VISITING MADISON, INDIANA

When two Odd Fellow couples from Pennsylvania visit Madison, Ind., in September, they found plenty of evidence of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows:

Department Commander Leon S. Stamm and Sister Laudine, and Past Department Commander John J. Kunkleman and Lady Reta were traveling on the Steamboat Delta Queen.

The boat stopped in Madison and the two couples decided to tour the city on a sight-seeing trolley. The driver-escort pointed out all the interesting sights and buildings in the community.

Driving down a wide, divided boulevard, the guide said up ahead is out Broadway Fountain. She said it was displayed at the Centennial Exposition in Philadelphia

and then purchased and presented to the City of Madison by the Independent Order of Odd Fellows.

The brought a cheer from the rear of the trolley and the escort said those people must be from Philadelphia.

The driver later said the two couples were the first live members of the order she had ever met, although one of her ancestors had been a member and she has some lodge jewelry that was his.

She also said her parents took her to play in the foun-

tain when she was three years old and now she takes her grandchildren there to do the same.

This ornate fountain, the locals said, is one of only four of this style remaining in the world. It was made in France and then brought to Philadelphia for the exposition in 1876.

It was in 1886 the fountain was presented to the city by the Odd Fellows. It was originally cast in iron. But it was recast in bronze for the bicentennial celebration in Madison in 1976. The Three Links and the All Seeing Eye are displayed on the four legs of the base of the statuary.

At one stop on the tour the proprietor of the "Madison Fudge Factory" came on board and passed out samples of his fudge.

Later the Stamms went back down town and visited the fudge shop. The proprietor told them there is still a lodge meeting on the second floor of a downtown building.

But in his shop he has a safe from a defunct lodge bearing the name of Lawrence Lodge No. 297, I.O.O.F. He also has some regalia and a fancy "Resolution of Respect" displayed on the wall of the shop.

So, for almost 120 years, a gift from the Odd Fellows has been a focal point of downtown Madison, Indiana.

His grandmother knelt down next to him and said, "I love your freckles. When I was a girl I always wanted freckles," she said. "Freckles are beautiful."

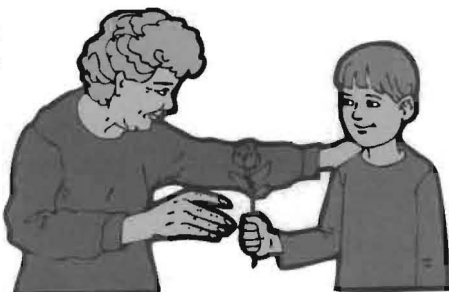
The boy looked up and said, "Really?"

Pink Lemonade Bars

Crust:

1-1/2 sticks (3/4 cup) butter, softened
1-1/2 cups flour
1/2 cup confection's sugar

Topping:

4 large eggs, at room temperature
2 cups granulated sugar
1 tbsp. freshly grated lemon zest
1/2 cup fresh lemon juice
1/4 cup flour
1 tsp. baking powder
red liquid food coloring

Decoration:

confection's sugar

1. Heat oven to 350 degrees. Line a 13 x 9-inch baking pan with foil, letting foil extend above pan on both ends. Coat foil with nonstick spray.

2. Crust: Beat butter, flour, and confection's sugar in a large bowl with mixer until blended (mixture will be crumbs). Press over bottom of pan.

3. Bake 15 minutes or until golden. Leave oven on.

4. Meanwhile - make Topping: In a large bowl, beat eggs, sugar, lemon zest and juice, flour and baking powder with mixer to combine. Add about 5 drops of food coloring and beat until pink, pour over hot crust.

5. Bake 25 to 30 minutes until topping is golden and topping has set. Cool in pan on wire rack.

6. Lift by ends of foil to cutting board. Cut into 6 rows lengthwise, 8 crosswise to make 48 bars. Dust with confection's sugar.

Santa's Whiskers

2 sticks (1 cup) unsalted butter, softened
3/4 cup sugar
1 large egg
1/4 cup milk
1/2 tsp. each vanilla and coconut extract
1/4 tsp. salt
2 cups flour
3 cups sweetened shredded coconut
1 cup red and/or green candied cherries, coarsely chopped

1. Heat oven to 350 degrees. Have baking sheet(s) ready.

2. Beat butter, sugar, egg, milk, extracts and salt in a large bowl with mixer on medium speed until blended (mixture may look curdled). On low speed, beat in flour until combined. Stir in 1 cup coconut and the cherries.

3. Put remaining coconut into a bowl. Drop rounded measuring teaspoons of dough into coconut; turn gently to coat. Place 2 inches apart on ungreased baking sheet.

4. Bake 15 minutes or until coconut is toasted and cookies are set. Cool slightly on baking sheet on wire rack before removing to rack to cool completely.

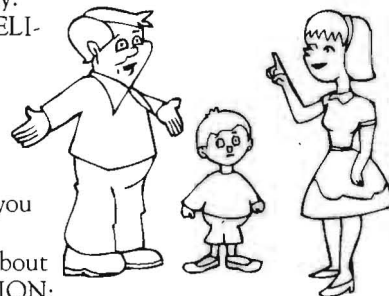

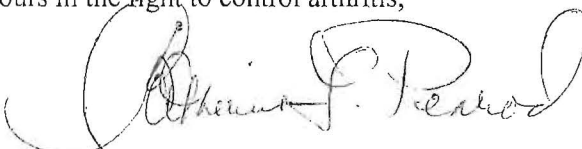
