# MOCK PIE USES CRACKERS INSTEAD OF APPLES

1. It's easy to make. You will need:
Pastry for a double-crusted 9-inch pie

2 cups water

1-1/4 cups sugar

2 teaspoons cream of tartar

20 single-stack, square soda (saltine) crackers (regular, salted)

Butter 1/4 to 1/2 stick (for dotting)

Ground cinnamon or cinnamon sugar (for sprinkling)

Preheat the oven to 375 F. Line the bottom of a 9-inch pie pan with pastry. In a pot, boil water, sugar and cream of tartar, stirring until all of the sugar is dissolved. Add the whole crackers (do not break up) and boil ONLY 1 minute. Spoon the mixture gently into the pie shell, dot the top with butter and sprinkle on the cinnamon to taste. Now, cover the pie with the top crust and cut several vents. Bake in the preheated oven for 35 minutes. Let the pie cook completely so that it becomes firm before cutting the first slice.

(It can be made without a top crust and it looks and tastes like apple pie.)

- Coat a flat potato masher with cooking spray, and you can press crispy rice cereal treats into a pan with no mess. Spray the pan, too!
- When taking a dish to a dinner, remove the hot/cold pad from the casserole carrier and place it under the dish to serve. It keeps the casserole hotter or the salad colder during serving time.
- 4. Dipping ice cream at a party is always so messy and timeconsuming. Therefore, before a party place single dips of ice cream in paper cupcake liners and pop them back in to the freezer until they're ready to serve.

# MEN HAVE FOND MEMORIES OF ORPHANAGE

### They star in documentary about site

DEWART – Bob Betzer remembers baking bread and desserts and eating his share of cookies.

He and Bob Jacobs worked in the bakery of the International Order of Odd Fellows Orphanage, near Sunbury. Mr. Jacobs spent 10 years there and Mr. Betzer lived there eight years.

The two were filmed in a documentary touring the grounds recently. Dewart postmaster Dave Brown made the approximately two-hour documentary because he's afraid the property, owned by Youth Challenge, may end up being developed. He filmed the men reminiscing as they walked through the buildings.

Mr. Betzer, of East Buffalo Township, near Lewisburg, and Mr. Jacobs, a Watsontown area resident, have fond memories of ice skating, sledding and skiing on the grounds and setting traps for skunks, muskrat, opossums and weasels on the complex as well as on nearby farmland. They earned spending money by sending the hides to Sears.

"The mailman didn't want to haul hides in a package that smelled, so we put perfume on the package," Mr. Betzer said.

They recalled being initiated as little boys going into the big boys area. "The older boys who were bullies put us in the dryer," Mr. Betzer said of spinning around in the institution dryer.

When they lived there, about 100 kids were in the orphanage.

Mr. Jacobs ended up there at age 8 after his dad died. "Back in the Depression, it was hard for women to make a living," he said of his mother. He and his youngest brother, Dalphon, were sent to the orphanage. Mr. Jacobs lived there from 1936-46.

Mr. Betzer arrived at age 10 after his dad died in 1935. "We didn't have Social Security and all the stuff we have today. My father was an Odd Fellow and I was eligible to go," he said.

Both men's mothers visited them. They went home for a two-week vacation every summer.

While the two lived in different dorms, they worked together on the complex.

"The orphanage taught us Christian principles. We had church every Sunday afternoon when preachers came there," Mr. Jacobs said. Mr. Betzer remembers the Gospel Four group singing the song, "The Jerico Road," which became a favorite of his.

They said the superintendent, matrons and house mothers were good to them.

When they were disciplined, they said they deserved it. "There were too many kids not to have discipline," Mr. Jacobs said. They recalled a punishment where they had to sit on a bench.

One time older bullies told Mr. Betzer and another boy to pick cherries. "The superintendent told us not to pick them from that particular tree, and the superintendent caught us. As we were coming down, we saw him break off a switch from the tree, and when we got down, we got switched. You couldn't win on that deal," he said.

They worked on the truck patch, whitewashed trees and used a reelpush mower.

In the bakery, they mixed up dough and kneaded it for bread and rolls. "On Saturday after the oven cooled down, we made cakes and cookies. Boy, I ate the cookies," Mr. Betzer said.

After the bakery closed, Mr. Jacobs went to work on the farm. "We had milk machines by that time," said Mr. Jacobs, who did his share of "shovel and fork work" to clean up after the cows.

Besides chores, kids were responsible for keeping their areas clean. They had to make their beds and mop the stairways, hallways and playrooms.

On weekends, they went to town to see westerns such as those starring Tom Mix. "We got to go to football games and sporting events. We had some good football players from the orphanage who played for the Sunbury Owls," Mr. Jacobs said.

The two men, who have remained friends for 60- years, have visited the orphanage in past years. "It's really changed. Everything has changed," Mr. Jacobs said.

They recently got permission to walk the trails they had known so well. "We tried to find the Lonesome Pine Trail, but we couldn't because it was all grown up," Mr. Betzer said. "We walked about four hours that day. I slept good that night."

After graduating from Sunbury High School, the two ended up nit he Army during World War II – Mr. Betzer in Europe and Mr. Jacobs during the occupation of Japan.

Mr. Jacobs said living in an orphanage got them used to Army barracks life. "We could hear guys crying because they were homesick. To me, it was like being in the orphanage," he said.

After the Army, Mr. Jacobs, 77, farmed, worked at a steel plant, for a trucking company and retired in 1990 from the Warrior Run School District, where he worked in maintenance and as a bus driver.

Mr. Betzer, 80, worked for Pennsylvania House and then Young Door Co. as night supervisor, retiring in 1986.

Mr. Jacobs jokes he started his own orphanage with six sons and three daughters, 24 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. His wife, Lorraine, died in December 2003. "That's 56 years of marriage. It's still hard to say," his voice cracking.

Mr. Betzer and his wife, Janet, have two daughters and a son, nine grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

During the filming of the documentary, Mr. Brown learned a lot about the history of the orphanage buildings. "The Odd Fellows would donate money to help kids, even in the worst of times, so they could eat and have a place to live. I thought that was very heartwarming," he said.

He plans to show the documentary at the orphanage reunion at 1 p.m. Sept. 4 in the Hotel Edison.

# **GRAND MASTER'S RECIPE COLUMN**

July 2006

I have one icing I use for most cakes. It can be tinted easily using Wilton food coloring, available at most Wal-Mart's. It can be flavored with almond, peppermint or some other flavor then vanilla. You can turn it into chocolate using cocoa to add color and flavor and Karo to thin it back down. Here's the recipe:

#### Buttercream 2

1/4 pound margarine (1 stick)

3/8 cup hot milk

1 2-lb bag of powdered sugar

1-1/2 cups shortening

Sift powdered sugar. Heat milk, do not boil. Add butter (or margarine) to milk, melt slightly. Add milk to powdered sugar and mix 1-1/2 minutes or until mixture comes together. Add shortening and mix with paddle to smooth consistency. Add flavoring (1 tbsp. vanilla). Remove paddle and whip on high with wire whip for 10 minutes.

My favorite cake is Red Devil's food, the above icing works quite well on it.

#### Waldorf (Red Devil's Food) Cake

Cream:	1/2 cup Crisco 1-1/2 cups white sugar	3/4 cup Crisco 2-1/4 cups white sugar

Mix well and add to the above mixture:

Bake in pans that are greased and floured for 35 minutes at 350°, more or less. The cake should be springy to the touch when done. If you use a toothpick, the cake may be overdone when the toothpick comes out dry. This cake is easy to overbake.

Coney Island Sauce (for hot dogs)

1 lb ground beef

1 clove garlic, minced

1 cup water

2 8-oz cans tomato sauce

1 tsp. chili powder

8 ounces pepperoni

1-1/2 tsp. seasoned salt

2 tbls. onion, chopped

#### Chewy Date Bars

1 pkg (18-1/4 ounces) yellow cake mix

3/4 cup butter melted

2 cups chopped dates

3/4 cup brown sugar, packed

In a mixing bowl, combine cake mix and brown sugar. Add butter and eggs; beat on medium speed for 2 minutes. Combine dates and walnuts; stir into batter (the batter will be stiff).
