



Brother Edward John Kirkwood, Elizabeth, was born April 19, 1922 in New Castle, PA the son of Walter and Selena Kirkwood. He answered his last Roll Call, February 27, 2008. He was a graduate of Glassport High School and Clairton High School. A family of three, he had two brothers, Walter and Harrison. He was a U.S. Army Veteran of World War Two and was retired from the U.S. Steel Company where he worked as a boiler maker and sheet metal worker. He was a member of the Austin U.M. Church, Borton, PA. He was a member of the Lincoln Fire Company and a Past President on the Lincoln Borough Water Authority and had served on the Borough Council. He was preceded in death by his wife, the former Henrietta Louise Kass, whom he married April 27, 1946.

He is survived by a son Larry J Kirkwood and daughter Cindy Lou Nylund, two grandchildren, Lori and Paul Kirkwood and two great-grand aughters Emma and Abbey.

Brother Ed was initiated an Odd Fellow into Monongahela Valley Lodge No. 147, Glassport on May 6, 1947 and became a member of Old Monongahela Lodge #209, Elizabeth through consolidation in 1971. In addition to serving as Grand Master he was also a Past District Deputy Grand Master; Past President of the Home for Widows and Orphans, Pittsburgh; Past President of the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs Home of Western, PA; and a Past President of Orchard Manor. There is no formal system to identify the number of children under 18 years of age who have arthritis. There is legislation in Congress known as the Arthritis Prevention, Control and Cure Act that is advocating for a national registry to help determine the actual numbers of children and adults who are diagnosed with arthritis.
