GRAND MASTER'S COLUMN

Cupid

Barney was looking at some old Valentine's Day cards, late on a blustery afternoon in early February. He liked to reminisce. He went out to feed Warden and Conductor and then returned to his easy chair. When he got home from school, his wife was gone. Her Rebekah lodge was having a covered dish before the meeting. She left Barney's dinner in the oven. Barney always looked through things he had accumulated over the years, while his wife was away. Mrs. Wells was a fastidious housekeeper and would not allow Barney to spread out his precious collections in the house.

Barney noticed that one of the cards from his youth had a photo of a statue of Cupid, in Rome, as its cover. Strangely, he noticed that Cupid's sash was fastened by a threelink pin.

Barney thought there might be some meaning to the pin. On most days, Barney was stuck working on the farm after he was done teaching school. Since it was 1943 and the war had monopolized all aspects of life, the opportunities for diversion were limited.

The week before Valentine's Day, Barney thought he would take a trip to the library at Princeton to see if one of his Army buddies from World War I, and a lodge brother, was still a librarian at the University.

Barney brought the old Valentine Card with him. He entered the library and saw Tom performing some maintenance on the card catalog.

Barney walked over to Tom and said, "I see the old soldiers are still working on the home front."

Tom looked up and began laughing. He grasped his right lapel and asked, "Are you looking for me?" Barney replied, "For you."

After more than an hour catching up on old times and the events of several years, Barney pulled out the card. He asked Tom if he knew anything about the statue or the pin. Tom suggested Barney give him a week to do some research. Barney agreed to come back the next Saturday.

Tom was waiting for Barney when he returned the following Saturday. The answer long and surprising. Tom had spoken to the Art History faculty members and poured over many books.

The sculpture was over 1,700 years old. The artist was unknown.

He was believed to be a member of a secret group in Rome that used the three links as its recognition symbol. The group was formed as a response to the repression of the Roman government. The society used the principle of friendship, love and truth as guides.

Barney exclaimed, "Wow, it sounds like they were Odd Fellows."

Tom replied, "Yes, but it gets even more interesting."

"How?" Barney asked.

"Well" said Tom, "This is where the story gets a little hard to believe."

Barney was quite anxious, so Tom told the story.

"The ancient society used cupid as its guide and protector. When he saw a person wearing a three-link symbol in trouble, he would shoot an invisible arrow at the assailant and all that person's anger and ill feeling would be converted to friendship, love and truth. This seems to be what we follow in the Odd Fellows, except without Cupid."

Barney thought this may be the ancient beginning of our Order. Tom agreed and felt that they needed to spread this story.

At the next meeting of his lodge, Barney told the story to the members. The members were interested and started thinking of

ways to use the new found knowledge. The lodge decided that it would commission three-link pins with cupid as the background. The lodge members would give the pins to their wives.

After much pleading, a member who was a jeweler was able to get the pins done before the end of February.

The pins were distributed at the last meeting in February. The members took the pins home and gave them to their wives. The magic happened.

After receiving the attractive pins, the wives began responding more favorably toward the lodge. It was as though Cupid hit all the wives with an F.L.T. arrow.

The moral of the story is that we should include our families in our lodge activities. If we don't bring in our family members, our lodge will not continue. We need to use the family as the seed for lodge growth and expansion.

Tuna Filled Tomatoes

3 hard - cooked eggs, coarsely chopped

1 (9oz.) can tuna, drained and flaked

34 cup sliced celery

1/4 cup sliced green onion

1/4 cup sweet pickle relish

1/4 to 1/3 cup mayonnaise

¼ tsp. lemon pepper

1/8 tsp. salt

3 drops hot pepper sauce (optional)

4 medium tomatoes

lettuce leaves and paprika

1. Combine first 9 ingredients, cover and chill. 2. Core tomatoes. Cut each into 6 wedges, cutting to, but not through, base of tomato. 3. Arrange each tomato on a lettuce lined plate. Spoon tuna mixture into tomatoes, sprinkle with paprika.

Caramelts

1 (14 oz.) package caramels ¼ cup milk

4 cups Rice Crispies

1 cup salted roasted peanuts

1. Unwrap caramels, and place in a large saucepan. Add milk; cook over low heat until caramels melt, stirring often. Remove from heat. 2. Stir in cereal and peanuts. Spoon into a buttered 8 inch pan. Firmly press mixture into pan. Cool completely in pan on a wire rack. Cut into squares.

Gooey Turtle Bars

1 cup butter, melted

1 (12oz.) box vanilla wafer cookies, finely crushed

1 (12oz.) package semisweet chocolate chips

1 (12oz.) jar caramel topping

1 cup coarsely chopped pecans

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine butter and wafer crumbs in a 9in.x13in. baking pan. Sprinkle with chocolate chips; drizzle with caramel topping, and sprinkle with pecans. 2. Bake at 350 degrees for 18 to 20 minutes or until chips melt; cool completely in pan on a wire rack. Chill at least 2 hours.

GRAND MASTER'S RECIPE COLUMN

Chicken

After six months as Grand Master, I have learned that Odd Fellows like chicken. Well, the Grand Master likes chicken too. I have listed three recipes that will satisfy the chicken-lover in you.

Chicken Croquettes

1 ¼ cups cooked chicken-chopped fine or ground

½ teaspoon salt

½ onion – grated

1 teaspoon lemon juice

1 teaspoon celery leaves - finely chopped

2 teaspoons chopped parsley

1 cup half and half – warmed (I have done this with regular milk and even with skim, very little difference)

1 1/2 Tablespoons butter

2 ½ Tablespoons flour (all-purpose)

1 1/2 cups bread crumbs

2 eggs – beaten

1 1/2 teaspoons dill weed

Mix the chicken with the salt, grated onion, lemon juice, chopped celery leaves, dill weed, and parsley (and spices if desired; some recipes add cayenne, others thyme or nutmeg, I think you are better off sticking to just salt). The lazy (or efficient) way to do this is to put the ingredients in a food processor do all the chopping, leaving you with a smooth paste. Some consumers would prefer a paste while others like their food chunky, I believe the older crowd would prefer the paste.

Heat the butter in a saucepan, stir in the flour and cook slowly, stirring constantly for 2-3 minutes (this is called a roux). Pull off the heat, blend in the warm half and half with a whisk; return to the heat and continue whisking till you have a thick white sauce (whole milk might work too, some recipes use it instead of half and half, I have even used skim). Season with a little salt and other spices if you prefer.

Add the chicken mixture and stir through thoroughly. Spread the mixture in a cookie sheet to cool, refrigeration is preferable.

After cooled, use 1 heaping Tablespoon to form each croquette, the cone shape is obtained by pressing the chicken lightly into a flexible plastic funnel (not required). You may need to coat the funnel lightly with vegetable oil if the chicken sticks. If you are a little artistic, use your hands to form whatever shape you desire (gloves preferred). If the chicken is too sticky to work with, add more bread crumbs. If is too dry, add milk.

If you form all the croquettes at one time and set them on cookie sheets covered with parchment or waxed paper, they may get too warm, refrigerate again before breading so they don't flatten out. If you have two people working, you can easily bread them and put them on the sheet pans in the same step as forming them.

Breading requires two pans of crumbs, then the eggs then the final pan of crumbs. After you have formed and breaded the croquettes, they must be thoroughly chilled, overnight if possible. Freezing may cause ice crystals to form. Ice crystals degrade your cooking oil so freezing should be avoided.

Fry in deep fat in a wire basket for about 1 minute; if you don't have a deep fryer, make the croquettes smaller and cook them in a deep skillet in about ¾ inch of vegetable oil, turning frequently.

Observations

 This is a "scrap" recipe. If you served fried or roast chicken the day before and it did not sit in the danger zone between 41° and 140° F for more than four hours, you can use it again and save costs.

- 2. The way I would plate it is to serve three or four croquettes with mashed potatoes and gravy and a vegetable. The croquettes are cone-shaped and resemble mountains, the gravy should be drizzled slightly on the top to resemble a snow-capped peak, not a flood. The vegetable should have color. A light dusting of paprika around the edge of the plate will add color too; colorful plates are better received, regardless of taste.
- Use the leftover mashed potatoes for soup (or potato cakes) the next day

Chicken Casserole

Cook four medium to large chicken breasts, cool and dice into small chunks

Mix the diced chicken in a bowl with

1 can of mushroom soup

3 ½ ounces crushed "ripple" potato chips

4 Tablespoons butter

4 Tablespoons flour

¼ teaspoon pepper

2 1/4 cups milk

Move into baking dish, sprayed with non-stick spray, and bake at 375° for 35-40 minutes

Chicken Cheese Log

1 8-oz package of Philadelphia Cream Cheese 1 Large can of boneless Chicken breast parsley grated onion, enough for taste dash of Worcestershire sauce

Mix all ingredients together, shape into log or ball, roll in crushed/sliced almonds

Potato Cakes

This is the ultimate, use up your left-overs recipe

For each cup of left over mashed potatoes, chop one-half a small onion. Sauté the onion in a small amount of margarine until clear.

Mix the mashed potatoes and onions together.

Form into cakes that look like thick hamburgers.

Lightly dust the cakes with flour.

Put about one-half inch of vegetable oil in a skillet and get it hot. Fry the cakes till golden brown, turning once.
