FOUR SVHS STUDENTS CHOSEN FOR UNITED NATIONS YOUTH PILGRIMAGE

Each summer for 50 years, the Independent Order of Odd Fellows (I.O.O.F.) and Rebekahs have sponsored all-expense paid, educational, two-week trips that bring together high school students from around the world to study and learn about the United Nations. High school students 16 to 17 years of age with at least one year of high school remaining are invited to apply for the trip by submitting an essay on a topic related to the United Nations. Applicants are judged on leadership, character, interest in world affairs, concern for community welfare, and general fitness.

Through fundraising efforts and donations, local lodges of I.O.O.F. and Rebekahs fund the entire cost of the trip, including bus transportation, meals, lodging, and sightseeing and provide each student with spending money. This year, the bus departed from Middletown, PA., for a two-week tour that included Ontario, Canada, with excursions to Canadian Parliament buildings and Niagara Falls, and to New York City with a behind-the-scenes tour of the United Nations and visits to the Empire State Building, Rockefeller Center, St. Patrick's Cathedral, the Statue of Liberty, Ground Zero, and a Broadway play. The trip culminated in Philadelphia, PA, with visits to Independence Hall, the Liberty Bell, the Betsy Ross' house, and other historical buildings. During each pilgrimage, students compete for a \$1,000 cash scholarship by giving speeches on a question affecting the world.

SV students Annie Cieniewicz, Wendi Eaton, Lindsey Minguez, and Katie Scheidt participated in this year's trip July 9-20. They

extend their appreciation to Mr. Nevin W. Adams, local chairperson for the United Nations pilgrimage, and to the members of the local I.O.O.F. and Rebekahs for providing this wonderful opportunity to establish new friendships with teens from other communities and to gain a different insight and perspective into America's place in the global community.

Notes from the Desk of the P.R.A. and Travels on the "Rebekah Trail" I.O.O.F. BUILDING RESTORED — HISTORY REPEATS ITSELF

The Sterling, Wayne County, PA I.O.O.F. Hall was built in 1887 to provide a permanent home for Sterling Lodge No. 959. The Lodge was instituted in September 187 and for several years the meetings were held on the second floor of the village store, until the building was completed.

The first Noble Grand was a Methodist minister by name Daniel Bortree, an ancestor of the current Rebekah Assembly President, Doris M. Bortree Goerlitz. In February 1925, Alfred D. Bortree, father of Doris, was initiated into Sterling Lodge No. 959 and remained a member until his death in 1962. He served as Noble Grand and was on the installing team for the various I.O.O.F. Lodges through Wayne County.

In 1972, in the above pictured building, Doris M. Bortree Goerlitz was initiated as a member of Lady Hamlin, which in 1980 consolidated with Ladies of Paupack No. 559 in Newfoundland.

Unfortunately, the I.O.O.F. Lodge No. 959 became defunct and the building fell into disrepair as shown above. Through a long,



traumatic process, significant items were removed – a portion of our village history lost, however not totally.

History is repeating itself! The building has been restored through the efforts of many, who themselves were part of the Rebekah-Oddfellowship or whose parents were active members of the Order.

The Historians of Sterling Township became own-



ers of the building through negotiations with Grand Lodge. During the approximately ten years of transition, restoration has become a "labor of love," with amazing results — a stable building, exterior restored, interior refurbished, and memorabilia, including donated pictures, articles, etc. of I.O.O.F., for display on second and first floors. The first open house was held in June 2005 with about 100 attendees; and your current Rebekah Assembly President, on September 24, 2005, sold raffle tickets to H.O.S.T. members for the support of her projects — Camp JRA and the United Nations Pilgrimage for Youth.

In the village of Sterling Rebekah-Oddfellowship is remembered and in another manner being promoted. **HISTORY DOES REPEAT ITSELF!**

UNCERTAINTY, UNEXPECTED MAKE STEAMBOATING EXCITING

Do you remember that old TV commercial that said "It's not nice to fool Mother Nature."

Well Mother Nature, using the name Katrina, blew into the Gulf Coast and changed the steamboating plans of Brig. Gen. Leon S. Stamm, Department Commander, and Sister Laudine; and Lady Reta and I.

We were scheduled to cruise on the Steamboat Delta Queen for eight nights from Nashville, TN to Mobile, AL, starting September 3.

At first, we were told the trip was a go. Then we were told we would go by boat to Demopolis, AL. And the day before our departure we were informed we would be going from Nashville to Cincinnati, OH. Of course, we had flight reservations to return home from Mobile but we were assured all changes would be handled by the Steamboat company.

So we flew to Nashville on Sept. 3, were greeted at the airport and escorted to the bus for the trip to the boat. The bus headed for Nashville, and then went around Nashville, and pretty soon Nashville was far behind us. We got to the board at Clarksville, TN, which was to be our first stop. We spent a night there and then got back on schedule the second day. Construction at Nashville prevented the boat from getting to the port there.

We are happy to report that crew members who live in New Orleans told us their families had all been evacuated and were safe. They of course had no idea of the fate of their homes.

From the dining room staff, Lionel (Choo Choo) Palmer was scheduled to be married the weekend the storm hit, with Lord Byron Lambert as best man. The ceremony was postponed.

And speaking of the dining room, old friend Lloyd Camel is back as maitre'd, after several years' absence.

Sister Avalion Bossler's favorite caliope player, Jazzou Jones, was on board as the steamboating director.

And a very attractive addition to the crew is one of the pilots, Capt. Lisa Streckfus. Her family has been in the riverboat business for more than a century and she is a graduate of King's Point academy with a marine engineering degree.

We hasten to add that all of the other lady crew members are also very attractive. They include Hotel Manager Amy Wilkinson, Chief Purser Teresa Ebeling, Second Mate Angela Shackelford, Riverlorian "Toots" Maloy and entertainer Annie Lebeaux.

Incidentally, Annie tells me that due to a switch in the boat schedule she was unable to produce the shows at Hershey Park this summer but she will be back doing her thing in Pennsylvania on her weeks off from the boat next year.

By Thursday of our cruise, all of our air travel for the return home had been scheduled by the boat company without our having to lift a finger.

Then on Friday Capt. Mike Williams announced that we were ahead of schedule so he decided to make an unplanned stop in Louisville, KY. And that was the start of my most unusual experience in 23 steamboat trips.

I walked out on the wharf, ahead of the boat, to get a shot of the boat and the city's skyline. The sun was in my lens. Over there was a pillar which I could use to shade the lens.

As I approached the pillar I stepped in something slick on the wharf and went flying into the Ohio River. I didn't even touch the wharf on my way in.

When I surfaced I was at least ten feet off the wharf so I swam over but was unable to life myself and my sodden clothing up onto the wharf. Reta ran over to the boat calling for help.

First Mate Buford Wilkinson and a couple of deck hands pulled me up onto the wharf and determined that I was unhurt. Then they had a good laugh.

Flying into the river, going to the bottom, coming up and swimming to the wharf was all accomplished without losing my cap, or glasses, or money in my money clip and change purse or my card case including several family photos. My camera was also still around my neck. However, that has been replaced.

And of course, that evening at dinner I get a lecture from Capt. Mike about swimming being prohibited at that point.

Sorry to report – no one got a photo of my special show.

FROM GRANDMA'S KITCHEN

Peanut-Cracker Brittle

2 cups granulated sugar

1 tablespoon sugar

1-1/2 cups salted cocktail peanuts

1 cup light corn syrup

1 teaspoon baking soda

1-1/2 cups oyster crackers

Lightly grease a cookie sheet and a metal spatula. Have ready a candy thermometer or a small bowl of cold ice water. Mix sugar and corn syrup in a large saucepan. Bring to a boil over medium heat, stirring often. Boil 10 to 12 minutes, stirring occasionally, until a candy thermometer registers 300 degrees F to 310 degrees F (hard crack stage), or a small amount dropped into ice water separates into brittle threads. Remove from heat. Add butter and soda. Stir rapidly until dissolved (mixture will foam). Add peanuts and crackers and mix well. Immediately pour onto prepared cookie sheet press with prepared spatula to 1/4-inch thickness. Let stand until cool and hard. Break into bite size pieces. Store airtight with waxed paper between layers.

Peanut Butter Crunch Candy

1 cup corn syrup

1 cup sugar

1 jar (12 ounces) crunchy peanut butter

6 cups Rice Krispies

Heat corn syrup and sugar over medium heat until sugar is dissolved. Remove from heat. Stir in peanut butter until smooth. Stir in Rice Krispies. Pour into buttered pan (8 x 12 inches). Cut into squares when thoroughly cooled.

Cranberry Bog Bark

1 cup Craisins (dried cranberries)

1-1/2 pounds white chocolate or almond bark

2 cups broken walnuts

Place craisins in a vegetable steamer; cover and steam 2-3 minutes. Remove to a paper towel; blot and cool. In a double boiler, melt the chocolate. Remove from the heat and stir in the Craisins and walnuts. Spread evenly over a foil lined cookie sheet. Refrigerate 30 minutes or until candy is hard. Break into 2-inch pieces. Yield: 2 pounds.
