

The children started their evening with the traditional meeting in the dining hall complete with the introduction of each cabin. As each cabin is called there is a roar from staff and campers in support of their individual cabin. The atmosphere is electric with all the excitement for the coming week.

As always there is the traditional gigolo dance. It is always started by camp director Wade Balmer and continues throughout the individual campers. It is a very infectious dance that makes everyone want to get up and participate. As we watch we find our feet tapping and bodies starting to move with the campers. It's fun to watch the new campers learn it.

Then there is the reading of the camp rules. This camp has very strict rules concerning a dress code, respect for others, and lights out (bed time). They do have fun with pranks but they must be done in a way not to injure anyone or ruin any property.

We then were served a very delicious and healthy supper. It's amazing how organized meal time is with each camper separating their plates, silverware, and garbage into separate bins when done eating. Everyone helps clean up but there is a paid staff that does dishes and serves the meal.

After eating we were put into action with serving our annual ice cream sundaes. This is something we enjoy doing as the children and staff are very appreciative. They never fail to thank us for coming. We always leave with such a sense of wishing we could do more.

The children then leave to go to the med shed for their nightly medications. It's sad to think what these young people go through just to try to alleviate the pain from arthritis which some think is just a disease for old

people. Watching some of these children walk and just try to get their bodies to move is heartbreaking.

Camp JRA gives these campers the unique opportunity to be with others that face the same physical limitations. They can just be themselves and not have to explain why they take medications or give themselves injections. Also there is the emotional part of being with someone who understands what you are going through.

We think this camp is absolutely wonderful and worthy of the support the Oddfellows have given them over the years. Just think what some of these children would be missing out on if you didn't continue to support them. Keep up the good work.

FROM THE DESK OF THE DEPARTMENT COMMANDER

What About Columbus

Barney Wells was trying to plan events for the lodge. It was 1944 and the war had reduced the available entertainment options. At the entertainment committee meeting, Barney suggested a Columbus Day dinner for the lodge, with a skit to re-enact the famous landing in 1492. He suggested that the initiatory degree costumes could be modified for Columbus and his crew, but none of the costumes were appropriate for the Indians. Brother Joe Ryan was a committee member and also a member of the Improved Order of Red Men that met in the Odd Fellows Temple. He suggested the Odd Fellows and Red Men hold a joint Columbus Day dinner, with wives, and collaborate on the play.

Brother Ryan brought the matter up before his Tribe of Red Men and they agreed to the joint banquet. Because of the world war, most of the members were older and looked forward to the banquet and entertainment. The Red Men appointed a committee to work with Brother Wells to write the play. Since Barney was a high school English teacher, he was a natural to write the play. George Molinari was a member of both lodges and a high school history teacher, who took the lead in writing the skit as a representative of the Red Men. The two groups met three times and practiced their parts. Since the lodge regalia fit the Odd Fellows, they portrayed Columbus and his crew. The Red Men portrayed the Indians. The script called for a celebration like the one seen in textbooks written in the early twentieth century, with the Indians and the explorers treating each other in a civil manner.

The dinner was planned down to the last detail. October 12, 1944, fell on a Thursday so the banquet was scheduled for Friday, October 13, 1944. The lodges hired a caterer who served all courses at the table. After the tables were cleared, the Noble Grand of the Odd Fellows Lodge and the Chief of the Red Men Tribe both gave appropriate speeches. Those attending went up to the lodge room and settled in while the players robed in the anteroom. The cast of the explorers took the floor first.

Barney portrayed Columbus and Brother Molinari portrayed the Indian Chief.

Columbus walked back and forth on what was supposed to be the deck of a vessel. After a minute of pacing, one of the crew yelled, "Land ho."

Columbus pulled up a telescope and appeared to be looking at land. He assembled his crew and pointed in the direction of the past grand's station.

The Odd Fellows left the floor and the Red Men came out and assembled around the past grand's station. They were intensely looking in the where the Odd Fellows, dressed as explorers, were standing. They pointed and danced around without speaking any recognizable words.

The Odd Fellows came out, with Barney in the lead. He was holding a banner on a staff and wearing a variation of the chaplain's costume. He was trying for all the world to look like the painting of Columbus in the high school history book.

The Indians came forth to meet him, approaching cautiously.

Columbus (Barney) began, "Greetings from the King and Queen of Spain. I come to introduce you to the wonders of the modern age and bring you all the learning and knowledge of Europe."

The reply was supposed to be, "Welcome to our great land, flowing with milk and honey."

The Red Men had a little surprise planned for the Odd Fellows, and caught Barney and the other cast members off guard. The Chief replied, "Welcome indeed. You come to steal our land, charge us too much rent for lodge rooms and make us pay for half of your banquet. If you think we are as foolish as our ancestors, you have another thought coming. We left you come in 450 years ago and you ruined the neighborhood. We had a perfect society where we hunted and fished all day and didn't pay taxes. You wanted us to work in the fields you took from us, buy everything from you at inflated prices and let you run the show. We are going to drive you out."

The Indians then began pushing the Explorers back toward the anteroom and the audience began to howl with laughter. Barney had been bested and he didn't know what to say. When they got to anteroom, Brother George reminded Barney that he was a history teacher and knew too well how things worked. Things worked out well and the two lodges planned other joint events.

BROTHER DENNIS R. MILLER ANSWERS FINAL ROLL CALL

Brother Dennis R. (Denny) Miller went to be with his Creator on 11 July 2008.

Denny was initiated into Alma Lodge #523, Johnstown, PA, on 16 April 1955 and into the William F. Packer Encampment #127 on 12 May 1956. He served as Noble Grand and Chief Patriarch in 1958 and was once again serving as Chief Patriarch when he passed away.

Denny was a veteran of the U.S. Navy and a registered professional engineer, retiring from Bethlehem Steel Corp. after a career spanning 33 years. He also served as Public Works Director for the City of Johnstown. Denny was very active in the Bethany Presbyterian Church where he held many offices over many years, including chief cook for quite a few church dinners when he would prepare and serve his famous Swiss steak.

In the Lodge, Denny was a "go to" guy when matters requiring engineering expertise came up. Alma Lodge is a four-story commercial building with businesses occupying space on Main Street as well as on the second floor. Denny was frequently called upon for guidance regarding heating and air conditioning systems, plumbing upgrades, the elevator replacement and a myriad of other building maintenance problems associated with a building the size of Alma Lodge. Denny always gave of his time and engineering acumen to help the trustees make the proper decisions.

Odd Fellowship does not mean only conducting ourselves as good Odd Fellows during a Lodge meeting. It's a way of life taught during Lodge meetings but to be carried out by Odd Fellows in the every day course of our lives. Denny epitomized Odd Fellowship. He was, indeed, grateful to his Creator, faithful to his Country, and fraternal to his fellow man as he lived his life outside of his Lodge.

Denny's illness caused him a great deal of pain as it progressed. Sometimes he could hardly walk his legs hurt so badly. But, he came to Lodge and continued to act as our Chief Patriarch until it got so bad he was hospitalized. Even knowing the likely outcome of his illness, Denny almost always had a funny story to pass on to the Brothers and very few enjoyed a good joke more than he did.

I have noticed that there are certain deceased Odd Fellows whose names still come up at Lodge meetings even though they passed away more than 20 years ago. They are remembered for something they used to do; sometimes good things, sometimes not so good. Dennis R. Miller will be remembered in Alma Lodge for the good that he did for many, many years. I know the younger members will hear his name brought up in discussions for a long time. Perhaps something like, "I wish Denny Miller were hear to ask about that. He could tell us what to do right off." Denny, you won't be forgotten.

Denny was survived by his wife Janet, daughter Cheryl, grandson Tyler, as well as two brothers, in-laws, many nieces and nephews, and the current Brothers of Alma Lodge.

Well, they let me back in the good old US of A. Thank goodness! I had some doubts when the border patrol person asked John where we were born in Canada after we handed her our passports, but we made it home safe and sound.

Every journey, generally, has some excitement. While we were traveling through Indiana on I-90, on the way home, on a Sunday evening, approximately 5:30 p.m., the alternator in our car went out. A tow truck came approximately 1½ hours later, put our car on his flatbed, picked up another vehicle which he pulled and towed us to his garage.
