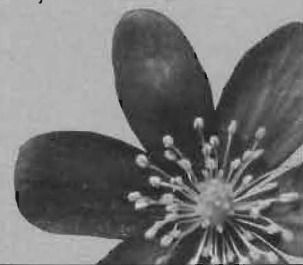

A discussion by the Board members resulted in the unanimous decision to continue offering the Award and to do so without any "rule" changes at the present time.

So, the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs Association of Western Pennsylvania will again be gladly offering \$2,000 music awards to a maximum of three (3) students who fulfill the specified requirements of the award. As a reminder regarding two of the requirements in particular: 1) The applicant or a family relative must be a member of the I.O.O.F. or Rebekahs of Western PA., and 2) The applicant must be a full-time Music Major having completed at least one year of college.

The Award, of course, is being made to not only defray some of the cost associated with higher education, but also to help increase public awareness of the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs and in turn, hopefully receiving petitions for membership to perpetuate our great Order.

As in the past, a copy of the "Rules" and an Award Application will be sent to all the lodges representing the Western District around mid-May. The Award Committee requests that all lodge secretaries and scribes relay this forthcoming information to their respective membership and that the public be made aware of the award by informing colleges, newspapers etc. in your area.

The deadline for submitting applications for the 2008 Music Awards is July 31, 2008.
