#### **GRAND MASTER'S COLUMN**

The Lodge Picnic

Barney Wells had always looked forward to the family lodge picnic. As a boy he had enjoyed attending with his father. He had seen the changes from the nineteenth to the twentieth century. He had brought his own children and encouraged them to participate in the Odd Fellows.

In 1936 the depression was raging. The depression reduced the number of lodge members but also made those who retained their membership more involved. Barney had teenage children and they were all anxious to go to the lodge picnic. The lodge held its picnic the second Saturday in June. This was after school was out and before the other activities of summer had occupied everyone. As a teacher, Barney liked the picnic in June. He had finished the school year and had a little time to work on the farm before he needed to plan the picnic.

Barney was a farmer and knew that June was too early for corn, but not too early for strawberries. He donated a dozen flats of berries. And his father had left him a large ice cream churn. This was a project that took a committee of several members. Barney donated cream from his cow as well. Other members donated the other ingredients for the ice cream.

After two planning sessions and an entire Friday cooking in the lodge hall, the picnic was set for the town park. The park had been used since the 1880's and Barney was familiar with every aspect of the park. The lodge would reserve the second Saturday in June for five years in advance.

There were numerous games and events. Barney tried to do the things that involved his children. As a teacher and parent, he knew

that keeping his children involved in lodge activities was the best way to insure they would become members.

Barney's son wanted to participate in the three-legged race. This meant Barney would have to tie his right leg to his son's left leg. Since Barney was seven inches taller than his son, this was awkward. The race started with a pistol shot. They were doing well until Barney's son slipped and they both fell. Barney hit his left knee on the ground and instant pain shot up his leg.

As Barney saw the other teams leave them in the dust, he looked down at his left knee. There was a large, very dirty, metal medallion, with a pin from the back sticking through his pants into his knee. He pulled the pin out and struggled to his feet. He untied his son's leg and they both hobbled over to a picnic table. After catching his breath and looking at the medallion for a while, Barney took it over to the pump and ran water over it till he could get it clean. After he got it clean, Barney recognized it as a 25-year service jewel. He turned it over and read the inscription on the back, "To Thomas Wells P.G., May 18, 1905, for faithful service."

Tears welled up in Barney's eyes. This was the jewel the lodge had given to Barney's father. It was the same jewel that his father lost when Barney was in a three-leg race with him at a picnic many years ago. It brought back memories of his youth and of his father, who had been dead for ten years.


The following Monday, Barney took the pin to a jeweler who was a member of the lodge. He had it cleaned, polished and the enamel touched up. He had the jeweler mount it in a frame and he presented it to the lodge at the next meeting. He put a slip of paper in the frame,

telling the story about the jewel being lost and found. He made a carbon copy of the story and gave it to his son.

Barney felt inspired by finding the jewel and recognized the thread uniting the generations. He became youth chairman for his lodge and began numerous programs aimed to incorporate more family activities into the lodge calendar. He came to realize that the little things we do as a family can create strong memories and unite us.



The Association's Music Award Chairman, Robert Grant, has announced that the "Rules" and an Award Application was sent to all the lodges representing the Western District around mid-May.





#### FROM GRANDMA'S KITCHEN

#### **JUMBLEBERRY CRUMBLE**

3 cups halved strawberries

1 1/2 cups fresh raspberries

1 1/2 cups fresh blueberries

2/3 cup sugar

3 Tbls. Quick cooking tapioca

1/2 cup flour

1/2 cup quick cooking oats

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1 tsp. cinnamon

1/3 cup butter, melted

In a large bowl, combine the strawberries, raspberries, and blueberries. Combine sugar and tapioca; sprinkle over berries and toss gently. Pour into a greased 11 in. x 7 in. x 2 in. baking dish; let stand for 15 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a small bowl, combine the flour, oats, and brown sugar. Stir in butter; sprinkle over berry mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 to 50 minutes or until filling is bubbly and topping is golden brown. Serve warm. Yield: 6 to 8 servings.

#### **NUTTY BROCCOLI SLAW**

1 package (3 oz.) chicken ramen noodles

1 package (16 oz.) broccoli slaw mix

1 cup sliced green onions (about 2 bunches)

1 1/2 cups broccoli florets

1 can (6 oz.) ripe olives, drained and halved

1 cup sunflower kernels, toasted

1/2 cup slivered almonds, toasted

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup cider vinegar

1/2 cup olive or vegetable oil

Set aside the noodle seasoning packet; crush the noodles and place in a large bowl. Add the slaw mix, onions, broccoli, olives, sunflower kernels, and almonds. In a jar with a tight-fitting lid, combine sugar, vinegar, oil, and contents of seasoning packet; shake well. Drizzle over salad and toss to coat. Serve immediately. Yield: 16 servings.

# GRAND MASTER'S RECIPE COLUMN

CINNAMON ROLLS (this recipe makes a lot of rolls)

3 cups water

1 1/2 ounces yeast disolved

8 3/4 cups flour (bread flour if you have it, all-purpose will do)

3 3/4 teaspoons salt

3/4 cup sugar

2 Tablespoons Dry milk powder

1/2 stick margarine

1/2 stick butter

Mix the above ingredients with dough hook at low speed for 10-12 minutes. Place in a lightly greased bowl, covered with cloth; let rise for 1 1/2 hours at 80 degrees or in oven on warm with door open (if your house is warm enough, the counter will be OK). Knead the dough and roll out into rectangles (you are going to make a roll and slice off individual rolls). Brush with melted butter. Spinkle a cinnamon sugar mixture on the melted butter (the directions call for 2 pounds of sugar and one ounce of ground cinnamon; you can buy cinnamon sugar already prepared but it increases the cost of your cinnamon rolls; I like to add about 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg to the mixture but Emilie doesn't like nutmeg; you can add ground pecans too, if you like; make sure the cinnamon and sugar are well mixed before you sprinkle them on the rolls). Roll the doungh into a log, slice off individual rolls and place them in wellgreased round cake pans for baking. Brush the tops with melted butter and sprinkle more cinnamon sugar on the rolls prior to baking. Bake at 400 till done.

If you want to put a glaze on these rolls after you are done, (I don't glaze mine) the following glaze works but use it sparingly:

1 cup water

1 pound Karo (16 ounces)

1 1/8 cups granulated sugar

Mix in pan and bring to a boil on the stove, stir till sugar is completely dissolved; drizzle from spoon while still hot.
