

FROM GRANDMA'S KITCHEN

Sauteed Chicken Tenders With Cinnamon Applesauce

3 lbs. apples, peeled, cored, and cut into 1/2 - slices

2 Tbs. butter, divided 1 tsp. ground cinnamon

3/4 cup flour 3/4 tsp. salt 1/4 tsp. ground pepper 12 chicken tenders

2 Tbs. olive oil

1. Cook apples, 1 Tbs. butter, and cinnamon in a large saucepan over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until apples have broken down, about 40 minutes. Add 1 cup water after 25 minutes, if sauce is extremely thick and starting to brown. If you prefer smooth applesauce, puree with blender until smooth.

2. Meanwhile pour egg into shallow baking pan, or deep-dish plate. Blend flour, salt and pepper in another shallow baking pan; mix well.

3. Dip chicken tenders into egg, turn to coat, then shake of excess egg. Dip one side of tender into flour mixture, then other side to coat. Discard leftover flour mixture.

4. Heat 1 tablespoon olive oil and 1 tablespoon remaining butter in large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Cook half chicken until golden brown, about 6 min. Repeat with remaining tenders. Serve hot with applesauce.

Cob Corn in Barbecue Butter

4 ears fresh corn, shucked 1/2 tsp. dry barbecue seasoning

2 Ths. butter, softened 1/4 tsp. salt

1 large egg, beaten

1. Pour 1 inch water into large skillet. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Add corn; Cover. Cook 4 to 6 minutes or until kernels are slightly crisp when pierced with fork. Transfer to serving platter.

2. Blend butter, seasoning, and salt in small bowl until smooth. Serve with corn.

Chocolate Peaches and Cream Pie

1/2 cup chocolate syrup 1 (6oz.) Ready Crust Shortbread Pie Crust

4 cups peach or vanilla ice cream, softened 12 fresh or canned peach slices

1/4 cup pecan halves Additional chocolate syrup for garnish

1. Drizzle 1/2 cup chocolate syrup evenly over bottom of crust. Spoon ice cream over crust.

2. Freeze 3 hours or until firm.

3. Just before serving, arrange peach slices and pecan halves on top of ice cream.

Drizzle additional chocolate syrup on top of pie. Freeze leftovers.

HISTORIAN TO EXAMINE WWI TIME CAPSULE

Meeting to take place in Borough's oldest brick building By Al Zagofsky

The White Haven Historian Society meets Sunday eveing in the historic Odd Fellows Building to examine what the Society's vice president, Jack Crosley, calls a "World War I time capsule."

The meeting, which is planned for tomorrow evening, April 20 at 6:30 p.m. at the Odd Fellows Building, 238 Main St. in White Haven will examine a chest, dating to the Great War, and gift it to Jesse Teitelbaum, executive director of Luzerne County Historical Society in Wilkes-Barre.

The International Order of Odd Fellows founded White Haven Lodge #457 in 1857. in 1874, they constructed a three story brick meeting building the first brick building in the White Haven area. Lodge #457 has been in continuous existence since its inception. There will be a presentation about the Lodge, its building and a tour of the building.

The feature presentation is an examination of a chest dating from World War I that contains letters, photographs and memorabilia related to the family of Ed Dugan of Wilkes-Barre-circa 1918. During the First World War, Dugan was "Over There." He served in the Navy, and was stationed in France for six months as communications clerk. His letters and other family material were ensconced in what appears to be a military trunk.

The trunk, approximately two feet long by 1-1/2 feet wide and a foot high, half filled with materials, weighs about 30 pounds. Its construction is of a wooden box frame, lined on

the inside with fabric. On the outside, it is covered with dark green sheet metal, with metal latches, wodden bumpers, and leather belting to secure it. There are vestiges of metal travel stickers. The case was tagged: E. J. Dugan, 323 Bowman St. Wilkes-Barre, Penna.

"One Friday evening last July the chest was dropped off at my home by a Miss Kate O'Donnell," said Crosley. "It had been donated to sell at a church flea market in town."

Although the chest was ascribed to Dugan, with the contents suggesting his first name was "Ed", the chest may have begun with Ed's material and then supplemented with other family materials. There are references to what may be two brothers: Hugh and Patrick; There are also materials where the last name is spelled "Dugan."

There are even some letters from Suzanne from Coeur de Alsace Loraine in France, in which she refers to Ed as "her special friend."

The collection contains postcards, maps, and railroad timetables. There are photographs of French buildings, a biplane, and friends. There is a large photograph taken by a Wilmington studio-a portrait of about 30 Navel men with their dates at a formal gathering. "There was also a poem. "They talk about sunny France,' he wrote. 'Where the hell is the sun?'" said Crosley.

Although the materials may be more valuable if spearated, Crosley opted to keep the collection together and donate to its home city of Wilkes-Barre. "To break it up would be wrong," Crosley said.

"I was amazed to find that type of information just thrown in an old trunk and discarded," he noted. "I thought it was a shame and realized it was a time capsule."
