MARTIN RIDES FOR THE VICTIMS OF M.S.

Robert (Bob) Martin will ride in the MS Escape to the Lake again this year. From the Cranberry Mall, near Pittsburgh, to Conneaut, Ohio, there will be more than 1500 riders. Only one will say "Odd Fellows and Rebekahs Fight M.S." That will be Bob.

He rides for MS because he has a mission. That mission is to help find a cure for that dreaded disease. He has a relative with M.S., as well as others he knows that suffer. His ministers sister, a former nurse, is confined to a wheel chair. Charles Bailey, a Past Grand Master of our Grand Lodge also is a victim. It is a disease of the central nervous system.

Symptoms may vary from mild to severe, loss of vision, loss of use of limbs, and paralysis. It mostly strikes young people, 20-40 years of age. Advances in research and treatment have been made. You can help. In western Pennsylvania, there are more than 4700 individuals with MS.

This year it will be June 10th and 11th with stops in Cochranton and Meadville, as well as other stops along the way. Any donations will be accepted. If you know of an individual with MS and wish to have their name on Bob's shirt, a donation of \$10.00 will do it. A donation in memory of a victim may also be Honored.

Last year the riders raised over \$900,000 from the rider. Their

MS BIKE RIDE goal this year is ONE MILLION DOLLARS. Let us help to achieve this goal.

> The money given is divided as follows: 40% research, 38% for local programs, 14% fund raising, 6% reserves, 2% administration. All funds received stay in Western Pennsylvania.

For those of you in Mercer County, the ride goes from near Grove City, to Jackson Center to Sandy Lake. Crawford County from Cochranton to Meadville, Harmonsburg, Linesville, and on to Conneaut. Step and give the riders a cheer and watch for Bob.

Dean Deibler Doesn't Regret his "Hard-Knock Life" at an Orphanage

Dean Deibler of Millersburg had a "hard-knock life" for 10 years in an orphanage, but today he doesn't regret his experiences at all.

In fact, he's grateful he had a place to go.

"I look at it as an experience I wouldn't trade with anyone," said Deibler, who was originally from Trevorton.

His father George was crushed in a mine accident in 1931 and his mother, Thama S. Umholtz Deibler, was left with five children. She turned to the Independent order of Odd Fellows Orphanage in Sunbury to provide a home for Dean and his younger sister Eilene. His older sister Dorothy went to live with an aunt for a year before

(Sentinel photo by Lori Norris) she too became a resident at the orphanage. Deibler's two older brothers, George and Blair, set out on their own as adults.

When the Deibler children arrived in the orphanage, they were welcomed by 90 other children. In later years, that number ranged from 212 to 13 children. Deibler shared a room with 15 other boys.

Life in the orphanage was not a bed of

roses. The children there, who ranged in ages from 9 months to 18, ran the dairy farm located at the orphanage. Deibler's first job was cutting the eyes out of potatoes. There always were chores to be done on the farm, from milking cows, cleaning stables, feeding pigs, harvesting and many other jobs.

He said four boys regularly cared for the dairy cows. The children in the orphanage were given the skim milk, and the cream and whole milk were sold. Shoveling sidewalks and driveways kept the boys busy during the winter. The girls cleaned the home every day.

"That was the main psychology – keep us busy so that we weren't fighting," Deibler said.

But fighting and trickery still went on, so other measures were taken. Paddling was one of them.

"And I mean paddling, not this love tap stuff," Deibler said.

Clothing was provided by parents or guardians and funds from the home. There was a "shore room" in the orphanage where Deibler picked his shoes.

Meals weren't that distasteful, Deibler said. The children lined up and marched to the dining room to eat.

"We had good cooks, except when one superintendent's wife decided to cook and she burned everything, even oatmeal," Deibler said.

Life at the orphanage wasn't all work and no play, however. Social activities were planned with the Evangelical Home in Lewisburg. These activities often included baseball and football.

"We had a chance to swap stories," Deibler said.

World War II and alcohol abuse were the main reasons for the plight of most orphans then. Deiber said that after World War II

many children no longer had anywhere to go, and ended up at the home. Others became residents because their parents were alcoholics and didn't feed them properly.

"Some kids that came there were abused and undernourished. They looked pathetic," Deibler said.

One of the best aspects of living there for Deibler was the cultural diversity. The different backgrounds and cultures of each child there provided an educational textbook for Deibler.

"That's what makes an orphanage – learning about other people. Kids can learn from one another if they are from other areas," he said.

Deibler's mother visited her children as much as she could, and they went to her house in Lenkerville during Christmas vacation.

"I was a momma's baby. The older I got, the more I thought she needed protection," Deibler said.

The home had its own school until 1938. After that, Deibler attended Sunbury High School where he learned the printing trade, which later became his life occupation.

As soon as Deibler turned 18, he went to live with his mother and worked in a shoe factory.

He said one day his mother asked him if he resented her for taking him to the orphanage. Deibler said he told her it was the best thing she ever did for him.

"I would have been the worst juvenile delinquent in the county if she didn't. I was strong-minded," Deibler said.

However, he said it took him about five years after he left the orphanage to appreciate having lived there.

Sunday school and church services were held every Sunday at the home. Deibler said that when he was 13 years old he was going through a rough time and he prayed that God would give him a really good wife someday and that he would be the last one in his family to get married.

"And it worked out that way," Deibler said.

Deibler and his wife Corrine married several years after he moved to Lenkerville and they have three children.

Deibler said the orphanage taught him the importance of being a father.

"I learned to appreciate what it takes to be a father," he said.

Before he even considered marriage, Deibler said he decided that if he had children he never would put them through even a tenth of what he experienced.

"I didn't like it any better the last day than the first day. I wouldn't want to have to grow up living there, but if I had to, I would," Deibler said.

The orphanage closed in the late 1960s and the building was purchased by Teen Challenge Rehabilitation Center.

The people who grew up in the orphanage hold reunions each Labor Day. Deibler said he hasn't gone to one in several years because of his health.

The orphanage concept has been the topic of debate recently among legislators. Deibler said he wouldn't be against the idea if the orphanages would be run correctly.

"I don't have anything against orphanages, but today they would have to have a doctor, psychiatrist, dietician, etc. We freelanced everything. That's why I wouldn't want to grow up (in an orphanage) today," he said.

However, overall, Deibler has no regrets.

"At the time I was not happy, but it turned out pretty good for me."

BECKY'S BACKYARD

- 1. Skin chicken when it's slightly frozen for easier skinning.
- 2. To help keep a pan from boiling over rub butter around the brim of the pan.
- 3. Put a slice of bread in your cookie jar to keep chewy cookies soft.
- 4. Use an egg slicer to cut mushrooms.
- To ripen a tomato put it with an apple in a perforated bag.
- 6. To plump dried out raisins, put the dried-out raisins in a bowl, pour in boiling water and let them sit for 15 minutes. Pour off the water and pat the raisins dry. They should be plump and ready to add to any recipe.
- 7. To prevent raisins from sinking to the bottom of a cake or bread, cut the raisins into small pieces to help keep them suspended in the batter. Since raisins can be bit sticky, spray the knife or scissor blades with some nonstick vegetable spray before you start cutting.
- 8. Raisins can be stored on the pantry shelf, but for maximum freshness, put them in the refrigerator in a container with a tight-fitting lid. And, did you know you can freeze raisins for an extended period.
- 9. To clean sponges and plastic dish scrubbers, put them in the dishwasher to keep them fresh and clean. However, be sure you attach the sponges and scrubbers securely to the top rack so they don't go "swimming" around in the dishwasher. Be sure to let them air-dry, too.

Cheesy Chicken Simmer

2 tsp. vegetable oil

2 cups frozen broccoli florets

4 small skinless, boneless chicken breast halves

1 can cream of chicken soup

1/4 lb. Velveeta, cut up

2 cups Minute Rice, prepared according to package instructions

Heat oil in a large nonstick skillet on medium-high heat. Add chicken; cook 7 minutes, turning after 3-1/2 minutes. Add broccoli, stir. Stir in soup and Velveeta until well blended. Reduce heat to medium; simmer 7 minutes or until chicken is cooked through. Serve over the hot cooked rice. Makes 4 servings.

Stuffed French Toast

2 eggs

2 tbsp. milk

2 tsp. sugar

4 slices cinnamon raisin bread

4 tbsp Philadelphia Cream Cheese spread

8 slices shaved (very thinly sliced) honey ham

2 tbsp. maple-flavored syrup

Beat eggs, milk and sugar with fork in 9-inch pie pan until well blended. Spread one side of each slice of bread with 1 tbsp of the cream cheese spread. Top 2 of the bread slices, spread sides up, with 4 ham slices each. Cover with remaining bread slices, spread sides down. Lightly press edges of each sandwich together to seal. Dip sandwiches into egg mixture until well soaked.

Heat nonstick skillet with cooking spray on medium heat. Add sandwiches; cook 2 minutes on each side or until golden brown. Serve immediately with syrup. Makes 2 sandwiches.

Angel Lush With Pineapple

1 store bought angel food cake

1 pkg (4 service size) Instant Vanilla Pudding

1 can (20 oz.) crushed pineapple, undrained

1 cup thawed Cool Whip

10 small strawberries

Mix dry pudding mix and pineapple with juice in medium bowl. Gently stir in Cool Whip. Cut cake into 3 layers. Place bottom cake layer, cut side up, on serving plate. Spread 1-1/3 cups of the pudding mixture onto cake layer; cover with middle cake layer.
