BIRD WATCHING TIPS

February is National Bird Feeding Month, so what better time to grab a pair of binoculars and take a gander at the birds in your yard? While bird watching may seem like a no-brainer, there are some things you can do to maximize your enjoyment of the experience.

- 1. Dress to blend in with your surroundings.
- 2. Find a good hiding spot.
- 3. Use a good pair of binoculars.
- 4. Take along a pencil and a checklist of the names of species found in your region.
- 5. Keep a bird guide book handy. Study it ahead-of-time.
- 6. When you look at a bird, note the following characteristics:
 - color
 - size
 - shape
 - wing and head markings
- 7. Always observe a bird first and then refer to your notes, as the bird may be gone when you look again.
- 8. Be prepared to wait a spell. Bird watching is not for the impatient.



A RECIPE FOR THE BIRDS

- 1. Cut a long length of yarn or ribbon and tie it around the top of a pine cone.
- 2. Mix 1/2 cup vegetable shortening (or lard) with 2-1/2 cups cornmeal (or oats) until well blended. Optional: add small pieces of dried fruit or chopped nuts.
- Using a craft stick, apply the mixture to the pine cone. Make sure to press it in to all the little nooks and crannies!
- 4. Roll the pinecone in birdseed.
- 5. Hang the bird feeder on a tree and enjoy bird watching!

MEETINGS ON DELTA QUEEN RECALL THE PAST

It's a SMALL, SMALL WORLD!

In June, Lady Reta and I took our 22nd cruise on the legendary Paddlewheel Steamboat **DELTA QUEEN.**

On this trip from New Orleans to Pensacola, FL, we had some very unusual meetings with people we had never met before.

One day at lunch a couple joined us and introduced themselves as the McCurleys from New Castle, PA.

I told them that a long time ago, in October 1939, I was a member of the Pennsylvania Future Farmers of America Band which was the official band for the National FFA Convention in Kansas City, MO. And, I said, our chaperone was Eli Wiggins from New Castle.

Raymond McCurley replied: "Eli Wiggins was a neighbor of ours and he was one of my high school teachers. And," he added, "my brother Willis played trombone in that band."

How do you top a meeting like that?

At the Steamboatin' Society party I mentioned we were from Fleetwood, PA. Mrs. Frank Collins Jr. of Manville, NJ, came over to us and said her husband was born in Hamburg, PA, but left there before high school. Frank then joined us.

He asked whether we knew any of the Freemans from Hamburg and Reta said "My mother was a Freeman."

"Did you know James and Annetta Freeman?" he said.

When Reta told him they were her uncle and aunt, Frank said: "They were my God parents."

But story doesn't end there. Frank said the couple they shared a table with for dinner were Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Fetherolf, of California, but Ralph was born in Kempton, PA, and lived there prior to World War II. We met Ralph and he said he rode the Berksy Railroad to Slatington to go to school and played in the Ringgold Band before leaving Berks County.

When I asked where he lives in California, he said a small town. Do you know where San Bernardino is?

Of course we do. Reta and I were married on an Army base just outside of San Bernardino.

Then Ralph mentioned San Pedro, CA, and I said I spent four weeks at Fort McArthur, at San Pedro, waiting for an assignment. He said he played in the Army band at Fort MacArthur. He said that was at the start of the war.

So I asked him whether he knew Floyd Cooper.

He gave me a shocked look and asked "You mean a clarinet player?" And when I said yes, he said he was our supply sergeant. Well Floyd Cooper was transferred from that band to the 768th AAF Band at Spokane,

ODD FELLOW - REBEKAH EDUCATION FUND

The Odd Fellow-Rebekah Education Fund provides educational awards to descendents of members of our Order. The number varies each year, due to income from interests and contributions from lodges and individuals.

The Education Fund is a joint effort, started in 1993. It was a project of Past Grand Master Edward Binkley. It has grown and prospered through the years. This year, 2005, twenty-six awards of \$500.00 were given.

The rules have basically remained the same as proposed by PGM Binkley and committee. The original rules may be found in the Session Journal of 1993.

The eligibility is limited to the families of Odd Fellow and Rebekahs. Those who are eligible are: the sons and daughters, grandsons and granddaughters, step children, step grand children, and of course members of the Order. Nieces and nephews are not eligible.

Odd Fellows and Rebekahs may nominate more than one child or grandchild. They may nominate in more than one year. The recipient of the award may apply more than one year.

The only exception to being nominated by a family member is this: if a member of the Order becomes deceased and has children of school age, his/her lodge may, as a lodge, nominate the child or children. (It may be considered as an obligation.)

Those eligible are nominated on a form provided by Grand Lodge in the November mailing from that office. After the committee receives the form, an application is sent to the nominee in the following mail. From there the student then has the responsibility to see that the application is completed and mailed by the deadline.

The day for the nomination form to be received is March 5 of the year in which the award is given. The applications must be postmarked on or before March 15.

After the applications are received, they are copied and mailed to the committee members. The committee reads and rates the application according to selected areas and scale. They then meet in April. The date varies according to the date of Easter. The committee compares and selects a number of awardees. The number is determined by the amount of finances available. A number of "alternates" is selected to receive awards if by June 30 money is available. They are rated numerically in the order they may receive an award.

The applications are rated on completeness and neatness of the answers. Apparent financial need is considered. As a part of the application, an essay is required. The subject of the essay is given in the application. Most applicants exceed the length and content minimum. The essay is required to be typed.

Scores on the ACT and SAT as well as grades from the past semester are considered and evaluated. The SAT scores will be on a new scale for 2006, as the test has been revised. Students who took the test prior to 2005 will have a different score. The committee will note it.

Community, school, and other activities such as work record are considered to insure the student is a well rounded individual. Also considered is the time between the application is mailed to the student and the time it is received by the committee.

As in all times when choices have to be made, individuals on the committee may differ. It is difficult to make the selections. We have a large number of applicants each year, most are excellent. The selections are based on our hones opinions.

The committee consists of three people: two Odd Fellow, appointed for two years, alternately and one Rebekah.

The funds come from investments set aside for that purpose. Also, contributions from the Homes, Lodges, and individuals may be made for the current years funds. The more received from all sources, the more students can be given help.
