Barney had always liked helping with the lodge Christmas Party. It was designed for the children and later grandchildren of the members. Barney first played Santa at the 1939 Christmas party, on Saturday, December 23, 1939. Barney was a willing candidate and his youngest child was still able to appreciate Santa. The lodge bought a new outfit for the 1939 Christmas party and Barney had to stuff a pillow in it look anywhere near the part.

while Barney's son and daughter-in-law passed out hot chocolate and cookies. There was a committee of Rebekahs that handed out coloring books and games.

The climax of the afternoon was to be a visit with Santa. The lodge brought one of the large chairs for the scene supporters down into the social room. It was draped with a Christmas table cloth. There was a large basket of small boxes of candy with a candy cane taped to the top, it was stuffed into a feed sack and Barney carried it with him. Barney was to sit in the chair, ask each child what he or she wanted and give them a box of candy.

The plans were going well. Barney made a triumphal entrance while Gene Autry's Rudolph, the Red Nosed Reindeer was playing on the phonograph. As he made his way through the cheering crowd, all the children were anxious to see Santa. He lined himself up with the chair and sat down amid cheers and music. The children and Rebekahs in the hall did not hear the loud rip as Barney settled into the seat. Barney was sure his pants had just ripped the entire length of the seam up to the belt. He fidgeted a little, and settled in. He was grateful the chair was draped.

The children filed up, one by one and told their hearts' desires to Barney. He gave them a box of candy and cautioned them to be good little boys and girls. All the time he was wondering how he was going to get off the chair and get out of there.

Barney was not sure whether he was glad or sad to see the last child leave his lap. The hall was filled with 50+ children, many lodge members and about 20 Rebekahs, some of whom Barney had never seen before. Brother Molinari was doing some of the kitchen clean-up and asked Barney if he would like to take off the outfit and join the others in singing a few songs. Barney said he would rather stay in the big chair and relax. Less than five minutes passed when Barney's son brought him a large mug of cocoa. Barney though he could sip the cocoa and wait out the crowd.

After ten minutes of sipping the cocoa, the children and adults were still singing Joy to World. Barney knew the crowd wouldn't break up till they sang Silent Night. As he looked at the bottom of the cocoa mug he began thinking about the three cups of coffee he had before he left for the party. Every song seemed to be the length of a Wagnerian opera as Barney watched the children singing.

Barney was getting more and more uncomfortable, when his four year old granddaughter, Emily, plopped down on his lap and asked if he was going to eat Christmas dinner with her. Since she could tell he was Santa, he told her she would be having Christmas dinner with him. She started to talk about a doll house but Barney was feeling so uncomfortable he did not hear half of what she said. She finally went over to her parents who putting away the record player since Silent Night had just ended. Everyone was putting on his or her coat and getting ready to go outside. Brother Clancey asked Barney if he could help move the tables and take the chair back up to the lodge room. Barney grabbed Clancey and whispered in his ear that he had no seat in his pants. Since all the children were seated before Barney, he could exit to the rear and retreat to the rest room where his clothes were.

Clancey came up with an idea. He went in the kitchen and got another table cloth. He held it up to shield Barney. He told the children who were leaving that the reindeer spooked easily and he had to give Santa cover till he got to the spot in the hall where the reindeer were tied. Barney felt as if the weight of the world was lifted when he got to the rest room.

After regaining his composure and changing clothes, Barney helped move the tables and chairs and wished everyone a Merry Christmas.

Little Emily went over to Barney on Christmas and asked, "Grandpa, were there really reindeer in the hall at the lodge?"

Barney replied, "Not exactly, but sometimes there are other important needs that must be met, I needed to get a little work done to the suit."



THE MYSTERY OF THE MISSING GRAVE MARKERS

Tombstone stairway found; has a century old Tamaqua cemetery crime been solved?

It might be a case suitable for Agatha Christie.

Plus, it's seemingly fitting to be happening in October, the month of Halloween.

Stolen tombstones, for decades partially hidden and unnoticed, have been found in the backyard of a historic Tamaqua house built by one of the community's most prominent architects.

People are beginning to buzz about the discovery of a 'tombstone stairway' and retaining wall containing as many as 15 or more 19th century headstones uncovered in the backyard of a private residence at 398 West Cottage Avenue. The large four-story Dutch Colonial manse was erected and occupied by James D. Schlegel.

Schlegel was one of Tamaqua's most highly respected early builders and architects, responsible for many of the stately homes that line Broad Street and "Mansion Row" along West Broad.

The discovery might help solve a century-old crime even though it's likely nobody alive today would remember it.

"We got a call from the owner who said they were found in her backyard," said Justin Bailey, cemetery caretaker. Bailey has been spending his time relocating the tombstones to their rightful positions in the elegant hillside resting place overlooking the town.

The surprising discovery took place about two weeks ago after the property changed hands.

The surprising find came during inspection of the land.

Upon close examination of the rear yard, a steep hillside that climbs 150 feet to upper Mahanoy Street, Davies spotted the

twin tombstones of two infant girls.

"The one child was only 4 months old. My daughter was the same age. That's what made me want to see them returned," she said.

Then, she discovered the exterior stairway and more tombstones. Some are inscribed with the last name 'Beach,' some are the 'Latham' family, and there are more some unreadable.

Davies contacted the police, who offered to contact local cemeteries. In the meantime, Davies took matters into her own hands and called Odd Fellows, the nearest and largest resting place.

A quick check of early records revealed that several of the tombstones came from the southeast corner of Odd Fellows Cemetery, a Victorian garden plot begun in 1863. The remaining stones came from other sections.

"There once were trees there. It was more forested," said Bailey. There are many tombstones missing in that general area, he said,

pointing to a southeast hillside that slopes in the direction of West Cottage Avenue.

At the Schlegel property, some of the stolen limestone and granite headstones were used to build a stairway leading up the sharp terrain. Most of the stairway has been dismantled. Other markers were used in a retaining wall. Many have concrete adhering to them concrete which appears to be very old.

"They'll need to be chiseled," Bailey noted. "Some appear to have been purposely broken to fit the steps."

The stairway and wall were partially obscured by decades of erosion. There may be other headstones completely buried in the steep, rocky hillside.

According to records, the 11-room, brick Schlegel house was built on Aug. 2, 1912, confirmed by a date and signature carved into a first floor cement wall. The signature is that of Schlegel's son, George, who graduated from Tamaqua High on June 17, 1914.

The house itself has some unusual characteristics, including a cellar tunnel.

Situated at the bottom of Stadium Hill, at the corner of Lehigh Street and Cottage

Avenue, the imposing home was erected atop an 1800s beer vault used by Yuengling Brewery. Pottsville. The brewery used the vault for local storage purposes. The vault is still present beneath the rear portion of the home and can be accessed from the basement. It consists of a stone arch built into the hillside, an eight-foot tunnel dug in order to keep beer cool. Its contents were refreshed by supplies arriving via Yuengling's teams of horses.

New owner Gwen Davies, a Yardley native, said she and her fiancé purchased the home about a month ago. The building is located in the South Ward section and is considered a strong contributing resource to the 55-block Tamaqua National Historic District.

While the tombstone discovery answers the question of what happened to the markers, it must be emphasized that nobody is pointing a finger as to the identity of the person(s) responsible. Nobody knows for certain who stole the markers and incorporated them into a backyard stairway and retaining wall, or when, exactly, it took place. In addition, the building has had many owners over the years.

According to early records, Schlegel married Mana Beader, daughter of Charles Beader of Shamokin, and the couple had seven children: George J., Verna, Erye, Nelson, Pauline, James and Daniel.

Schlegel died in September of 1958, at the age of 88 years.

Bailey would like to return the tombstones to their original locations in the next week or so and is hoping to recruit assistance from other members of Odd Fellows. He also said he's be grateful for any help offered by the public. Anyone interested in lending a hand can call the cemetery at (570) 668-2070.

In the meantime, Davies is glad to see justice done as she moves into her new house.

"I just want to get them back where they belong," she said.





