GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY




Mr. & Mrs. Frank Matinchek

GRAND MASTER'S COLUMN

A Halloween Fable

Time is rapidly approaching for the nominations for the Education Awards for the year 2007-2008. I have been asked to site the rules for the OF&R Magazine.

First the Odd Fellows or Rebekah may nominate a son, daughter, step son or daughter, grandchild, or step grandchild. They may nominate more than one. They may use the form as printed in the magazine. A nomination form will be mailed to each lodge. Copies may be made from this, or use the one in the magazine. It is to be filled out by the nominator.

This will be mailed to me at the above address by March 5, 2007. Upon receipt of the nomination, an application will be mailed to the nominee. This will be by the following day, except on the weekend.

The application must be returned to me at the above address, post marked no later than March 15, 2007. Postmarks will be checked to ensure they are eligible.

Each nomination and application is numbered and dated. This permits us (the committee) to determine the promptness of the individual, as this is one of the criteria for selection.

The committee meets in April to select the Award recipients. This may seem a long time from the time they are received. They must all be copied for the other members of the committee and mailed so the members of the committee may have at least two weeks to examine them before we meet.

The number of recipients is determined by the funds in the Endowment available to be used and the donations by Lodges and individuals. This is determined by the Grand Lodge after the end of the fiscal year.

After the recipients are determined, generally five alternates are selected, based upon the same criteria. If more funding is available, it is awarded in the order of selection.

The criteria consists of completeness of the application, neatness, essay, apparent need, grades & SAT score, activities (school, community and church) and promptness. Each has a value assigned and a total of 25 points total is possible.

After the recipients have been selected, they are notified by the first of the week following the selection. Along with the letter is a Confirmation form. This is a guarantee that they are enrolled in the school of their choice for the fall semester. After the confirmation form is returned, the check will be sent. The checks become available after July 1, generally the chairman receives them at Grand Lodge Sessions.

Just as a last thought, after we read and evaluate the application, we refer to each by its number, not by name. If there is a question, we return to the application. With 50-60 plus applications we do not remember names, so numbers are easier to work with.


Sister Elaine presented her program for the year and emphasized the importance of getting new members.



Caramel Egg Custard

First make a caramel syrup. Take 1/3 cup sugar, burn or caramelize it in a sauce pan, add 1/3 cup hot water (boiling, if possible); watch for splattering. Boil the syrup until it becomes smooth, pour in a glass and set aside.

Mix with wire whip or whip attachment on mixer:

5 eggs

5/7 cup (about 5-3/4 ounces) granulated sugar dash of salt

1 cup cold milk

1-1/2 teaspoons vanilla

Scald

1 quart of milk, as it approaches the boiling point, stir in the caramel syrup.

Temper the cold mixture by adding the hot mixture to it, 1/2 cup at a time. After about 1/2 of the hot mixture has been mixed with the cold mixture, pour all the mixture into one bowl or pot, stir.

Pour the contents into a baking dish. The baking dish should be in a roaster or hotel pan and surrounded by water. For taste you can sprinkle a <u>very small</u> amount of nutmeg on the top of the mixture. Bake at 325°F till done. If you are using individual serving cups, this will take 40-45 minutes. If you are using a large dish, this may take as long as 1 hour 20 minutes.

Pizza Meat Loaf

1 envelope Lipton's Onion Soup Mix

1-1/2 cups fresh bread crumbs

1/4 cup water

2 eggs

2 lbs. ground beef

I small green pepper, chopped (opt.)

1 cup any kind of Bottled Pasta Sauce

1 cup Shredded Mozzarella Cheese (divided)

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. In large bowl combine all ingredients, except 1/2 cup pasta sauce and 1/2 cup cheese. In a 13x9 inch baking pan, shape mixture into a loaf. Top with remaining 1/2 cup pasta sauce. Bake uncovered for 50 minutes. Sprinkle top with remaining 1/2 cup cheese. Bake an additional 10 minutes or until done. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.

Cheesy Stuffed Meatballs & Spaghetti

1 pound ground beef

1/2 cup Seasoned Bread Crumbs

1 egg

2 ounces Mozzarella Cheese, cut into 12 (1/2 inch) squares

1 jar (1 lb. 10 oz.) pasta sauce

8 ounces Spaghetti, cooked & drained

In medium bowl, combine ground beef, bread crumbs and egg; shape into 12 meatballs. Press 1 cheese cube into each meatball, enclosing it completely. In a 3-quart saucepan, bring Pasta Sauce to a boil over medium-high heat. Gently stir in uncooked meatballs. Reduce heat to low and simmer covered, stirring occasionally, 20 minutes or until meatballs are done. Serve over hot spaghetti. Sprinkle with grated Parmesan cheese, if desired.

Banana Oatmeal Snack Bars

2 packages (18 oz. each) refrigerated raisin cookie dough

2 bananas, mashed

3 eggs

1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon

1 cup uncooked old-fashioned oats

1 cup dried cranberries

1/2 cup dried apricots

1/2 cup chopped pecans

Powdered sugar

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease 13x9 baking pan. Let both packages of dough stand at room temperature about 15 minutes Combine dough, bananas, eggs and cinnamon in a large bowl; beat until well blended. Combine oats, cranberries, and pecans in a medium bowl; stir into dough until well blended. Spread in prepared pan; smooth top. Bake 40 to 45 minutes or until top is brown and toothpick inserted in center comes clean. Cool completely in pan on wire rack. Sprinkle with powdered sugar just before serving.
