FROM THE DESK OF THE DEPARTMENT COMMANDER

Labor Day Labors

Barney Wells was trying to adjust to civilian life after service in the Great War. He was preparing to return to his job as a high school English teacher after Labor Day. It was 1919 and electricity was coming through the back streets and rural areas. Barney's lodge was going electric and the members decided they would go to the lodge hall on Labor Day and do some cleaning so that they could have an electrician wire the building.

The building was old and had been used as a lodge hall since the 1840's. The oldest member was George Armor, who had joined in 1861. Barney's father, Thomas Wells, joined in 1880 and was still able to attend meetings. A group of the men gathered at the lodge hall, including the Wells's, to discuss the clean before starting to work. Tom made a pot of coffee in the gas stove and looked at the old gas lights. He remembered many degree conferrals by the flickering gas lights and wondered if the degrees would be the same under electric lights.

As seven members sat around the table in the first floor social hall, drinking coffee and planning the work, Joe Ryan came up

with a disturbing fact.

"You know," Joe said, "the lodge doesn't have very much money. We need to think of a way to pay for the electrification or we are going to have to assess the members. We only hired the electrician to do the entrance, the porch and the anteroom. I don't know if we can run part of the building gas and part electric without causing a real problem."

Tom Wells agreed, "It just doesn't seem safe to have a bunch of sparks where you might suffer a gas leak."

"Well," said Barney, "we will just have to assess the members. I know it isn't popular but we are the largest and most successful fraternal organization in the world. We can't let our lodge fall behind lesser organizations."

"Where do you think we should start?" asked brother Clancey.

Barney thought for a moment and said, "We should go to the little room above the anteroom where we have all the junk stored. If we are going to illuminate the anteroom, wiring will have to go through there."

The members lit a lantern, grabbed some rags and went up to the storage room. Everything was covered with dust and hadn't seen light for years. The original scene was there. It hadn't been used for over ten years because the sides of the coffin were pulling away. A paper mache scene had been purchased. It was in a lighter weight coffin and was dressed in a tuxedo. This made it much easier to use than the original that had been exhumed from an Indian burial mound prior to the Civil War.

When they dusted off the coffin and opened it, there was dust everywhere. Tom Wells remarked, "I remember using this

scene when I was initiated."

Barney was trying to secure the lining of the coffin so that it could be moved without the skeleton catching the lining when he noticed that there was an Indian head penny in the coffin. "I wonder where that came from?" he mused.

Tom replied quickly, "We used to have a custom of asking each new member who was initiated to put a penny on the dead man's eyes, donating two cents to the lodge. It doesn't seem like much now but it was something in 1880 and I imagine it was even more when the lodge opened in 1842."

Barney noticed that the penny was dated 1868 and thought it might be worth something to a collector, since it looked almost new. "I bet some of those old pennies would be worth something today." Barney said.

Tom replied, "I imagine they would. Some of the wealthier members put larger coins in the coffin. When I was initiated the vice president of the railroad joined the same night and he put two \$2.50 gold pieces in the coffin."

Joe looked at the penny and said, "Well maybe we can offer it for sale or have brother Rosen sell it for us, he has a jewelry store and sells coins on the side."

"A good thought" said Barney, "now help me move this box under the coffin."

The box wouldn't budge. Barney wiped off the dust and noticed that the box had the lid nailed down and the painting under the dust read "Pennies for a dead man's eyes."

Barney and Joe got a bar and opened the box. In it were bags. Barney opened the first bag and it was full of coins, pennies both large and small, nickels, dimes, quarters, halves, silver dollars and a few gold pieces. Joe opened the second bag and it was full of the same. Brother Clancey looked at the bags in the box and exclaimed, "I guess we are going to have enough money to electrify the whole lodge hall."

Barney responded, "I think we can get an electric ice box too."

"Well," said Tom, "when Odd Fellows work together, there is no telling what they'll be able to do."

"It looks like our labors were met with great success this labor day." said Joe.

The lodge met the following day and counted the money. They decided to have some of the older pieces, especially the large pennies, half dimes and older gold pieces sold by the brother that was a jeweler. There was enough money cleared to pay for the electrician, buy an electric refrigerator and pay a janitor to do a thorough cleaning of the lodge hall.


SANDY LAKE LODGE #573

You Can't Beat the Odds

Lititz Oddfellows edge St. Leo's to capture New Era midget title

For five innings, the Lititz Oddfellows were knocking at the door.

They sprayed baseballs all over the yard, racking up eight hits — but no runs. Only one runner reached third base, and just two made it to second.

Meanwhile, their New Era Tournament midget title game opponent, St. Leo's, clung tenaciously to its one-run lead.

With their chances windind down, the Oddfellows finally broke through in the bottom of the sixth, scoring twice to take a 2-1 lead. They held on from there to capture their second midget crown in three years.

It was the seventh straight victory of the summer for Lititz (14-5), which defeated Manheim VFW to capture the New Era title in 2006.

St Leo's (12-6) lost in the New Era final for the second straight year.

"We didn't come here for No.2," allowed a disappointed Lions' coach Mike Regan. "But, that's what we came away with this time."

"This is a very...very special win," said Oddfellows coach Frank Camera, whose 2006 NET titlists formed the nucleus of Warwick's 2008 District 3 championship team and are, as we speak, playing deep into the American Legion playoffs.

"The first one was special (to me) because I finally got over the (losing in the NET semi-finals) hump," Camera shared.

"But this time...seeing them be able to celebrate is, to me, more special than anything."

Winning pitcher Jordan Donmoyer set the table for the celebration, holding St. Leo to four hits, walking four and striking out four.

Then he was in the thick of the sixth-inning rally, driving in the tying run and scoring the game-winner to cap a 3-for-3 night at the plate.

"Jordan goes to another level at the plate when he's pitching," said Camera.

That certainly was true in the New Era Tourney, where Donmoyer was 6-for-6 with two RBIs and a run scored in his two starts and 0-for-3 on his night off.

But St. Leo starter Kevin Regan had parried Lititz's attack all evening, with a little help from the Oddfellows.

Lititz had two hits in the second, third and fifth innings, and two baserunners in the fourth on a hit and run error.

But Justin Nolt, courtesy running for DOnmoyer, was thrown out trying to steal second in the third inning.

Then Regan picked off Donmoyer in the fourth and Nate Lawrence for the last out of the fifth.

That stung all the more as Dylan Adams, who had singled, had just tasted the rarefied atmosphere of third base on a Regan wild pitch.

Undaunted, the Oddfellows returned to the task in the sixth as Kyle Keener reached on a one-out single.

Adam Zipko sacrificed him to second and Donmoyer ripped the first pitch he saw into centerfield.

Travis Jankowski fielded the ball cleanly and launched a strike to home. Keener, just, beat the throw and Donmoyer moved up to second.

That finished Regan's evening as he yielded to reliever Dan Long.

As Long took his warmup throws, Camera called designated hitter Andy Woolley, his next scheduled batter, over for a conference.

"I told him, 'You could be a hero tonight and no one can ever take that away."

Thus fortified, Woolley looped a ball behind third base, where it nestled, safely, in the outfield.

"I'm just glad it fell," Woolley said. "I was just going up there trying to make contact, not necessarily trying to kill it."

Well, mission accomplished!

"We've been doing it all season," he said. "I mean, something's working."

Donmoyer, running all the way, scored easily. "We knew that we could get runs across," he said. "We just had to find it."

But the game might have gone St. Leo's way if the Lions had just capitalized on their own opportunities.

Playing small ball, moving the runner, the Lions (12-6) advanced four runners to third, but could only cash once.

A double play and strikeout left Dan Long standing at third in the end of the second inning.

Then, in the third, Steve Remley's sac fly scored Erik Schnitzenbaumer, who had one-hopped a leadoff double off base of the fence in the right center and moved up on a bunt.

Up 1-0, St. Leo missed a golden opportunity to double that advantage in the fourth inning when Kevin Cotchen didn't break from third on Jamie Pashuck's one-out dribbler.

He was left there as Gene Nissley struck out and was also stranded at third in the sixth as Donmoyer struck out Pashuck.

"I just had to keep my focus," said Donmoyer, "just know that... we can get outs."

"Four hits," Mike Regan reflected. "That's usually not going to be enough and we came up just a little short.

"(Lititz is) a good hitting team," he continued, "and they put enough together to get two runs, just enough to make the difference."
