BECKY'S BACKYARD

P.O.F. DAYS GONE BY**75 YEARS AGO****(March 1931)****EBENSBURG**

The 80th anniversary of the founding of Highland Lodge No. 428, was observed Wednesday evening, March 4, in the Odd Fellows' Hall, High Street. The Ebensburg Lodge is next to the oldest Odd Fellow organization in Cambria County. It owns its own home, has a large membership and is in a flourishing condition.

The celebration started with a turkey banquet prepared and served by the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Ebensburg Y.M.C.A. Ample entertainment and other features were provided to make up a fine and interesting program, which were heartily enjoyed by the large audience present.

Highland Lodge was instituted March 4, 1851 by the late James Potts, of Johnstown. The charter members all have passed away. One member of the lodge at the present time has been a member for 60 years, being Richard L. Thomas, who was presented at the 80th anniversary celebration with a 60-year veteran Jewel. The presentation was made by Herman T. Jones.

The first meeting place of the lodge was in the Sons of Temperance Hall, on the second floor of the Edward Shoemaker store, now occupied by the Premier Electric Company. The I.O.O.F. Hall Association, organized to take title to real estate, was chartered by the Cambria County Court March 9, 1855. December, 4, 1871, the Ebensburg Hall Association was granted a charter. This organization was composed of members of Highland Lodge and Summit Lodge, F. & A.M. The two organizations, through the Hall Association, purchased on June 21, 1872, a three-story frame building on Julian Street.

The present building, on High Street, was constructed for lodge purposes and is very well suited to the needs of the organization. It is used for meetings by all I.O.O.F. and Rebekah Lodges, also the Knights of Pythias, Order of Eastern Star, and Knights and Dames of Malta. IT is entirely free of debt. The Hall was dedicated September 11, 1913, by Grand Master Fred C. Hanyen, now Grand Treasurer of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania. Byron W. Davis was Noble Grand at that time.

The following committee was in charge of the anniversary celebration: Stanley W. Davis, Dr. H.J. Ralston, Frank Jervis, Jr., and James F. Estep.

Upwards of 250 persons were present at the ceremony in the lodge hall, while the banquet, on account of lack of space, had to be limited to the local lodge membership, approximately 200 persons being present there. Harve Tibbott acted as master of ceremonies and sang several solos.

Crunchy Spinach Salad

- 2 quarts fresh torn spinach
- 1 can (8 oz.) sliced water chestnuts, drained
- 6 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled
- 1 can (16 oz.) bean sprouts, drained
- 4 hard cooked eggs, chopped
- 1 small onion, sliced
- Dressing:
 - 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
 - 1/3 cup vinegar
 - 1/3 cup ketchup
 - 1/2 cup vegetable oil
 - 1 tblsp. worchestershire sauce

In a large bowl, combine spinach, bean sprouts, water chestnuts, eggs, bacon, and onion. In a jar with a tight-fitting lid, combine all dressing ingredients; shake well. Pour over salad and toss. Yield: 8 servings.

Easy Beefy Casserole

- 1 lb. ground chuck
- 1 package Tater Tots (frozen food)
- 1 (16 oz.) package frozen mixed vegetables
- 1 can Cream of Chicken soup
- 1 (8 oz.) bag shredded Cheddar cheese

Brown ground beef with a little salt, drain off fat and place in casserole. Layer vegetables, soup, and cheese on meat. Layer Tater Tots on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes, until top is nicely browned (sort of golden).

Banana Cream-Crunch Pie

- 1 (3.4 oz.) package banana flavored instant pudding mix
- 1 (8 oz.) container frozen whipped, thawed and divided
- 1 chocolate graham cracker crust
- 1 cup milk
- 2 bananas, sliced
- 3 (1.4 oz.) English Toffee candy bars, chopped

In a medium bowl combine pudding mix and milk, stirring with a wire whisk until smooth. Gently fold in 1 cup whipped topping into pudding mixture. Arrange banana slices over chopped candy. Cover and chill 1-1/2 hours or until set. Spread remaining whipped topping on top of pie just before serving. Sprinkle with remaining chopped candy. Yield: 6 to 8 servings.
