IN MEMORY OF ELMER

When a Lodge loses a Brother, any Brother, it's a sad time. We, as Odd Fellows, all believe in our Creator and that we go to a better place when we die, but the loss experienced here cannot just be ignored because of this belief. Perhaps it's selfishness, but we who live on are to be denied the pleasure of the company of a departed friend and Brother and that makes us sad.

Alma Lodge #523 lost a Brother on August first whose departure will leave gap in our Lodge and in our hearts. Warren E. Ribblett, Elmer to most of us, was a pillar of Alma Lodge for many years. It isn't necessary to repeat all the things said about Elmer in the very well written obituary created by Grand Lodge and appearing in this publication previously, but rather we would like our Brothers throughout the state to know what we thought about Elmer within the confines of our Lodge.

Elmer died on Wednesday. Friday was our Lodge meeting. Of course, Elmer's passing was on everyone's mind, but while transacting the business of the Lodge, his name came up and his absence was already being felt. As it happens, we have several candidates for membership and we were discussing all we need to do to get them interviewed, voted on and initiated. Someone said that we will need to practice putting on the initiary degree because Elmer was our degree team leader and now he wasn't here to consult and guide us through it. Someone will have to try and learn what Elmer knew and could tell us so we can put on the degree work properly. It didn't take long to miss his presence.

There are a lot of "yes men" in organizations. They never question anything the presumed leaders do or propose. Elmer was not one of them. If a motion was made Elmer questioned or disagreed, he would stand up in Lodge and so state. He wasn't afraid to say his piece and that was to the relief of some who are, at times, no doubt.

Sometimes Elmer was right in his opinions, and, like all of us, sometimes the Lodge deemed his opinions incorrect. Sometimes Elmer brought on debate about a motion which was needed. But, no matter how the vote went, no matter who spoke out with an opinion

opposite Elmer's, when the Lodge closed, he never held a grudge. We would proceed to the social hall for refreshments and Elmer would be as friendly to those who held opposite as he was to everyone. If he had stated his case and lost to a majority vote, so be it, no hard feelings. That was the way he was, and that's good way to be.

Elmer loved his family foremost and was especially proud of his grandchildren. They would come and visit him, especially when he was sick, and help out Grand Pap around the house. He was always happiest when his family was with him. But as far as earthly things go, I wouldn't be surprised if he didn't love the Odd Fellow next. He was an Odd Fellow through and through, and did whatever he could to help the organization and his Lodge. Elmer was our Noble Grand throughout the term just prior to this current one. While others sat on the sidelines, Elmer stepped up and went through the chairs, completing a full term as Noble Grand at age 83.

We will miss Elmer. His name will be spoken in Alma Lodge for many years to come. We will no longer have his wisdom and consultations to call upon but the work he did will live on. I hope someone steps up to become another Elmer; someone not afraid to question the Lodge's actions, not afraid to hold an opposing opinion or to accept criticism and then abide by the rulings of the majority and let bygones be bygones. Every Lodge needs an Elmer to speak on behalf of those too timid to say what they're thinking. We surely will miss him.

We had a couple photos of Warren E. (Elmer) Ribblett in happier times. That's how we'll remember him and that's how he'd want to be remembered by all who knew him. He was known state-wide by Odd Fellows and Patriarchs alike, and perhaps you would like to remember our Brother in the same way; quick to state his opinion, quick to laugh quick to forgive and forget. Elmer was an Odd Fellow.

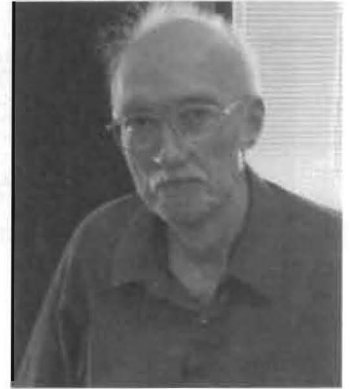

CELEBRATING COLUMBUS

On October 12, 1492, Columbus discovered what would become the Americas. Here are some highlights of the life of this famous Italian explorer.

Christopher Columbus (1451—15056) first sailed across the Atlantic Ocean in 1492, hoping to find a route to India (in order to trade for spices). Columbus made a total of four trips to the Caribbean and South America during the years 1452—1504.

At age 28, in 1479, he married Dona Felipa Moniz de Perestrello. Their son, Diego, was born in 1480. Another son, Ferdinand, was born in 1488.

After much persuading, King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella of Spain agreed to finance his voyage in 1486, but it was not until August 3rd of 1492 that Columbus set sail for the west from Palos, Spain. After a voyage that lasted some 2 ½ months, he landed on an island on an island called Guanahani in the Caribbean off southeastern North America. Columbus later renamed it San Salvador. Thinking he has made it to Asia, Columbus called this area the Indies, and called its inhabitants Indians. While exploring the Caribbean area and looking for gold to loot, Columbus's men traveled to the islands of Hispaniola (now divided into Haiti and the Dominican Republic), Cuba, and many other smaller islands.

Columbus's second voyage to the New World took place from 1493 to 1496. On his third voyage (1498—1500), he landed on the South American continent. A fourth voyage lasted from 1502 to 1504.

Christopher Columbus died on May 20, 1506, in Valladolid, Spain.



WHY IT'S HALLOWEEN

Have you ever seen a ghost running down your street? Of course you have—but only on Halloween night.

Perhaps YOU were that ghost. Halloween is a special holiday for children in the United States. It is a time when children (and adults too!) can dress up as ghosts, witches, monsters, animals, or their favorite superhero. It's all in fun and make believe. Halloween is the only day parents allow their children to go house to house, ringing doorbells and asking for treats.

Halloween's origins date back to the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain (pronounced sow-in). The Celts, who lived some 2,000 years ago in the area that is now Ireland, the United Kingdom, and northern France, celebrated their new year on November 1. This day marked the end of summer and the harvest and the start of the dark, cold winter, a time of year that was often associated with human death. The Celts believed that on the night before the new year, the

boundary between the worlds of the living and the dead became blurred. On the night of October 31, they celebrated Samhain, when it was believed that the ghosts of the dead returned to roam the countryside. These superstitious folk built huge bonfires to keep the ghosts away. They also used the bonfires to cook a feast to celebrate the end of summer and the successful harvest. Thus many of the traditions of Halloween and the har-



vest season have become intertwined.

In time, the celebration came to be known as Hallowe'en or Halloween. Hallow means "holy" and e'en is short for evening. All Hallows Eve—or Halloween—is the evening before All Saints Day celebrated in November 1st.

MINESTRONI SALAD

- 4 Large or 2 medium tomatoes, chopped
- 2 med. stalks celery, chopped
- 1 (15oz.) can garbanzo beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 cup cooked elbow macaroni
- 1/4 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
- 2 Tblsps. prepared Italian dressing
- salt and pepper to taste

Combine tomatoes, beans, celery, and macaroni in a salad bowl. Add cheese. Toss well. Add dressing; toss again. Season with salt and pepper. Makes 4 servings.

CRUNCHY PECAN CHICKEN

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves
- 4 tps. honey mustard
- 1/3 cup finely chopped pecans
- 1/3 cup Italian seasoned bread crumbs
- 2 Tblsps. butter or margarine, melted
- 1/4 tsp. salt

Arrange the chicken in a single layer in a shallow baking pan. Brush the top of each chicken piece with one teaspoon honey mustard. In a small bowl, mix together pecans, bread crumbs, butter and salt. Sprinkle nut mixture evenly over chicken. Bake in 400 degree oven 30 minutes or until fork tender and brown. Makes 4 servings.

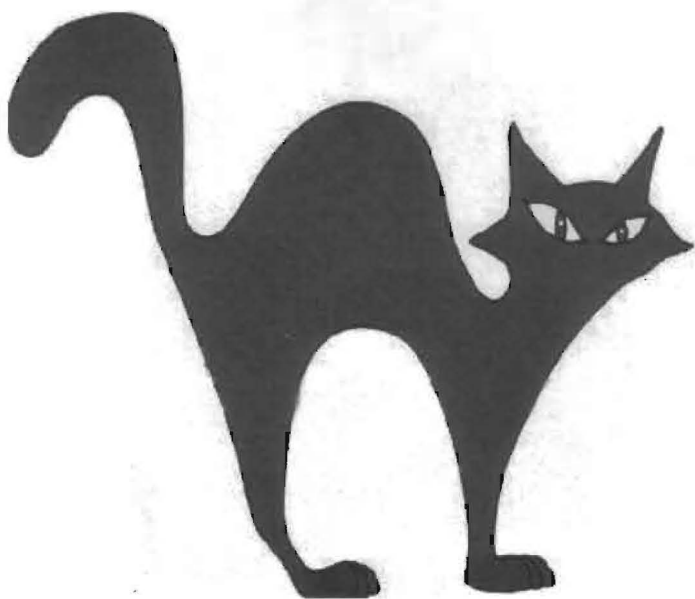
TROPICAL ANGEL FOOD CAKE

- 1 prepared angel food cake
- 1 (8oz.) container nondairy whipped topping, thawed
- 1 (8oz.) can crushed pineapple, with juice
- 1 (3.4oz.) package vanilla instant pudding mix
- 1 ripe banana, thinly sliced
- 1 cup coconut, toasted (see Tip)
- 4 slices fresh or canned pineapple, cut in half

1. Cut cake horizontally, into 3 equal layers. Set aside. In large bowl, combine whipped topping, crushed pineapple and pudding mix. Mix well.

2. Arrange half of banana slices on 1 cake layer. Spread with 3/4 cup of whipped topping mixture. Place middle layer cake on top of bananas and topping. Arrange remaining banana slices on top. Spread 3/4 cup topping on bananas. Place top of cake on top. Frost top and sides of cake with remaining topping mixture. Press toasted coconut onto sides of cake. Arrange pineapple half-slices on top of cake in a ring.

Tip: to toast coconut, heat small nonstick skillet over medium heat. Add coconut and heat, stirring occasionally, until toasted on both sides. Immediately to a plate to prevent burning.
