become close to the residents that live at The Home and continue to return as volunteers. The day also included time spent with the residents at The Home. The children were very outgoing, as were the residents. We




played trivia together, got to know one another, and shared hugs when it was time to go. The children will return every



Your check for \$2,000.00 was very welcomed and will allow us to further improve our instrumentation to perform this revolutionary new technique. The technique allows us to do a corneal transplant without making a full thickness hole through the center of the cornea and, thereofre, substantially increases the safety of the procedure as well as reduces the recovery time to approximately 1/10 of what it used to be. Your efforts in this areat are greatly appreciated. I know that Mary Greider, who helped to faciliatate the grant, is appreciative as well.

# INDEPENDENT ORDER OF ODD FELLOWS FALLS CREEK LODGE 957



Throughout most the past century, as one traveled through the small towns and cities of this country, the familiar IOOF sign was prominent in most of these communities. Before the social fabric in this country changed, and before our local state and federal governments developed and funded social programs, the poor, the destitute, the orphaned and widowed had few places to turn, and the once familiar IOOF sign was one of these places. Instilled as their basic principles, and a basis for their existence, the Independent Order of Odd Fellows vowed to "visit the sick, relieve the distressed, bury the dead and educate the orphan." And in doing so, over the years built a network of orphanages, cemeteries, old age homes and hospitals through out the country.

The Welfare State and the National Health Service took over the major part of the role of Friendly Societies, and since 1948 the role of the Odd Fellows has evolved in other directions, with a continuing focus on social involvement, care & support and financial benefits. So no longer are the need for orphanages, cemeteries and hospitals, as our tax dollars and other gov't subsidized & large private agencies take now take care of these. There is however, a small but loyal group of Odd Fellows who still think there's a lot of good to be done, and these folks meet regularly in small lodges throughout this country.

Although group numbers and lodges have been declining steadily for the past 40 or so years, there is some encouraging news here in Pennsylvania:

- Locally our Falls Creek Lodge has initiated 2 new members in September, and each member has also completed their degree work receiving their first 3 degrees.
- At the recent degree rally held at Sandy Lake, PA on Sept 22nd, there were 24 candidates from our half of the state receiving their 1st, 2nd & 3rd degrees.
- The lodge in Ambridge announced it will be holding degree work on a regular basis throughout the next year.
- The Lewistown Lodge 97 which closed its doors in March of 2006 found some younger members. There doors are once again open, and the grand lodge of Pennsylvania reinstated their charter in September 2007.

# FROM GRANDMA'S KITCHEN

### CARAMEL SWIRLS

1 cup butter (no substitutes) softened

4 oz. cream cheese, softened

1 cup brown sugar

1 egg yolk

1 tsp. maple flavoring

2 & 3/4 cups all purpose flour

Filling:

30 caramels

2 pkgs (3oz. each)

cream cheese, softened

In a mixing bowl, cream butter, cream cheese, and brown sugar. Add egg yolk and maple flavoring; mix well, gradually add flour. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours or until easy to handle. Meanwhile, in a saucepan or microwave, melt caramels. Stir in cream cheese until blended; set aside. Divide dough in half. Roll each protion between waxed paper to 1/4 in. thickness. Spread caramel mixture over dough to within 1/2 in. of edges. Refrigerate for 4 hours or until firm. Unwrap and cut into 1/4 in. slices. Place 1 in. apart on greased baking sheets. Bake at 350 degrees for 12-14 minutes or until golden brown. Remove to wire racks to cool. Yield: 6 1/2 dozen.

### CANDIED APPLES

8 cooking apples (Rome are good) 1 3/4 cups sugar 3/4 cup water 9 oz. pkg. small red cinnamon candies

Peel and cut apples into eights (remove seeds). In a Dutch oven, combine sugar, water, and candies. Stirring constantly, cook over medium heat about 10 minutes or until candies dissolve. Add apples and bring to a boil. Cook about 7 minutes until apples are tender. Cool; cover and store in refregerator. Serve chilled. Yield: 6 1/2 cups.

### CHOCOLATE COVERED CHERRIES

16 oz. pkg. powdered sugar
1 Tbsp. evaporated milk
1/2 cup butter, softened
2 tsp. vanilla extract
2 - 10 oz. jars maraschino cherries, with or without stems, drained
12 oz. chocolate flavored candy coating
6 oz. semi-sweet chocolate chips

Blend together sugar, butter, evaporated milk, and vanilla. Wrap each cherry in about 1 teaspoon sugar mixture. Arrange on waxed paper in a baking pan and chill overnight. Melt together cady coating & chocolate chips in a double boiler. Stir until melted and blended. Use a candy dipper to dip cherries in chocolate, tapping off excess. Place on waxed paper to cool. Yield: about 4 1/2 dozen.
