# ODD FELLOWS ORPHANS HOME FUND HOSTS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF FOUNDATION AIMED AT PREVENTING SUDDEN DEATH IN YOUNG PEOPLE

No doubt many of us have read in the news about the sudden deaths of young people, sometimes while engaged in sports activities. Although many times the causes are not clear, evidence indicates that some young people are succumbing to a heart arrhythmia known as Long or Prolonged QT Syndrome. A recent resolution passed by the Pennsylvania House designates the last week of January as Long QT Awareness Week.

The Sudden Arrhythmia Death Syndromes (SADS) Foundation, in Salt Lake City, Utah, has as its mission to increase general awareness, family support, education, and advocacy for research regarding Long QT. The group is making a difference in the general awareness of and prevention of deaths due to Long QT. Last year Brother Byron Goldstein of Variety 37 Lodge brought the SADS Foundation's good work to the

attention of Odd Fellows Orphans Home Fund and the fund made a donation to help support the Foundation's work. During Pennsylvania Long QT Awareness Week, SADS Foundation Executive Director Alice Lara visited Pennsylvania to work with Abington School District in a pilot program to increase awareness among parents, teachers, and school nurses. This program may become a model for other school districts across the country. While she was in Pennsylvania, she met with representatives of the Orphans Home to let them know how appreciative the Foundation is of their support.

Long QT affects more children than childhood leukemia; it has been estimated that 250 to 600 young people die each month in the US due to Long QT. The diagnosis is made from an ECG (also known as an EKG) that has been read by a physician. Usually a series of ECGs will enable a doctor to diagnose LQTS in individuals where the condition is suspect. Treatment can be very effective in the vast majority of those affected. Medications called beta-blockers are effective in about 90% of patients.

# STILL SERVING - AFTER ALL THESE YEARS

Alma Lodge #523 has many veterans among its members. These veterans proudly served in our Nation's Armed Forces and many served during war times, including WWII, Korea, and Viet Nam. But would you believe we have two Members that served during WWII that are still serving today?

Brothers Walter J. (Petie) McClelland and Benjamin P. (Benny) Arellano served in the U.S. Army and the U.S. Marine Corps, respectively, during WWII (Benny got in just at the end of the war but stayed in the Marine Reserve and was called to active duty again during the Korean War), and, yes, today, at age 87 and 77, also respectively, still serve our Country and their fellow veterans and their families.

Petie McClelland was born in 1918 in the Johnstown area. In 1934 his town of Hastings formed what they called the Juvenile Band. Times were tough and there was no high school band and most of the kids couldn't afford to buy an instrument anyhow. Local business people from the community donated money to equip the Juvenile Band and a local musician taught interested kids how to play individually and in a band. Petie started on alto horn and switched to trumpet a couple years later.

In 1943 Petie got drafted into the Army and wound up in the Signal Corps. Soon he was in Europe. He spent over 26 months overseas in Italy, Southern France, and Germany. Although an accomplished musician by this time, Petie did not spend his service time playing in an official Army band but he did fill in with some bands after the war. PFC McClelland was honorably discharged in 1946.

Upon returning home, Petie worked in maintenance for 26 years at Johnstown High School and taught a building maintenance class at a local rehabilitation center for 10 years after that.

During this time Petie continued to play in local bands and orchestras, and formed his own group with his late wife, Dorothy, who was excellent on the keyboard. Dorothy passed away in 1996.

Benny Arellano was born in 1928 in Johnstown and was just old enough to enlist in the Marines when he graduated high school in 1946, which he promptly did. They didn't need Ben overseas in 1946 but he had learned to play the trumpet in junior high and played in the Johnstown High School marching band. Although officially a Marine Rifleman, his musical talents were put to use and Ben was used in various Marine Corps bands.


Benny remained in the Marine Corps Reserve after completing his enlistment, so, when the Korean War broke out, he was once again called to active duty. He stayed stateside during his war and was used mainly as a musician. When hostilities ceased he was again discharged from active duty with the rank of sergeant.

Ben then continued his education by attending Indiana State Teachers College (now Indiana University of Pennsylvania) under the G.I. Bill and majoring in music education. He earned his bachelor's degree at IUP then a master's degree at Duquesne University. Ben became a music teacher at various schools and continued his teaching career until his retirement in 1982.

During Bennie's teaching career he also played in local groups. Sometimes he was called upon to play in bands backing up celebrities performing in the area. Between his Marine Corps band experiences and his local work, Ben has played for Bob Hope, Englebert Humperdink, Tiny Tim, Phyllis Diller, Myron Floren, Georgie Jessel, Cab Calloway, Bobby Vinton, The Ice Capades, and others.

Now, Petie and Ben serve once more, in uniform and as musicians. They both belong to VFW Post 155 and both are on the Post Ritual Team. They play Taps at the funerals of brother veterans who are passing away at ever in-

creasing numbers. Petie said that between July of 2004 and July of 2005 he played Taps at 150 funerals. Sometimes they do two a day.

Petie and Ben do this in all kinds of weather and never turn down a request to play Taps at a funeral unless they already

are committed to another funeral at the same time. They wear a VFW blazer and cap and play in 95-degree heat or on a zero degree-day with

the wind howling. Playing in the rain or snow is common for these two dedicated musicians. Petie also plays Taps at other official functions, such as a Memorial Day service, whenever he's requested.

But if one stops the car, or is walking by, one will notice something quite amazing. Looking into the eyes of one horse will disclose that he is blind. His owner has chosen not to have him put down, but has made a good home for him. This alone is amazing. Listening, one will hear the sound of a bell. Looking around for the source of the sound, one will see that it comes from the smaller horse in the field. Attached to her bridle is a small bell. It lets her blind friend know where she is, so he can follow her. As one stands and watches these two friends, one sees how she is always checking on him, and that he will listen for her bell and then slowly walk to where she is, trusting that she will not lead him astray. Like the owner of these two horses, God does not throw us away just because we are not perfect or because we have problems or challenges. He watches over us and even brings others into our lives to help us when we are in need. Sometimes we are the blind horse being guided by God and those whom he places in our lives. Other times we are the guide horse, helping others see God. Good friends are like stars...You don't always see them, but you know they are always there.

# FROM GRANDMA'S KITCHEN

### Stuffed Turkey Roll

1 egg, lightly beaten 1/8 tsp. pepper

1/4 cup chopped celery

1/2 tsp. ground sage

1/2 cup quick cooking oats

1 pound ground turkey

3 thsps. butter or margarine

1/4 tsp. ground thyme

2 bacon strips, halved

1/2 tsp. salt

1/4 cup chopped onion

2 tbsps. water

2 cups seasoned stuffing cubes

In a bowl, combine the eggs, oats, salt, and pepper. Crumble turkey over mixture and mix well. Pat into a 12 in. x 9 in. rectangle on a piece of heavy duty foil; set aside. In a saucepan, saute onion and celery in butter until tender. Remove from heat. Stir in water, sage and thyme. Add stuffing; mix well. Spoon over turkey to within 1 inch of edges. Roll up jellyroll style, starting with a short side and peeling away foil while rolling.

Place loaf, seam side down, in a greased 9 in. x 5 in. x 3 in. loaf pan. Place bacon strips over top. Bake, uncovered, at 325 degrees for 60-70 minutes or until meat is no longer pink and a meat thermometer reads 165 degrees. Yield: 4 servings.

### Carrots and Pineapple

2 cups baby carrots
1/2 tsp. cinnamon
1 can (20 oz.) pineapple chunks
1/2 cup packed brown sugar
4 tsps. cornstarch
1 tbsp. butter

In a saucepan bring 1 in. of water to a boil; place carrots in a steamer basket over water. Cover and steam for 8-10 minutes or until tender – crisp. Drain pineapple, reserving juice; set pineapple aside.

In a saucepan, combine cornstarch and cinnamon. Add the brown sugar, butter, and reserved juice. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Stir in the carrots and pineapple; heat through. Yield: 4 servings.

#### Potato Rolls

7 to 8 cups all purpose flour

1 tsp. salt

2 cups milk

1 cup mashed potatoes (prepared without milk or butter)

1/2 cup sugar

2/3 cup shortening

1 pkg. (1/4 oz.) Yeast

1/2 cup water

2 eggs

In a large mixing bowl, combine 2 cups flour, sugar, yeast, and salt. In a saucepan, heat milk, shortening, and water to 120-130 degrees. Add to dry ingredients; beat until moistened. Add mashed potatoes and eggs; beat until smooth. Stir in enough flour to form a stiff dough. Do not knead. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease top. Cover and refrigerate several hours or overnight.

Turn dough onto a lightly floured surface and punch down. Divide dough in half. With greased hands, shape each portion into

12 balls. Roll each ball into an 8 in. rope, tie into a knot, please 2 in. apart on greased baking sheets; tuck ends under. Cover and let rise until doubles, about 2 hours. Bake at 375 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from pans to wire racks. Yield: 2 dozen.

### Carrot, Raisin, and Pineapple Salad

Drain one No. 2 can pineapple tidbits, reserving syrup. Mix pineapple, 2 cups shredded carrots, and 1/4 cup of plumped raisins. Chill. Blend a little of the pineapple syrup and mayonnaise; toss with salad. Serves 6.
