CHARLES BOYD KELLY

Brother Charles "Chuck" Kelly, of Saltsburg, PA was born in Saltsburg on March 13, 1931 a son of the late Joseph and Esther Helgert Kelly. He was initiated an Odd Fellow on October 12, 1967 having joined Saltsburg Lodge #646. He became a Past Grand of that Lodge and received his Grand Lodge Degree on April 29, 1972. He served as their Secretary until they consolidated with Latrobe #541, Latrobe in 1990. He also served as Noble Grand and Secretary for Latrobe #541. He was a associate member of Connoquenessing Lodge #278, Butler. He was a Past District Deputy Grand Master. He was initiated into Cecelia Rebekah Lodge #170, Saltsburg on May 19, 1979 and held membership there until they went defunct in 1988. He then joined American Beauty Rebekah Lodge #319, Manor, PA. He joined Gladys Rebekah Lodge #103, Brownfield as an associate on October 26, 1990 and then joined as a regular member in 1991 when American Beauty consolidated with Star of Glassport #563. He joined John E. Nace Encampment #199 (formerly Westmoreland), Latrobe on April 23, 1986 where he became a Past Chief Patriarch and received his Grand Encampment Degree on November 11, 1989. He served the Grand Encampment as Grand Patriarch from 2000 to 2002 and Grand Marshal for PGP Fred See in 2004. He was a member of Canton Ridgely #8, Jersey Shore, Patriarchs Militant and received the Decoration of Chivalry on June 23, 1992. He also was a member of Monongahela Degree Lodge #88.

Aside as serving Grand Lodge as a District Deputy, he served as Grand Chaplain under Fred See from 1980-1981 and Grand Conductor under PGM See in 1981-1982. He was installed as Grand Warden in 1993 and excelled through the chairs and served as Grand Master from June, 1995 until June, 1996.

Chuck married the former Irene Sutton, September 16, 1950, she is a Past President of the Rebekah Assembly. He was a US Navy Veteran and a member of the Saltsburg Presbyterian Church. He retired from the Latrobe Steel Co. in 1993.

Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by a infant daughter in 1961, two brothers and one sister.

Surviving in addition to his wife are two sons, Timothy and Charles F.; two daughters, Charlene and Judy, nine grandchildren, six great-grandchildren, five brothers, James, Robert, Donald, Jerry and Thomas; five sisters, Anna, Irene, Arlene, Kathy and Janet.

IOOF services were held and burial was in the Twin Valley Memorial Park, Delmont.

Chuck's symbol was the "Hands of Fraternity", "May you always have your hand out to help, in anyway you can, all those who are in need. This covers our need of God's help in all things we want to do, and in his helping us, we can in turn help others in need. In doing this we are helping better this world that we live in."

Brother William B. Struchen Sr, 88, of Sharon, was initiated into Adoniram Lodge #739, Sharpsville on March 9, 1983. He became a Past Grand of that Lodge on October 5, 1984 and received his Grand Lodge Degree March 26, 1985. He transferred his membership to Sharon #347, Sharon in 1991 where he was a member at the time of his death. He held Associate membership in both Adoniram #739 and Sandy Lake Lodge #573. He served as Grand Marshal under Grand Master William Locke and Grand Guardian under Grand Master Ernest Nelson. He was initiated into Sharpsville Rebekah Lodge #110 on August 11, 1983. He was initiated into Oil City Encampment #182, Titusville on June 7, 1986 and went on to serve as Grand Patriarch of the Grand Encampment in 1996-96. At the time of his death he was a member of Heneosis-Adelphon Encampment #42, Lake City.

He was an Army Veteran of World War Two and a member of St. Paul's U.C.C., Hermitage.

He is survived by his wife of 66 years, the former Dorothy Grafe, PPRA, one daughter, two sons, seven grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

FROM THE DESK OF THE DEPARTMENT COMMANDER

Greetings to all kind readers. This is the first message I will be sending you as Department Commander. I am writing a month or so ahead of publication so I will try to deal with a subject that is long past and will not change. I am going to try to entertain you with Barney Wells, the hero of all Odd Fellows. We had started Barney just prior to World War I, where he had fought in France. He was a High School English teacher and a part-time farmer in New Jersey, just across the line from Pennsylvania. I jump around in his life to show some humorous occurrence. Since this is the July 2008 column, we will explore the Odd Fellows Fourth of July picnic.

Barney Wells was happy the war was over and all his friends, lodge brothers and family were home for the 1947 Fourth of July picnic. Barney's lodge was the host for the picnic this year. The picnic was for all lodges, Rebekah Lodges, encampments, cantons and auxiliaries in the area. Since Barney's farm was centrally located, he offered it for the picnic. The town park would have favored some lodges too much and central location was best. His offer was accepted.

Shortly before noon, three members of the lodge arrived with a truck loaded with disassembled picnic tables. Dinner was set for 4:00 p.m. After the truck was unloaded, they found they forgot the bolts. Brother Tom Johnson hurriedly went back to the lodge hall to look for the bolts. Brothers Hart and Simmons were building a fire to roast hot dogs and marshmallows. Things looked OK.

Barney thought he would try his hand at making lemonade. He began with two gallons of water and started squeezing lemons. Soon the lemonade was too tart and he began adding water and sugar. The entire process was going smoothly except for the taste. While trying to balance the acidity of the lemons with the sweetness of the sugar, Barney looked up at one of the trees in his grove, the site of the picnic. He soon recognized a bee hive. This caused little concern until 3:45 p.m. when the bees started to swarm. Brother Johnson was bent over bolting the last picnic table together. His flower colored pants excited the curiosity of the bees. As he began running through the grove to get away from the bees, he tripped and stumbled into Barney. Barney tumbled head-first into a huge kettle of lemonade.

Barney was unable to see clearly because of the lemonade in his eyes. The bees began to sting him. He took off running toward the creek. Because he couldn't see well, he ran too close the fire and caught a stick with his pant leg. His right pant leg started to burn. Although Barney didn't get much more than a sunburn, the right leg of his pants was gone by the time he reached the creek. After washing off the lemonade in the creek, Barney limped back to house to change clothes. He had never been happier that he had offered to host the picnic, so that he didn't have to drive home to change.

The rest of the day went fairly well and the picnic was a roaring success. Brother Johnson had to go home to change but he made it back before the food was all gone. Barney's wife made fresh lemonade in another kettle and it was served to the crowd.

There was about one-third of a kettle of lemonade Barney had fallen in. After everyone had left the picnic, Barney asked Brother Mike Clancey to help him carry the kettle over to the woods to dump. Brother Clancey would hear of no such thing. "We shouldn't waste lemonade," he said, "we should sanitize it." Brother Clancey went out to his car and returned with a flask of whiskey, which he poured into the lemonade to sanitize it. This was the birth of hard lemonade, another product that had its origins among the Odd Fellows. Now you know the rest of the story.

CHARLEROI #1030 AWARDS

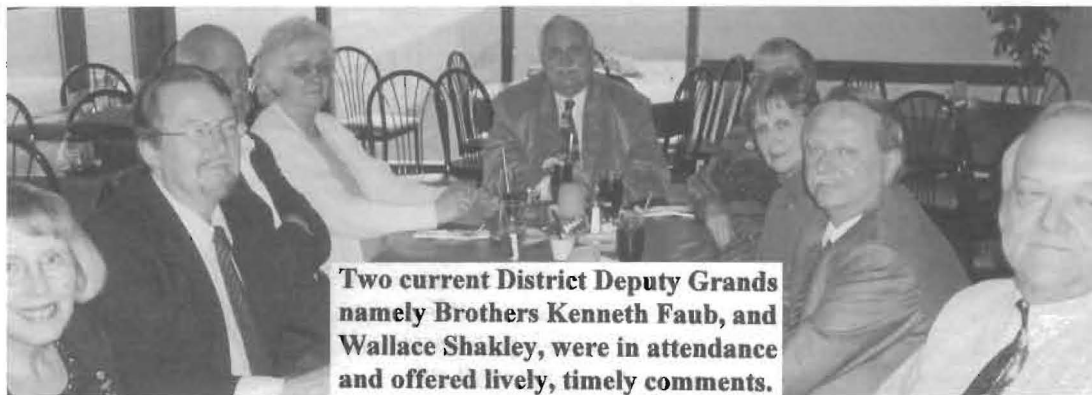

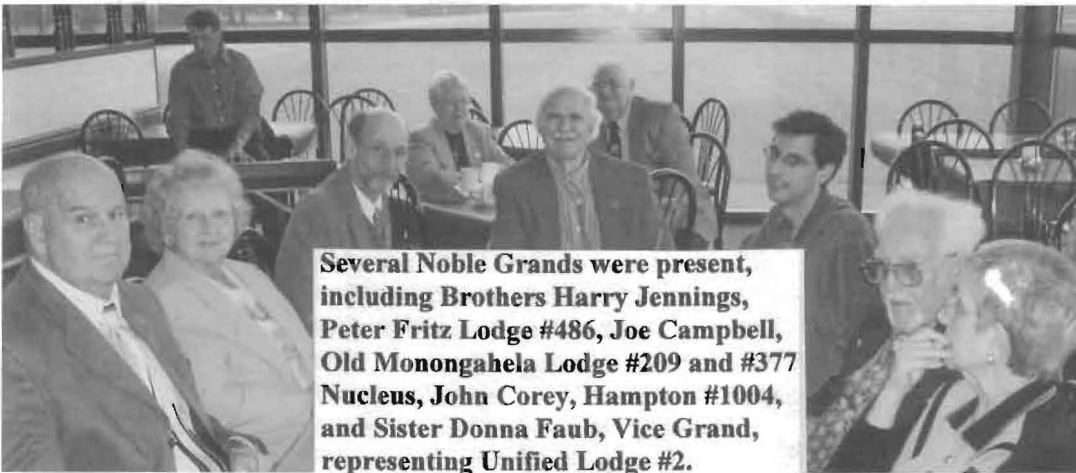

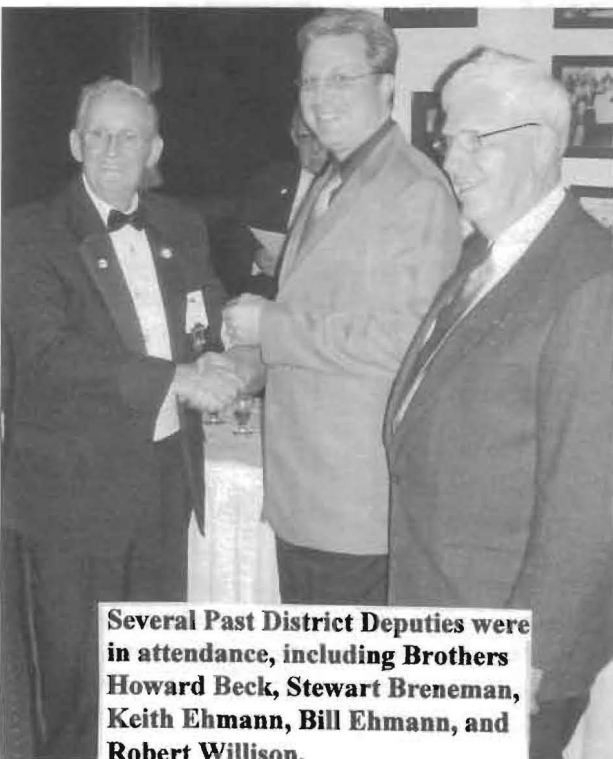
Years of Service awards were given to seven different members of #1004 Lodge, these presented by Grand Master Stewart Breneman.

Mission: To witness the Odd Fellows laying of the wreaths at the Tomb of the Unknowns and to visit some of the memorials dedicated to those who fought to preserve our freedom in this great Nation.

A stop in Breezewood for breakfast and to pick up 2 more members of Alma Lodge, 1 member from State College, 3 from Mt. Hor, and 2 from Bellefonte, was the first order of business. Now, we were 41 strong.

The trip to DC went quickly due to the good conversation, perfect weather and professional driving, and before we knew it, we were pulling into the area where the historic monuments pay tribute to those that caused them to be created. The driver found an excellent parking place and we had plenty of time to walk about and take photos or simply reflect on the reasons these monuments exist.

Back on the bus, it was a short ride to Arlington National Cemetery, where we parked and enjoyed an excellent lunch before walking to the Tomb of the Unknowns to witness some of the most moving and solemn ceremonies on earth; the changing of the guards and the laying of the wreaths to honor the soldiers buried in this tomb, "—Known Only To God."

The number of Odd Fellows from around the Nation was impressive, and we did well in paying our respects. Just on our bus of 41 Odd Fellows, 13, or 32%, were veterans, representing the wars from WWII to Viet Nam. No one left the ceremony unimpressed.

Since it is our mission as Odd Fellows to be "—grateful to our Creator, faithful to our Country, and fraternal to our fellow man," it is imperative this honor to our fallen heroes continue. Therefore, it is imperative that we recruit new, young members into our order so it can. It would certainly be sad if one day there weren't any Odd Fellows to lay these wreaths at the Tomb of the Unknowns. What an honor it is to be an organization permitted to do so.

After the ceremonies concluded, it was back on board the bus for some more DC sightseeing and then off to a nice dinner on the way home. Again, the trip home seemed to go by quickly and we bid farewell to each other, Brothers and Sisters, and went our separate ways.

This story wouldn't be complete if we didn't thank Carl E. Thomas, Jr. for arranging the entire trip. He did it all, from chartering the bus to packing the lunches to supplying coolers with ice cold drinks for us. If you've ever arranged and planned a trip for a group, you know just how much there is to think of and how much time is involved. Carl covered all the bases. We tried to think of something to complain about, some small detail he missed, but we couldn't find one. Thank you, Carl.

Dear Sir and Brother:

I desire to express a few thoughts in regard to the discontinuance of the monthly issue of the PENNSYLVANIA ODD FELLOW.

In the beginning, permit me to state, that the result attained at Erie was prompted by an envious and selfish spirit managed by a common political ingenuity, the slickness of which was not observed until after the wanton object was accomplished.

When you became Secretary of the Grand lodge, you naturally succeeded to the Editorship and Management of the Pennsylvania Odd Fellow, the organ of our Order, the real official outlet the Grand lodge had in its close fellowship with the membership at large. Of course this was an added burden placed upon you, and some of your brethren thought you did not have the ability to "carry on", that you would fall down on the job and the paper drop into oblivion. Among your critics was a Moses who thought that if the mantle of Editorship had been placed upon his shoulders, together with a nice fat fee, the paper would become an asset and not a liability, but the excellent manner in which you handled the paper from your first issue amazed your critics and proved that you were capable of making it a worth while readable paper. The stimulant given it was noticeable by its readers, and that it was shining brighter than ever and predictions made of its ultimate success.

But the membership at large failed to realize and appreciate the value of an authorized organ; while circulation increased materially the subscribers did not come forward in sufficient numbers to enable you to obtain good paying advertisements, but time and patience would overcome this.

A surprise was sprung near the end of Thursday morning's session by moving to rescind the action taken on Wednesday in the matter of a report relating to the PENNSYLVANIA ODD FELLOW. A very innocent motion for the moment that those present failed to see or realize. The motion was adopted, followed by another that the publication be discontinued, ect., and this one likewise was adopted. This action was a great step backward in Odd Fellowship in Pennsylvania, but what do the victors care, they won their point and downed the efficient Secretary in his gallant efforts to up build our struggling membership and bring it back to its efficient, energetic and prosperous condition of former years.

We need more of the Golden Rule and real toleration we preach so much to the uniformed in the management of our affairs, legislative and financially.

When the discontinuance of this valuable paper becomes known generally speaking, I have no doubt many lodges will instruct their Representatives to legislate for its reissue; I feel confident my lodge will do so.

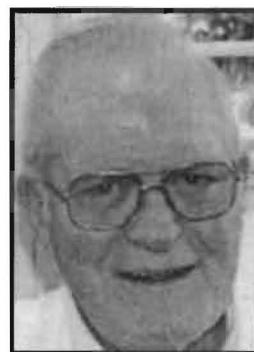

FORMER SCHELLSBURG LODGE HALL PUT TO GOOD USE

Museums by their very definition, are places of learning. Ebersole noted that he never really knew much about the Odd Fellows, but the cased exhibit featuring the fraternal group's history and memorabilia, including costumes, helmets, ritual medals, and even an outrageous and frankly forbidding bearded "Goliath" mask used by the Odd Fellows in their mysterious skits, were immensely informative.

Though no longer in operation, The Scheesburg I.O.O.F. was a significant part of the community for many years.



Ross Williams of Schellsburg has loaned the museum one of the first uniforms of the Shawnee Valley Fire Company, formed in 1957.

Other eye-catching exhibits in the museum are a circa 1800s pine coffin upon a wooden bier; an old voting booth from the Schellsburg election house; on of the first uniforms for the newly formed Shawnee Valley Fire Department in 1957; a gorgeously colorful mural of Lady Liberty found on the third floor of the Hall where the Odd Fellows met; a standing suit of armor from Storyland, the children's park on the hill about Schellsburg where for many years thousands of children delighted to the woodland re-creations from well-known nursery rhymes; photographic displays of the historic Lincoln Highway and Old Log Church as well as the creation of Shawnee Lake; saddlebags (on loan from Fort Bedford

Museum) that belonged to Peter Schell, second of John Schell's eight children, who in the 1830s was a Bedford County judge and an important county figure; and even a slide presentation of past and present Schellsburg homes, churches, and other landmarks.

Perhaps one of the most impressive features of the museum is the museum is the first thing that meets the eye before you even enter the building: a magnificent late 1800s survey owned by Carol Scott, of nearby New Paris. The survey, which has just been restored, is a treasured heirloom passed down to her from the James Madison Horne and the Edith Hilligass Horne family. Scott, also a committee member, has also loaned the committee a doll and a coverlet that until recently hadn't seen the light of day for a half century.

(The survey will be at the museum only on May 25, July 5 and 6, and August 30.)

It all sounds as if the sheer number of displays as well as their variety would overwhelm even a large room housing them, but the committee was creative and wise in making the museum user friendly. A visitor can comfortably spend ten minutes or two hours exploring Schellsburg's vibrant history.

Elsie Slack, a Hometown treasured family heirlooms and several vintage clothing items. Her motivation in helping create the museum was simple.

"I like the town of Schellsburg and think it has a lot to offer."

Connie Hurtt, her daughter, another committee member, echoed her mother's feelings. "I love Schellsburg and want people in the country to know why." She motioned to the crowd of visitors examining the exhibits. "Here it is."

Hurtt and her husband Charlie live in Maryland but also own a home in Schellsburg's New Town.

The Hometown Museum will be open daily noon to 4 a.m. through September 1. Admission is free but donations are gladly accepted.
