

- Only the President and State Governors can order flags on government buildings to be flown at halfstaff.
- When a flag is no longer serviceable or repairable, it should be destroyed by burning in a dignified manner.
- The flag should be lighted at all times, either by sunlight or by an appropriate light source.
- You do not have to destroy a flag that has touched the ground. It is acceptable to wash or dry clean an American flag when it is soiled or dirty.
- The Flag Code does not prohibit the flag from being draped across a coffin. The deceased does not have to be a veteran to have the flag draped on his or her coffin.





LODGE IS BACK IN BUSINESS

Independent Order of Odd Fellows renews its Lewistown charter at a ceremony Monday

Lewistown—The Independent Order of Odd Fellows may be lesser known to the population, however, the IOOF Lewistown Lodge 97 was reinstated Monday evening, bringing the organization back into the community.

The lodge—located at 17 S. Wayne St., closed its doors in March 2006, said former Grand Master John Cupp. After meeting with Lee Mackneer, financial secretary of the Lewistown lodge, the two began a recruitment process the following May.

Mackneer, who has been a member since 1965, is one of six members who now comprise Lodge 97.

"We found younger members and brought it back to life. That's the reason most organizations go under, they can't attract enough younger members." Cupp said.

"We at the Grand Lodge level feel this is an area where Odd Fellowship will help people out," said William Ramsey Jr., deputy grand master of Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, IOOF, and member of the Mount Hor Lodge 736, Cassville.

Monday evening's ceremony awarded Lewistown lodge its charter. Like any Odd Fellow meeting, the details were not secret, but private business was.

Odd Fellows are nothing new. Cupp said the organization made its way to the United States, by way of England, in 1819. It started as a mutual benefit society during the Industrial Revolution. Pennsylvania's order was created around 1823, he said.

"Lodge 97...was founded somewhere in the late 1830s," Cupp said.

"I'm going to guess that it's an old lodge," he joked.

Lewistown Lodge's diminishing membership is a common problem among the Odd Fellows. In 1913, there were more than 210,000 statewide members.

"We have retreated greatly to 3,200 current members, statewide," Cupp said. Some of the lodges in the United States have the minimal amount of five members to retain a charter, others have three or four lodges in one area, he added.

"We are having people die faster than we are taking people in. We are trying to turn it around," said William Locke, grand secretary of Grand Lodge of Pennsylavania.

"The idea is once a lodge is started, members go out in the community and recruit," Cupp explained.

He said regular meetings of Odd Fellows and Rebekah lodges—the latter is for women—are open only to members of the order. "Two meetings a month are held, for an hour each. Ramsey said officers of the Grand Lodges, "are never in the same location" and travel thousands of miles each year.

At the meeting, among other things, members discuss community projects that they might support with labor or money, and lodge fundraising activities, according to the Odd Fellow Web site, www.glpaioof.org.

Cupp said Odd Fellows sponsor Boy and Girl Scouts of America, baseball teams, grand prix racers and help in soup kitchens. "No way that I could generalize what we do. (We) can adopt any civil activity that we want...gives the local organizations freedom," he said.



1 Tbsp. cornstarch
