. The program was topped off with the Sovereign Grand Master, the Honorable Henry L. "Hank" Dupray, as the keynote speaker. SGM Dupray presented Boyertown Lodge #708, with a Charting the Course Award, for their 100 years of service to the Order and the community. After the presentation, Sovereign Grand Master Dupray spoke about his program (if he gets to see this, he would say our program not his) Charting the Course Toward Unity. He also laid out his project for the Odd Fellow Village in Cambodia, for orphaned children and children with aids.

After the formal program everyone enjoyed a public dance and



refreshment (all free) in the Boyertown Lodge #708 auditorium, hosted by Noble Grand Ron Gerhart. Sovereign Grand Master Dupray refused to leave until he had met and talked to all present, he got up at 3 AM on Saturday

morning to fly to Allentown, PA, where he was picked up and brought to the Boyertown Lodge Hall for a lunch of White Pizza (his favorite).
