ODD FELLOWS ADVANCE TO LEAGUE PLAYOFF SEMI-FINALS

LANCASTER-Skylar Gingrich and Andy Thompson delivered key RBI base hits and lefty Mike Freeman took care of the rest.

As a result, the Lititz Odd Fellows are headed to the Lancaster County Midget Baseball School League playoff semi-finals.

After a convincing opening-round 12-2 win over Columbia, the Odd Fellows (12-6) broke a 1-1 tie with a four-run sixth inning against host St. Leo last Friday night and held on to win 5-1 in the playoff quarterfinals.

Jordan Weaver got the sixth-inning rally started off of St. Leo pitcher Mike Giurlando with a flare single to left, Freeman beat out a highhop infield single, and Jason Griffith worked a one-out walk to load the bases. Then Gingrich followed with a sharply-hit RBI single to left to plate the go-ahead run, and Thompson smoked a three-run triple into the left-center field gap to put Lititz up 5-1.

From there, Freeman retired St. Leo in order in the sixth and seventh innings to nail down the victory. The Lititz southpaw K'd

five, walked four, scattered three hits, and allowed no earned runs in the complete-game victory.

Plus, Freeman went 2-for-4 at the plate in the No. 2 hole to help his own cause. Griffith also had a big day by going 2-for-2 with a walk and two runs scored.

The Odd Fellows took a 1-0 lead in the top of the second inning, as Griffith stroked a one-out double and scored when Thompson reached base on an error.

St. Leo tied it in the fourth, as Tommy Eck reached on a fielder's choice and later scored on an error. The hosts appeared to be back in business when Nate Schmalhofer roped a leadoff shot to center leading off the fifth. But Lititz center fielder Zacy Snyder quickly tracked the ball down and nailed Schmalhofer at second base with a perfect throw.

It turned out to be St. Leo's final base runner of the night.

Last Wednesday, July 13, Justin King went 3-for-4 to lead the Odd Fellows' 13-hit attack off of two Columbia pitchers in Lititz's 12-2 first-round drubbing.

Freeman, Gingrich, and Thompson all added two hits apiece, continued on page 6



Fluffy Cheesecake Dessert

4 cups miniature marshmallows 1/3 cup orange juice 2 packages (8 ounces each) cream cheese, softened 1 carton (12 ounces) frozen whipped topping, thawed 2-1/2 cups crushed vanilla wafers 1/2 cup butter or margarine, melted

In a large microwave – safe bowl, combine marshmallows and orange juice. Microwave, uncovered, on high for 1-1/2 minutes. Stir until smooth. In a mixing bowl, beat cream cheese. Add marshmallow mixture; beat just until smooth. Fold in whipped topping. Combine wafer crumbs and butter; set aside 3/4 cup for topping. Press remaining crumbs into an ungreased 13-in. x 9 in. x 2 in. pan. Spoon cream cheese filling over crust. Sprinkle with reserved crumbs. Cover and refrigerate for 1 hour or until set.

Peanut Butter Cup Cupcakes

1/3 cup shortening

1/3 cup peanut butter

1-1/4 cups packed brown sugar

2 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1-3/4 cups flour

1-3/4 teaspoons baking powder

1 teaspoon salt

1 cup milk

16 miniature peanut butter cups

In a mixing bowl, cream shortening, peanut butter, and brown sugar. Add eggs and vanilla; mix well. Combine flour, baking powder and salt; add to creamed mixture alternately with milk. Fill paper-lined muffin cups with 1/4 cup of batter. Press a peanut butter cup into the center of each until top is even with batter. Bake at 350 degrees for 22-24 minutes or until a toothpick inserted at an angle toward the center comes out clean. **Yield:** 16 cupcakes.

Fresh Lemonade Syrup

3 cups sugar

3 cups boiling water

3 cups lemon juice (about 16 lemons)

2 tablespoons grated lemon peel

In a 1-1/2 quart heat-proof container, dissolve sugar in boiling water. Cool. Add lemon juice and peel; mix well. Cover and store in refrigerator for up to 1 week. Yield: 5-1/2 cups syrup (number of batches varies depending on concentration of lemonade). To prepare lemonade: For 1 serving, combine 1/4 to 1/3 and 3/4 cup cold water in a glass; stir well. For 8 servings, combine 2-2/3 cups of syrup and 5 cups cold water in a 2-quart pitcher; stir well.
