Old Glory

WASHINGTON, DC - US Senator Jim Inhofe (R-Okla.) today praised the passage by unanimous consent of his bill (S.1877) clarifying US law to allow veterans and servicemen not in uniform to salute the flag.

Current law (US Code Title 4, Chapter 1) states that veterans and servicemen not in uniform should place their hand over their heart without clarifying whether they can or should salute the flag.

"The salute is a form of honor and respect, representing pride in one's military service, "Senator Inhofe said, "Veterans and service members continue representing the military services even when not in uniform."

"Unfortunately, current US law leaves confusion as to whether veterans and service members out of uniform can or should salute the flag. My legislation will clarify this regulation allowing veterans and servicemen alike to salute the flag, whether they are in uniform or not.

"I look forward to seeing those who have served saluting proudly at baseball games, parades, and formal events. I believe this is an appropriate way to honor and recognize the 25 million veterans in the United States who have served in the military and remain as role models to other citizens. Those who are currently serving or have served in the military have earned this right, and their recognition will be an inspiration to others."

MIDDLETOWN HOME


Residents are looking forward to the New Year! 2008, WOW, time flies! After all of the special events going on in December, the residents aren't



TRAVELS ON THE "REBEKAH TRAIL" TO DENVER

During August 2007, the privilege of serving as the PA IARA Representative to the 91st Annual Session of the International Association of Rebekah Assemblies was a new and fine experience for me. IARA President Sandra K. Young's Session was held at the Adam;s Meark hotel in Denver, Colorado. Traeling via Amtrak from Harrisburg to Pittsubrgh, Chicago into Denver Union Station afforded views of "America the Beautiful" from the observation car and tasty meals attractively served in the dining car. "Surviving" in very small sleeping quarters and testing one's sense of balance when moving about were challenges but fun being shared with jovial traveling companions.

The introduction to International proceedings began on Sunday morning, August 19th with orientation for Representatives by focusing formation prior to attending provided awareness of legislation to be acted upon and thus helpful for decision-making/voting. There were over 150 pages of legislative items and other information pertaining to our Order distributed to us at business sessions daily 7:45 a.m. to noon or 1 p.m. through August 24th. The tracking of bills and resolutions proposed, adopted, withdrawn, or to lay over, plus amendments, from the IARA to The Sovereign Grand Lodge and the return were found in the Daily Journal of The Sovereign Grand Lodge and reports given by our Representative to SGL, Sheryl Rohde.

In a recent communication to the Lodges, a concise report on adopted legislation was submitted by me on the following topics: Interfraternal Sign and Answer, term for IARA Representative, non-contributing membership, Rituals and Theta Rho Girls' Clubs.

Interest in organizing a Theta Rho Girls' Club or an United Youth Group brought Sharon Sells of the International Committee and from Colorado to PA Unified Session in June 2007. The United Youth Group (boys and girls) idea was purt into action approximately 3 years ago with Nashville, TN serving as a test model.

On the fun/fellowship part of Rebekah-Odd Fellowship, a picture of Sharon Sells, taken at Fun Night "Western Night in Tin Cup", featured good food, square dancing, and beautiful costumes such as worn by Sharon Sells.

The Lodge in Sweden is quite different from ours here in the U.S., it takes a member almost two years to complete each degree. They dress in a grand fashion making their meeting most formal.





ITALIAN SAUSAGE LOAF

8 oz. bulk Italian sausage1 Tbsp. fennel seeds2 (11oz.) refrigerated French bread

- 1. Heat medium skillet over medium high heat until hot. Cook sausage 6 to 8 minutes or until browned and no longer pink, breaking it up as it cooks. Add fennel seeds halfway through cooking. (sausage may be cooked 1 day ahead. Cover and refrigerate. Bring to room temperature before using.)
- 2. Heat oven to 375 degrees. Lightly spray baking sheet with cooking spray. Gently unroll one loaf of dough, sprinkle with half sausage mixture. Roll up, starting at long edge; place seam side down, on baking sheet. Repeat with remaining dough, placing several inches apart from first loaf. Spray tops with cooking spray. With sharp knife, slash tops of loaves every 1 or 1 & 1/2 inches.
- 3. Bake 15 or 20 minutes or until crust is golden brown. 8 (2 slice servings)

HOLIDAY CHERRY PIE

1 (16 oz.) package frozen sweet cherries

1/4 tsp. almond extract

1 (14 oz.) can sweetened, condensed milk

1 Tbsp. lemon juice

1 (8 oz.) package cream cheese, softened

8 oz. frozen whipped topping, thawed

2 (8 inch) chocolate crumb pie crusts

Chop cherries while frozen. Keep frozen until ready to use. In a large mixing bowl, beat cream cheese with electric mixer until softened. Gradually add condensed milk. Mix well. Add chopped cherries, lemon juice and almond extract, stir just until combined. Fold in whipped topping. Pour cherry mixture evenly into pie crusts. Freeze 8 hours or overnight. Serve immediately; pie pieces thaw quickly. Store leftovers in freezer.

WHITE HOT CHOCOLATE

8 oz. high-quality white chocolate, chopped 1 cup whipping cream 3 cups whole milk 1/2 tsp. peppermint or vanilla extract

Place all ingredients in large glass measuring cup. Microwave on high for 3 to 7 minutes or until hot; whisk until chocolate is melted and cocoa is frothy.
