Each one of these fallen soldiers — a car detailer from Pittston; a chaplain from Boise, Idaho; a young kid from Biloxi, Miss., who loved handing out soccer balls to Iraqi kids — will have their very own flag in Strasburg Cemetery by the time Don Bachman and his helpers are finished today.



Strasburg Cemetary is decked out for Flag Day Saturday. Strasburg resident Don Bachman organized a group of people to decorate the cemetary with 4,591 flags, one for each soldier killed in the Iraq War. The flags went up on Memorial Day and will come down tomorrow.

Since the Iraq War began in 2003, Bachman has stuck a small flag in the ground at the cemetery for each U.S. soldier killed in the battle. The soldiers' hometowns are from all around the country.

The first year, when there were just 100 or so deaths by Memorial Day, the 73-year-old Strasburg man put flags in the ground by himself.

He never imagined how much those numbers would grow over the next five years.

Now that the deaths have reached 4,079, Bachman has enlisted the help of Boy Scouts, senior citizens, area veterans and whoever else showed up today at the small cemetary on Franklin Street to put flags in the ground for Memorial Day weekend.

Bachman, a fire equipment salesman, thinks about each person who gave their life as he carefully plants the flags in the ground. He hopes passers by who see the growing collection do too.

"It's hard to explain," he says, pausing, his voice growing thick. "I just think it need to be put out there, for people to realize freedom isn't free."

A lifelong Strasburg resident, Bachman has spent his life helping out around the small historic town southeast of Lancaster..

When he was a kid, during World War II, he used to go sit in a shed near Lampeter and spot planes with his dad, whose nickname was "Brick" and who ran the town's funera business. Bachman wanted to enlist in the service, to serve during the Korean War. But he was a skinny kid and flunkes the physical, something he regrets to this day.

As the years went by, Bachman poured his energies into working, raising a family of four with his wife, Hope, and helping with projects in his community, where he serves as a borough council and water authority member.

In the 1990s, he raised money to put up a flag pole and a monument at the Strasburg Park and a war memorial in Strasburg's square.

Every year on Dec. 7, Pearl Harbor Day, he puts up a Christmas tree, made out of more than 6,000 red, white and blue lights, on the Main Street in Strasburg. Each light represents soldiers who died in Pearl Harbor, the Iraq War and local veterans who have died.

After he started the Iraq War flag project, he initially bought himself, spending close to \$5,000. This year, the Strasburg Sportsmen Association contributed 900 flags to the project.

Bachman is particular about the way the flags are displayed. He and a buddy stretch a string as guide to make sure the flags march down the cemetary's road in straight rows. They make a neat rectangle in another area, where 1,000 or so flags will be clustered.

He does other special things to honor the Iraq War soldiers at the cemetary. Bachman displays a star made out of flags, solar-powered candles, military flags, photos of soldiers and a large number one made out of white carnations, one carnation for each of the 184 Pennsylvania soldiers killed in the war.

"That was somebody's son, daughter husband, or wife — somebody's 'number one' in their family," he says of the display.

The family of Brandon Hardy, a Cochranville Marine who was killed in 2006, came last year to help put up flags.

Bachman says he hopes the display, which will remain until Flag Day, June 14, means something to soldiers' families, and to others who see the flags.

"It's a trbute to those who have given their lives," he says, "to give us our freedom."

#### FROM THE DESK OF THE DEPARTMENT COMMANDER

Barney Wells had always had a job during the depression. He taught high school English and did some farming on the side. When 1941 came around, the depression seemed to be ending, most of his lodge brohters were back to work, if they had ever been out of owrk. he was able to sell his farm products for a little more money and he was thinking of taking some sort of vacation. Early August was a time when he could get away before he needed to do the harvesting. his sons were old enough to llok after teh farm and keep up with the sweet corn sales. Barney's wife didn't like to travel and would never take a vacation, so he never went either. The anual Rebekah session was about all the time she aws willing to spend away from home.

With the above in mind, Barney was looking for some soert of vacation he could take without his wife. When he came to the first meeting in May, he was surprised to find two brothers handing out advertisements for a fishing trip to Canada. Barney liked to fish, or rather he liked or rather he liked to eat fish. He never had time to do much fishing and his farm was not near any body of water wit hany fish longer than a few inches. The pictures of the salmon were most appealing. He thought his wife wouldn't mind too much and he wanted to get away for a while.

The trip was arranged and on Friday, August 1, 1941, Barney and three members of his lodge packed their fishing gear and belongings on a train and headed for British Columbia. The train ride took four days of 24 hours (with some lost time for transfers and lay overs). On Tuesday, August 5, 1941, the brothers were met at the station in Prince George by jim Talltree, a member of a local lodge. jim was a fishing guide who had taken numerous groups into the wild for over twenty years. The salmon season was about two-thirds gone for the Yukon River and it was another train ride to Whitehorse. After the baggage was transferred, the five took the train ride to Whitehorse together. When they arrived, Jim lodged them at his place and fed them dinner. The next day, the crew loaded three pack mules and saddled horses to journey up river t otry their luck at salmon fishing. The ride only took about seven hours so they tried their hand at fishing before calling it a night. All the lodge members caught at least one fish, but they were leery of fishing the creek becasue they could see bears in the distance. Jim built a coule of fires to keep the bears away. Jim kept a lever action 30-30 in case things got too interesting.

The next day seemed fairly successful and all the fisherman were eating their fill and wondering how to pack the salmon in ice to take it home. As they were settling in around the campfires, a bear came lumbering in toward the pack animals. Jim didn't want to chance losing a mule so he shot the bear several times. He had a permit to take the bear and killing a bear was never questioned if you or a domestic animal was in danger, so they skinned the bear for the hide and roasted a piece of it over the fire. They had to use pieces of chain to suspend the roast from the spit because of the weight of the pieces.

Barney had loved the salmon. The bear was just not the same. It was greasy and tough. Barney decided bear hunting was for rugs and not for dinner. As evening wore on Barney and the other fisherman went to sleep. About 3:30 a.m. Barney was awakened by a strange noise. He looked up and saw another bear rummaging through his supplies. He didn't want to yell for fear the bear would turn on him. He took a stick and pulled a piece of the red hot chain out of the dying fire and threw it at the bear. it hit the bear on the buttocks, he roared waking the whole camp and took off running. Barney told the story to the campers.

The next day was the last for fishing and when the troop went to the stream there was a bear sitting in the stream about 300 yards away. Jim thought the way the bear was sitting was unusual so he pulled out his binoculars to take a look. When the bear heard Jim he got out of the stream and walked hurriedly away. Jim started to laugh. The bear hada brand on its rump. It was the perfect image of three links. Jim said to Barney, "I guess you made an Odd Fellow of him."

Barney replied, "Just by putting the three links mark on him?"

Jim said, "No, not just that. There are five of us here and he probably thought we were going to hold a meeting. The last time he came to our meetin g we made him leave without refreshments."

The whole crew had a good laugh and packed up and left so they could get back to Whitehorse before dark.
